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
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There is good reason why Quebec is known as "La Belle Province", especially during Fall Colour Season!

While the splendour of its cities, towns and countryside have enticed artists like the Group of Seven, its history, delicious cuisine and that French "joie de vivre" unique in North America have seduced visitors to return again and again.

Our journey begins and ends with stays in the vibrant city of Montreal with its delightful mixture of old and new. Montreal has great shopping, cafes, museums and beautifully restored buildings, especially in the Old Montreal quarter and its historic waterfront.

After Montreal we explore the nearby Eastern Township region, a veritable country paradise with mountains and valleys that are home to the most picturesque villages and rural landscapes. We will enjoy quality wines and delicious food produced proudly in this region.

We then enjoy a 2-night stay in Quebec City, one of Canada's outstanding cities and a designated UNESCO World Heritage site with over 400 years of history. Fall under the charm of the walled city's cobbled streets lined

with art galleries, artisan shops, bistros and horse drawn carriages. Stroll on the Governor's Promenade which offers spectacular views of the St. Lawrence Seaway and Orleans Island - known as the garden of Quebec with its typical New France architecture, rural tradition and gorgeous scenery over the Montmorency Falls and Quebec skyline.

Next we travel through the picturesque Charlevoix region. A highlight of the tour will be our scenic train journey along the Beaupré hills and the St. Lawrence River coastline, where we will see historic hamlets and the shores where hundreds of migrating birds come to rest and feed. We will visit the pretty village of Baie St-Paul, where a thriving artist community exhibits a colourful and dazzling version of the surrounding landscape. We will stay in Tadoussac, a lovely village on the banks of the St. Lawrence River and first trading post in Canada, now renowned worldwide as a prime holiday resort. Visitors come from around the world to watch the flow of the whales and the tides in this pristine environment — an unforgettable experience!

Day 1: Departure / Montreal. We depart for Montreal. Upon arrival we check-in at our centrally located hotel. Later, we enjoy our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Montreal / Magog. We begin the day with a sightseeing tour of Montreal's highlights; Mount Royal, lively Sainte-Catherine Street, Notre-Dame Cathedrale and quaint Old Montreal. This afternoon we depart for the Eastern Townships with a scenic diversion on Quebec's wine route. Here we will enjoy a visit and tasting at a renowned winery. We continue on to our resort hotel nestled by a scenic lake.

Day 3: Magog. Our first visit is to St. Benoit Abbey, where we learn about the lives of the more than fifty cloistered monks living under the Rule of St. Benedict. We then visit the town of Stansted, home to some magnificent 19thcentury buildings (and so it is considered one of Quebec's most beautiful villages). The town straddles the friendliest border in the world including the famous CANUSA Street, with the border actually running down the middle of the road. We will visit the Colby-Curtis Museum - a heritage house built in the 19th century. After today's touring we will enjoy some free time in the charming town of Magog with its numerous shops, cafés and pleasant lakeside promenade.

Day 4: Quebec City. We depart for Quebec's capital -Quebec City, for a 2-night stay. Upon arrival in the city we will embark on a guided tour of the most famous sights including Place Royal, Little Champlain Quarter, the Plains of Abraham and the port where so many immigrants first set foot on this new land after their long crossing over the Atlantic.

Day 5: Quebec City. This morning we will drive through picturesque Orleans Island. These country roads are full of history, old architecture and pastoral landscapes – truly a regional jewel! We will visit an historic home and the Bilodeau Orchard where cider making is an art form passed on through generations. The afternoon is at leisure to explore Old Quebec's enchanting streets, boutiques and museums - all within walking distance of our hotel.

Day 6: Quebec City / Tadoussac. A short drive takes us first to Montmorency Falls - a magnificent cascade 100 feet higher than Niagara! Then, for what may be the highlight of the tour, we board a train journey that will take us along the St. Lawrence River and through the beautiful Charlevoix region. En route we will stop in Baie-Saint-Paul - a charming little town of artisans nestled in a valley. Here we will have some free time to visit the many art galleries in town and enjoy lunch at one of the quaint bistros. We continue by coach on our scenic route to our final destination, Tadoussac at the mouth of the Saguenay Fjord.

Day 7: Tadoussac. Today we enjoy another tour highlight a whale watching cruise on the magnificent St. Lawrence River, which is renowned for its large concentration of resident belugas and rorqual whales. The afternoon will be at leisure to take in the beauty of the site, take a stroll on the beach or one of the picturesque walking trails by our hotel, or to perhaps visit the Marine Mammal Interpretation Center.

Day 8: Montreal. We depart for Montreal. En route we will drive on the first road built in New France, "Le chemin du Roi", where we can see some of the area's finest and oldest homes. We then stop for lunch at an authentic and lively Quebecois sugar shack, where we will enjoy some traditional "reel" and "rigidons" music, as well as a taste of maple taffy on snow! This evening we will have the opportunity to try our luck at The Montreal Casino, brimming with the vitality so characteristic of one of North America's most exciting cities.

Day 9: Montreal. This morning we visit Montreal's Botanical Gardens, ranked as one of the world's largest and most spectacular garden with its collection of 22,000 plant species, 10 exhibition greenhouses and some thirty thematic gardens. The afternoon is free to visit one of the city many unique museums, do some fine shopping or simply enjoy the view from one of the city's many terraces. Tonight enjoy our Farewell Dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 10. Home. We proceed home bringing with us fine memories of "La Belle Province".



Charlevoix, Saguenay and Lac-Saint-Jean

New France was one of the first places settled in Canada, and the European influence combined with indigenous traditions helped create a unique identity. The regions we visit on this tour are not only home to some beautiful landscapes, quaint villages and majestic fjords, but also offer that contagious French-Canadian *joie-de-vivre*!

We begin (and end) our tour in the vibrant city of Montreal with its delightful mix of the old and new.

Then we'll enjoy a 2-night stay in Quebec City - one of North America's oldest cities and a designated UNESCO World Heritage City. The city has a distinctive European flair, with its spectacular stone buildings and winding streets. We will take the picturesque Route of New France to Côte-De-Beaupré, visiting local artisans and prominent Quebecois heritage sites.

Our first stop in the Charlevoix region is the cultural hub of Baie-Sainte-Paul, and from there we'll ferry over to the

Isle-Aux-Coudres in the middle of the Saint-Lawrence, with its spectacular views in every direction. The island is renowned for its signature delicacies, breathtaking coastlines and the legendary hospitality of the locals.

We then proceed to the 230-kilometer-long Saguenay Fjord with its rugged mountains, dense forests and high cliffs dotted with tiny villages. Our scenic drive along this magnificent fjord is a highlight of our tour.

Next is spectacular Lac-Saint-Jean, surrounded by dairy farms, quaint villages and dramatic wildlife. We will visit attractions here such as a wildlife conservation zoo, a ghost town and some important First Nations sites.

We end with a stay at a breathtaking mountain resort in the Mauricie region, before heading back to Montreal for our final farewell to La Belle Province. Day 1: Depart / Montreal. We depart by coach for Montreal. Upon arrival we check-in to our centrally located hotel, and enjoy our Welcome Dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 2: Quebec City. We make our way to Quebec City, and upon arrival we will enjoy a guided city tour. Stops include the Place Royale, the Little Champlain Quarter, the Plains of Abraham, and the Old Port where so many immigrants first set foot on this new land after their long journey.

Day 3: Côte-De-Beaupré / Quebec City. Today we take the New France Route from Quebec City to Côte-De-Beaupré one of the most historic roads in North America. This scenic route takes us back through four centuries of history, with magnificent 18th and 19th century homes, as well as several significant historical and cultural gems, such as the magnificent St-Anne-De-Beaupré sanctuary. We will visit a museum of traditional wood sculpture. followed by a visit to the breathtaking Montmorency falls a magnificent cascade 100 feet higher than Niagara! The afternoon is at leisure to explore old Quebec's enchanting streets, boutiques, and museums.

Day 4: Baie-Saint-Paul / L'Isle-aux-Coudres. We proceed to the beautiful Charlevoix Region and its "Flavour Trail". Our first stop will be Baie-Saint-Paul - a charming artisanal town, for some free time to visit the many art galleries and enjoy lunch at one of the quaint bistros. Then we will ferry over to the L'Isle-aux-Coudres - a small island in the middle of the St-Lawrence river, renowned for its 360 degree views of magnificent landscapes. breathtaking sunsets and beautiful shingle beaches! We will have a guided tour of a local flour mill on the island.

Day 5: L'Isle-aux-Coudres. On our scenic drive around the island we will make breathtaking photo stops and enjoy some of the local artisanal fare, such as the cider at Pedneault Orchard, where cider making is an art form passed on through generations. The rest of the day is free.

Day 6: Malbaie. We continue along the beautiful Charlevoix region's "Flavour Trail." We will stop at an artisanal cheese factory, and then proceed to Emu Charlevoix - an Economuseum that houses over 400 emus and is known worldwide for its emu oil. Here we will enjoy a guided visit and a wonderful lunch, highlighting some

of the regions finest artisanal fare! Our next stop is Hautes-Gorges-De-La-Riviere-Malbaie National Park — the centerpiece of the UNESCO Charlevoix reserve, where we will walk along the colorful "Maple Trail" that follows the Malbaie River. Our overnight will be in Malbaie.

Day 7: Saguenay Fiord National Park / Chicoutimi. We travel along the magnificent fjord route, which offers the most breathtaking views of the Saguenay Fjord. We'll stop for lunch in the village of L'Anse-Saint Jean - known as one of Quebec's most beautiful villages, and then proceed to the Fjord Museum to learn about Saguenay's history and the fjord. We overnight in Chicoutimi.

Day 8: Chicoutimi / Val Jalbert / St-Félicien. Our first stop is Chicoutimi's famous "Little White House" - an early 19th century home that withstood massive floods while everything around it perished. We then proceed to Val-Jalbert in Lac-Saint-Jean - a historically preserved town from the 1920s. This heritage town was known for its pulp mill, and it was a pioneer town of electricity in Canada due to the nearby massive Ouaitchouan Falls!

Day 9: St-Félicien. We begin with a visit to the Wildlife Zoo of St-Félicien - dedicated to wildlife conservation of the Boreal Climate. Later we proceed to the Mashteuiatsh Museum, to learn about the First Nations communities who originally arrived over 6000 years ago!

Day 10: La Mauricie. We make our way to la Mauricie Region for an overnight stay at a spectacular mountain resort. En route, we will stop in La Tuque to see the waterfalls "De-La-Petite-Riviere-Bostonnais" - a hidden gem in the region! The afternoon is free at the resort to enjoy the many activities offered such as canoeing, hiking or relaxing in the spa!

Day 11: Montreal. We proceed to Montreal, and in the afternoon we will have a guided tour of the city's highlights: Mount Royal, lively Sainte-Catherine Street. Notre-Dame Cathedral and quaint Old Montreal. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 12: Home. We travel home, bringing with us fine memories of "La Belle Province".

With spectacular coastlines, picturesque villages and distinguished culture, the Maritimes are sure to delight every visitor.

We begin this tour In Nova Scotia, where we visit the famous lighthouse at Peggy's Cove, the Fisheries Museum in Lunenburg and the historic Fortress of Louisburg. During our stay in the capital of Halifax we will be entertained at the Grafton Street Dinner Theatre, see the Exhibition Hall at Pier 21 and have a chance to sample the local beer during our tour of Alexander Keith's Brewery!

In St. John, New Brunswick we explore the historic Loyalist Trail, the remarkable Reversing Falls and the scenic Fundy Trail on the Bay of Fundy (which boasts some of the highest tides in the world).

Prince Edward Island, Canada's smallest province and home of Anne of Green Gables, is renowned for its red soil, sand dunes and 800 km. of spotless white sand beaches. During our visit to Charlottetown, our Confederation Capital, we learn the important role this province played in the early history of Canada. We will also enjoy a performance of "Anne of Green Gables" at the Confederation Theatre.

No trip to the Maritimes would be complete without a tour around the awe-inspiring Cabot Trail in scenic Cape Breton. The trail loops around the northern tip of Cape Breton Island, passing through charming communities offering breathtaking scenery.

As well as being one of the most beautiful and historic areas in North America, the spirit of hospitality found in the Maritimes is legendary. Come join us as we embark on an adventure that promises unforgettable experiences and memories to treasure.

Day 1: Halifax We fly to Halifax and transfer to our downtown hotel. The balance of the day is at your leisure.

Day 2: Halifax. On our city tour of Halifax our kilted guide will tell tales of the past, present and future of Nova Scotia's capital. We will walk through the Victorian Public Gardens and stop at the top of Citadel Hill to view the Harbour and downtown area, Afternoon at leisure, Our unique dinner this evening at the Grafton Street Theatre features a musical comedy!

Day 3: Peggy's Cove / Lunenberg / Annapolis Valley. Our first stop is at one of the most picturesque locations in the Maritimes, Peggy's Cove. This quaint, rustic cove is famous for its neat houses, barren rocks, weathered wharves and a lighthouse point that offers a sweeping view of the ocean. Then we proceed to Lunenburg, home of the Bluenose, where we visit the Fisheries Museum with its fine collection of Maritime artifacts. We continue on to the Annapolis Valley.

Day 4: Annapolis Valley / Saint John. We travel along the historic Evangeline Trail and first stop at the Grand-Pré National Historic Site, made famous by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's poem, *Evangeline*. We then board the Fundy Rose ferry for a delightful cruise across the Bay of Fundy to the Loyalist City of Saint John.

Day 5: St. Andrew / Saint John. This morning's tour of Saint John includes the famous Loyalist Trail and the Reversing Falls, where the ocean waters rushing upstream form a whirling, foaming torrent. We spend the afternoon in the picturesque town of St. Andrew where you will have free time for lunch and shopping, then return to Saint John for our overnight.

Day 6: Hopewell Rocks / Moncton. Today we visit the impressive Hopewell Rocks. Take a moment to appreciate the intricacies of nature and explore the quiet coves with flowerpot-shaped rock formations bearing such names as "Mother-in-Law", "ET" and "Lover's Arch". We continue to Moncton for our overnight.

Day 7: Prince Edward Island. After a stop at Shediac. known as the "Lobster Capital of the World", we drive across the Confederation Bridge to P.E.I. and our hotel in Charlottetown. The rest of the afternoon is free. This evening we enjoy a musical performance of "Anne of Green Gables" at the Confederation Theatre.

Day 8: Prince Edward Island. Our guided tour of P.E.I. begins in Charlottetown and the historic Confederation Centre, where the Fathers of Confederation met during the Charlottetown Conference. Then we travel through the bright green rolling countryside and visit the home of Anne of Green Gables at Cavendish, and the famous wharf in North Rustico. Tonight we will enjoy a lobster dinner at a local restaurant (alternatives available).

Day 9: Baddeck / Sydney. We return to Nova Scotia by ferry and proceed to Baddeck, located in the heart of Cape Breton's most picturesque area. We visit the Bell Museum, where the famous inventor perfected his many inventions, and then proceed to Sydney for our overnight.


Day 10: Cabot Trail / Sydney. A full day tour of the scenic Cabot Trail. Nature lovers and photographers will have a field day with the meandering glens, rugged coastlines and the constantly pounding surf.

Day 11: Louisbourg / Sydney. We proceed to the impressive Fortress of Louisbourg for a guided visit. This National Historic Site was the largest historic reconstruction in Canada. After our visit we will enjoy an evening banquet during which we will be entertained by 18th century style musicians who will share stories and songs about love and life in the 1700's.

Day 12: Halifax. We return to Halifax.

Day 13: Halifax. This morning we visit Pier 21 - an exhibit recreating the immigration experience. Innovative displays, evocative soundscapes and interactive technology are used. We then enjoy an informative tour of Alexander Keith's Brewery - the oldest working brewery in North America. After we learn about the beer, the brewery and life in Halifax in 1863, we visit Stag's Head Tavern to listen to toe tapping music, and of course sample Keith's finest ale. The afternoon will be at leisure to explore on your own in Halifax - an excellent city for strolling. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 14: Home. We fly home with Air Canada.

The romance of travelling through the Rocky Mountains by train has always had immense appeal. For some, it is the only way to see what is considered one of the world's most spectacular regions.

The Rocky Mountaineer is considered one of the world's most spectacular rail experiences. As we enjoy the ultra-modern comforts of our train, we will be following the steps of the early explorers as the rails meander over trestle bridges, along rivers and past waterfalls - all the while in the shadows of the magnificent glacier-clad mountains. While onboard, our attendant will entertain us with interesting commentary, serve our meals and ensure our utmost comfort.

We board the Rocky Mountaineer in Vancouver. On the first day we journey through the Fraser Valley and the towering Coastal Mountains. After an overnight stay in Kamloops, we reboard the train en route to Jasper. The train follows the Thompson River to the Monashee Mountains, passing expansive glaciers until we arrive in Jasper in the evening.

Both services include complimentary wine, beer, spirits and non-alcoholic drinks throughout the rail trip. Note - Gold Leaf passengers will be separated from the main group during the journey.

Also included on this tour are three nights in Canada's most beautiful city, Vancouver and three nights in Jasper National Park, with extensive touring and adventures throughout. Day 1: Vancouver. We fly to Vancouver and transfer to our First Class hotel located in the heart of downtown. The rest of the day is at leisure until our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Vancouver. Our city tour includes Stanley Park, Gastown, Chinatown and much more. The evening is at leisure to explore Vancouver - annually voted one of the world's favourite cities.

Day 3: Whistler / Vancouver. A spectacular drive on the "Sea to Sky Highway" takes us to beautiful Shannon Falls (for a photo stop) and then to Whistler. This quaint alpine village is North America's most popular mountain resort. There will be free time to enjoy the fresh mountain air while strolling in the village with its quaint shops. We'll visit the award-winning Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre, which showcases the art and history of the First Nations People of this area.

Day 4: Rocky Mountaineer / Kamloops. Today we begin our journey aboard "The Most Spectacular Train Trip in the World". Breakfast and lunch are served onboard. On today's full-day rail tour we will pass through the fertile Fraser Valley and enjoy the natural beauty of the scenic Fraser Canyon. One of the canyon's highlights is Hell's Gate, where millions of gallons of water per minute rush through the narrowest point of the canyon. Then, following the Thompson River we cross into Canada's arid interior, arrive in the city of Kamloops and transfer to our hotel for our overnight.

Day 5: Rocky Mountaineer / Jasper. "All Aboard" as the Rocky Mountaineer departs and follows the Yellowhead Route to the quaint town of Jasper, Breakfast and lunch are again served onboard. The train follows the Thompson River along the rolling plateaus into the snowy peaks of the Monashee and Cariboo Mountains. View Pyramid Falls and the expansive glaciers of the Albreda Icefields. As we enter the Rocky Mountain range we pass by Mt. Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies. In the early evening we arrive in Jasper, transfer to our hotel and meet for our included dinner.

Day 6: Jasper. Our full day of wonderful Rocky Mountain experiences begins with an Interpretive Nature Walk conducted by an accredited local expert. Then our coach will take us along a beautiful stretch of highway teeming with wildlife to one of the most beautiful lakes in the Rockies (if not the world!) - Maligne Lake. Here we will enjoy one of the highlights of the tour - a narrated cruise on the lake's crystal blue waters, surrounded by summits of 10,000 ft. and higher! This area is called the "Hall of the Gods", and for good reason! The cruise features a fantastic view of Spirit Island - one of the most photographed sites in the Canadian Rockies.

Day 7: Jasper. To begin the day we will be gently transported into Jasper's alpine tundra on the Jasper Tramway - the longest and highest guided aerial tramway in Canada. Enjoy the spectacular views of six mountain ranges, glacial fed lakes, the Athabasca River and the scenic mountain town of Jasper. After some free time for lunch we'll enjoy a guided walking tour of the town during which we'll hear stories about the people, places and events that made Jasper what it is today. For the highlight of the day we'll embark on a leisurely raft trip down the Athabasca River, a route used by the fur traders. Here we will experience Jasper from a unique perspective as our guide will point out the natural and historic points of interest, as we take in the spectacular Rocky Mountain views on either side of us.

Day 8: Edmonton. We transfer to Edmonton, where we will have an afternoon at leisure and our Farewell Dinner.

Day 9: Home. Air Canada takes us home.

which resembles a transplanted piece of England. For the stout-hearted we have included some wonderful adventures ... the Columbia Icefields, the Gondola Lift at Sulphur Mountain, Hell's Gate Airtram and spectacular excursions on Maligne Lake and Banff's Bow River.

So join us in western Canada this year for a truly unforgettable experience.

Day 1: Departure / Calgary / Banff. We depart for Calgary. Upon arrival we enjoy the scenic transfer into the Rocky Mountains and our Banff hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Banff. This morning we take a gondola ride up Sulphur Mountain for breathtaking views of the town and Rocky Mountains. This afternoon we will enjoy a leisurely float trip along the Bow River enjoying the awesome views of the snow-capped Rockies all along the way.

Day 3: Lake Louise / Columbia Icefields / Jasper. We begin the day with a visit of Lake Louise. With its emerald waters set against the backdrop of Victoria Glacier, Lake Louise is probably the most photographed scene in the Canadian Rockies. We then proceed along one of North America's most spectacular highways - the Icefields Parkway, where wildlife sightings are common. Of course we will stop for photos at Peyto Lake. The highlight of the day will be our ride aboard a unique "Snocoach" up the Athabasca Glacier to the Columbia Icefield - the world's largest accumulation of ice south of the Arctic Circle. After our ride we continue on to see Athabasca Falls before arriving in Jasper.

Day 4: Maligne Canyon / Jasper. This morning we visit one of the most spectacular gorges in the Canadian Rockies - Maligne Canyon, where sheer limestone walls plunge to depths of 165 feet. We also visit Maligne Lake, the second largest glacial lake in the world. Our lake cruise offers us breathtaking views of the surrounding peaks, and also Spirit Island.

Day 5: Wells Gray Provincial Park / Kamloops. We enter British Columbia and are greeted with views in the distance of Mt. Robson - the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies, as well as Mt. Terry Fox. Today's highlight will be Wells Gray Provincial Park, with its towering mountains, deep canyons, volcanic cones, ancient old-growth forests, raging white-water rivers, and many beautiful waterfalls. After our visit we proceed to Kamloops.

Day 6: Cache Creek / Fraser Canyon / Vancouver. Our first stop is the Hat Creek Ranch heritage site where we venture back in time to the 1860s for a glimpse into the history of this region. We then proceed to the scenic Fraser Canyon for a ride across the Fraser River on Hell's Gate Airtram, which offers a bird's eye-view of the point where the Fraser River squeezes through Hell's Gate - a narrow gorge where over 200 million gallons of water per minute flow through - twice the volume of Niagara Falls! We end our day in Vancouver.

Day 7: Vancouver. Our morning city tour includes Stanley Park, Gastown, Chinatown and much more. The afternoon is at leisure to explore this beautiful city on your own.

Day 8: Victoria. We take the scenic ferry ride to Victoria and upon arrival immediately proceed to the worldrenowned Butchart Gardens, where we can explore the 50-acre display of magnificent floral colour. We then proceed to downtown Victoria where we will see the Inner Harbour, the Empress Hotel, Legislative Buildings and Beacon Hill Park.

Day 9: Victoria. This morning we will enjoy a walking tour of Victoria's Inner Harbour with an entertaining local guide. The afternoon is at leisure to explore this quaint city on your own. With its turn-of-the-century buildings and tweed shops, you might think Victoria is a transplanted corner of Britain! Tonight we enjoy our Farewell Dinner.

Day 10: Home. We transfer to the airport for our Air Canada flight home.



Ranked as one of the world's best islands to visit by most travel publications, the natural beauty of Vancouver Island must be seen to be believed!

From Victoria - BC's historic capital, to the rugged wilderness around Tofino on the west coast, "The Island" as it's known locally has one of the world's most diverse ecosystems: rainforests, marshes, meadows, beaches, mountains, oceans, rivers and lakes. This diversity provides habitats for a huge variety of wildlife species, and so visitors to the island are assured of a wide range of opportunities to experience spectacular natural beauty and wildlife viewing. The beauty and tranquility of the island has also long been a draw for artists and artisans - there are countless art galleries, studios and shops selling unique, locally produced arts and crafts throughout the island.

A highlight of this tour will be our Grizzly Bear Expedition (with *Discovery Marine Safaris*) in a region known as the "Great Bear Rainforest". Viewing these amazing animals up close in their natural habitat is an experience that you will never forget. There will be an additional cruise along the west coast of the island to view black bears and other

wildlife like heron, eagles, harbour seas and porpoises in their natural habitat.

This region is one of the world's premier locations for whale watching, as we will discover on our marine wildlife viewing adventure. There will be many other opportunities to enjoy a wide variety of wildlife viewing.

Vancouver Island is also home to many resilient First Nations communities. We will learn about the natural and cultural traditions that have been passed down through the generations.

A Naturalist will travel with us throughout the tour, and local guides will join us as well in order to provide more detailed insight.

Day 1: Victoria. We fly to Victoria, and upon arrival transfer to our hotel. There will be an afternoon Program Orientation discussion, before our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Marine Wildlife Cruise / Victoria. This morning we enjoy an informative talk about the wildlife and ecosystems found along BC's southern coast, before embarking on a nature walk to Beacon Hill Park with a naturalist guide. After our included lunch we board a vessel for an exciting marine wildlife viewing adventure along the southern coast of Vancouver Island and the Strait of Juan de Fuca. Keep your eyes peeled for possible sightings of seals, sea lions, eagles and other marine birds, porpoises and even orcas!

Day 3: Chemainus / Courtenay. We begin the day with a scenic drive up the coast to the quaint fishing village of Cowichan Bay, where we learn about the lifecycle of salmon and marine habitat preservation. We then stop in the charming town of Chemainus, once home to the largest enclosed sawmill in North America. The town is now known for its beautiful murals, which you may explore during our free time. We continue to Courtenay for a 3-night stay. Dinner this evening is at a local restaurant.

Day 4: Deep Bay / Courtenay. We visit the Deep Bay Marine Field Station where we learn more about marine biology and ecosystems. After an included lunch we'll proceed to the Courtenay Museum for a talk and visit.

Day 5: Grizzly Bear Expedition / Courtenay. Today we set off in a comfortable marine vessel to see Grizzly Bears along the Orford River – home to one of BC's largest concentration of Grizzlies. Our journey will take us through the exciting Seymour Narrows and the Hole in the Wall, past many scenic islands, with icefield capped mountains in the background. Wildlife viewings en route could include Orca, dolphins, seals, sea lions, bald eagles, otter and mink. Once we reach the Orford River we are welcomed by our hosts, the Homalco First Nations, for whom these are historical lands. They will shuttle us by minibus to a series of viewing areas strategically placed throughout the salmon spawning grounds, where the Grizzlies are fishing and feeding. The bears can come within 10 feet of our platforms, providing once-in-alifetime photo opportunities.

Day 6: Tofino. We continue to Errington and visit the North Island Wildlife Recovery Centre. This non-profit, volunteer facility provides care and medical attention to injured wildlife from all over Vancouver Island. After our visit we proceed to Coombs – a farmers market where goats live on the roof of the moss covered store. Then it's on to the fabled town of Tofino on the wild west coast of the island. With its ancient rainforest, vast stretches of white sand and massive waves pounding in from the Pacific Ocean, Tofino boasts one of Canada's most breathtaking locations.

Day 7: Wild Pacific Trail / Tofino. We travel to Ucluelet to join a local naturalist who will lead us on a walk along the Wild Pacific Trail, where we'll learn about the region's unique flora and fauna. Whales are often spotted from this location as well. Later we'll stop at the Kwisitis Visitor Centre, which focuses on the natural and cultural heritage of Pacific Rim National Park Reserve.

Day 8: West Coast Black Bears / Nanaimo. Abundant to the West Coast of Vancouver Island, the Black Bear makes its presence known when the tides are low. They roam the shores in search of their favourite delicacy, the Rock Crab. Cruising through these scenic passageways allows for many opportunities to view other wildlife like herons, eagles, harbour seals and porpoises in their natural habitat. All the while the crew will entertain you with interesting facts about wildlife and the surrounding area. After our cruise we'll enjoy free time in Tofino before continuing to Cathedral Grove – an old growth forest of Douglas Fir, Western Red Cedar, Western Hemlock, Broadleaf Maple and Balsam Fir. Some trees are estimated to be 800 years old. We then travel to the east coast of Vancouver Island and the city of Nanaimo for our overnight stay.

Day 9: Victoria. We head south and stop in Duncan, famous for its Totems. Then we arrive back in Victoria, and enjoy a city tour before checking into our hotel. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 10: Home. We fly home from Victoria.

Day 1: Departure / San Francisco. We depart for San Francisco. Upon arrival we transfer to our hotel in the heart of the city, with time at leisure before our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: San Francisco. We tour America's Favourite City, starting with a casual walking tour of Chinatown. Then we see Ghirardelli Square, Fisherman's Wharf and other famous sights. Day 5: Monterey / Carmel. We visit historic Monterey, California's old capital, to see Steinbeck's Cannery Row and visit the Monterey Bay Aquarium - the largest aquarium in the west. Then we proceed to Carmel. considered the most beautiful spot on the coast. See why as we drive along the Del Monte Forest 17 Mile Drive where lavish mansions were built by tycoons in the 1920's. The views of the sea and rugged coastline are unsurpassed.

Day 6: Big Sur, Hearst Castle and Solvang. We continue the thrilling drive down the Pacific Coast Highway (acclaimed as the most beautiful drive in North America) where the mountains drop steeply to the sea. Passing the fantastic Pacific panoramas of Big Sur we arrive at San Simeon. home of the famous Hearst Castle. We visit this fabulous estate and explore the small kingdom of castles, fountains and European art treasures. You won't believe your eyes! We overnight in Solvang, reminiscent of a quaint Danish town.

Day 7: Santa Barbara / Los Angeles. We drive down the coast to Santa Barbara, noted for its architectural beauty. We'll enjoy a guided stroll through the Santa Barbara Botanical Gardens, followed by a visit to historic downtown Santa Barbara, before proceeding to LA for a 2-night stay.

Day 8: Los Angeles. On our tour of Los Angeles we will pass by famous sights such as historic Olvera Street (birthplace of LA), Rodeo Drive, Sunset Strip, Beverley Hills and more. Our walking tour will take us into the heart of Hollywood where we will see the famous celebrity hand and footprints on the Walk of Fame, and also Awards Walk - home to the Academy Awards. Then we will head over to the Farmer's Market, followed by a visit of the famous Getty Museum an archietectural landmark with breathtaking views and a world-renowned art collection.

Day 9: Santa Monica / Newport Harbour Cruise / Mission San Juan / San Diego. We begin the day with a casual stroll along the colourful and historic Santa Monica pier, before we head to Newport Beach (where the rich and famous moor their yachts) for a relaxing Harbour Cruise along the California Riviera. 





Mexico's Copper Canyon is considered the most scenic rail trip on the continent. Many describe it as more spectacular than the Grand Canyon.

This string of breathtaking canyons wind through the Sierra Madre Mountains, and are home to a vibrant tapestry of landscapes - from the immense cliffs that tower overhead and plummet to a seemingly bottomless abyss below, to the fertile green valleys and fragrant orchards, and to wind-blown crops and desert sands. This amazing journey traverses 37 bridges and 86 tunnels, and crosses interlocking canyons that are deeper, narrower and longer than any in the Americas.

The rail portion of our tour will take us through the Sierra Madre Mountains aboard the *Chihuahua Pacifico Regional Railway* (known as *El Chepe*). Itinerary for Mexico's Copper Canyon

Day 1: Departure / Chihuahua. We depart for Chihuahua with a change of planes in Mexico City. Upon arrival we transfer to our hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Chihuahua. On this morning's city tour we see the Government Palace, the Cathedral and the Quinta Gameros Museum, which boasts some of Mexico's finest modern art, as well as historical exhibits. Later we visit the Pancho Villa Museum, dedicated to the Mexican Revolutionary General who was also touted as a Robin Hood, bandit and womanizer.

Day 3: Divisadero. We travel by coach to Divisadero, where we will enjoy our first spectacular canyon views. Later we will have a guided tour of the canyon rim, and learn about the area's history and habitants.

This morning we enjoy a relaxing boat ride in the tranquil waters of the El Fuerte River, followed by a guided walking tour of the town with its charming cobblestone streets and hidden alcoves. We will visit the church, the bustling market and the museum. Later we travel to the native village of Capomos for a show of folk dance by the indigenous Mayo people.

Day 7: El Fuerte. We make our way to the beautiful bay of Topolobampo on the Pacific Ocean for a wonderful cruise. Keep your cameras handy for possible sightings of colourful local birds and dolphins. Then we visit Maviri beach where we may swim in the ocean or relax on the beach. Lunch today will be in a local restaurant that features fresh seafood.

Day 8: All Aboard! Cerocahui. We journey to Cerocahui. and this afternoon we make our way to Gallego Mountain for a spectacular view of the Urique Canyon, the river and the old mining town. En route we will drive through a series of beautiful Tarahumara valleys and canyons.

Day 9: Cerocahui / Creel. This morning we have a guided tour of Cerocahui that includes the old Jesuit Mission and school for the Native Tarahumara girls. Then we proceed by coach to Creel, considered the doorway to the Tarahumaran culture. The Tarahumara people call themselves "Raramuri" which means "runners on foot". The afternoon is at leisure, and you may stroll around the village, known locally as a "Magical Town".

Day 10: Creel. This morning we enjoy a very scenic tour to Arareko Lake, the Valley of the Mushrooms, the Cusarare Waterfall and the San Ignacio Mission. We will also visit some fascinating caves - home to Tarahumara families. Afternoon at leisure.


Day 11: Casas Grandes. We transfer by bus to Casas Grandes, en route visiting a Mennonite community in the city of Cuauhtemoc where we enjoy a traditional lunch with a family that makes their own delicious cheese, cold cuts, fruit preserves, bread and cookies.

Day 12: Casas Grandes. We visit the Juarez Colony, a Mormon community with strong American influence. The Juarez Academy was built in 1904 and has a gleaming white marble temple. Then we continue to the town of Mata Ortiz, famous for its wonderful ceramics.

Day 13: Chihuahua. We visit the archaeological site of Paquimé, a UNESCO World Heritage Site of a highly civilized ancient civilization. Multi-story buildings, efficient hydraulic networks and plazas prove it was a city built by culturally developed people. We continue to Chihuahua.

Day 14: Grutas Nombre de Dios / Chihuahua. We depart for a tour of the fantastic 'Name of God' grottos to explore the incredible rock formations underground. Following the grottos, we will visit the ruins of the Quintas Carolinas ancient haciendas in the state of Chihuahua. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 15: Home. After breakfast we transfer to the airport for our flight home, via Mexico City.



Today's full-day tour will be by both coach and walking to take in the major highlights: Big Ben, Houses of Parliament, Piccadilly Circus, Trafalgar Square, St. Paul's Cathedral, Tower Bridge and the Changing of the Guard at Buckingham Palace, along with visits to Westminster Abbev and the Canadian War Memorial.

This evening is our first night at the theatre!

Day 4: At Leisure. A day to enjoy this grand city! There are countless attractions, museums and galleries in London. Your Tour Manager will be on hand with suggestions!

Day 5: Stratford-Upon-Avon. Our full day excursion takes us through the quintessential English countryside to Stratford-Upon-Avon, home of William Shakespeare. Highlights of our guided walking tour will include Anne Hathaway's cottage and garden, a Tudor Schoolmaster lesson in the room that Shakespeare was educated, and a Tour and Tasting at the local Gin Distillery.

Day 6: Windsor / Theatre. We visit Windsor and the castle that has been "home" to English monarchs for 1,000 years. It is said to be the Queen's favourite residence. We will also stop at the R.A.F. Memorial, overlooking scenic countryside, and pass by the location of the signing of the "Magna Carta" – issued in 1215 it was the first document to put into writing the principle that the king and his government were not above the law.

This evening is our 2nd theatre night!

Day 7: Bath. We visit Bath, known for its hot spring waters and the 18th century honey-coloured Georgian terraces with their elegant crescents. Our guided walking tour shows us Jane Austin's home, the Avon River, Bath Abbey and more. We'll visit the magnificent Roman Baths, built by the Romans nearly 2000 years ago. After, we'll enjoy a sumptuous "Afternoon Tea" (an interpretation of the ritual that began in the 1800s) in The Pump Room — the social heart of Bath for more than two centuries with famous patrons like Jane Austen and Charles Dickens.

Day 8: Covent Garden / Theatre. Our visit to Covent Garden today takes us to an area that through the years has evolved into one of the liveliest districts in London. Originally a vegetable garden for the monks of Westminster Abbey, today Covent Garden houses stylish shops, market stalls, cafes, bars, restaurants and even a "Canadian" pub close by along with all kinds of buskers (street entertainers). We'll visit the "Actors Church" - so called as it contains memorials dedicated to many famous theatrical personalities: Charlie Chaplin, Noel Coward, Vivien Leigh and more. It was also here that George Bernard Shaw set "Pygmalion" - the basis for the movie "My Fair Lady", right under the Portico!

This evening is our final theatre night!

Day 9: Day of Leisure. A day of leisure to do your own thing in London. Prior to our Farewell Dinner this evening, we'll step aboard the magnificent London Eye, which offers a truly captivating and unparalleled view of London - a perfect "Farewell" to the city!

Day 10: Home. It's "Cheerio' as we fly home with Air Canada.



On this tour of two Celtic Countries we will experience constantly changing landscapes, magnificent seascapes, historic castles and monuments and the carefree Celtic spirit of the people here that remains strong to this day.

Itinerary for Scotland and Ireland

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Edinburgh, direct from Toronto.

Day 2: Edinburgh. We arrive in Scotland and transfer to our hotel in Edinburgh. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Edinburgh. On our city tour of Scotland's capital (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) we see The Royal Mile, Holyrood Palace, Edinburgh Castle and we visit the Royal Yacht Britannia - noted as the UK's no.1 attraction by Trip Advisor. The yacht was home to The Queen and Royal Family for over 40 years, sailing over 1,000,000 miles around the world.

Day 4: Newtonmore. We visit Scone Palace, one of Scotland's most important stately homes. For centuries it was the seat of parliament and the crowning place of Scottish Kings (including Macbeth and Robert The Bruce). The Palace houses a fine collection of antiques, paintings and rare artifacts, and the grounds are world renowned. Our afternoon visit is Blair Athol Distillery - standing at the gateway to the Highlands, it is one of the oldest working distilleries in Scotland. We'll see how they make their single-malt whiskey, and naturally we'll try a wee dram! We end in Newtonmore for a 2-night stay.

Day 5: Loch Ness / Newtonmore Our first stop is the pretty village of Fort Augustus, which lies on the shore of Loch Ness straddling the Caledonian Canal - the 19th century engineering marvel that connects the east and west coasts of Scotland. At the Clansman Centre we'll enjoy a special Highlander Performance in the heart of this Highland community. We then board our Jacobite Cruise along Loch Ness to the foot of Urquhart Castle, where we'll have time to visit this magnificent 13th century ruin. Later we'll drive into the village of Drumnadrochit where we enjoy a lovely dinner at the local inn.

Day 6: Stirling / Glasgow. We travel through the Trossachs National Park, which boasts some of the world's most stunning scenery, as we make our way to Stirling Castle - an essential part of any visit to central Scotland. We will learn about the castle's historical importance and marvel at its magnificence as it sits on its high volcanic rock, visible for many miles in every direction. Then we proceed to Glasgow, and enjoy a panoramic tour of this exciting city, rich in culture and history.

Day 7: Glasgow. A day at leisure in Glasgow. There is so much to do and see in Scotland's largest city. You may want to visit the magnificent 12th century Cathedral, or the renowned Piping Centre where you can explore 300 years of Highland Bagpipe heritage, and have an opportunity to try the bagpipes yourself!

Day 8: Belfast. We ferry over to Belfast (Northern Ireland), and plunge into Irish culture with a Traditional Music Trail tour. With two professional musicians as your guides, we walk through cobbled alleyways, past famous landmarks and on to private

bars in some of the city's oldest buildings. At each stop we will be treated to a performance of traditional songs and stories.

Day 9: Belfast. On our city tour we'll see St. George's Market, the Belfast Peace Walls, Crumlin Road Gaol, Parliament Buildings and much more. We end at the Titanic Belfast (named the World's Leading Tourist Attraction at the 2016 World Travel Awards) which tells the story of the doomed ship through interactive galleries, from her construction in Belfast, to her maiden voyage. The afternoon is at leisure to explore Belfast's endless attractions, shopping, pubs and cafes.

Day 10: Dublin / Wicklow. We head south to Ireland's capital -Dublin. Our city tour will take in the statue-lined streets, elegant Georgian Squares and the townhouses boasting the famous coloured doors. There will be free time in Dublin for shopping, sightseeing or to enjoy a pint in one of the many pubs! At the end of the day we proceed to our hotel in Wicklow for a 2-night stay.

Day 11: Wicklow. We drive through the rugged and romantic scenery that Ireland is famous for, to Glendalough, known for its spectacular scenery, rich history, archaeology and abundant wildlife. Then we visit Powerscourt Estate, listed #3 in National Geographic's finest gardens of the world. This evening we go out for a rousing evening of Irish food and entertainment!


Day 12: Kilkenny. We begin with a sheepdog demonstration - in which the the instructor will explain each command in the dog training technique - a perfect opportunity to experience the true essence of Irish country living. Later we arrive in Kilkenny - a city rich in heritage and craft. We will have free time to explore.

Day 13: Cashel / Killarney. Our first stop is the Rock of Cashel, where medieval Irish kings were crowned. See the 12th century Cormac's Chapel with its Romanesque decorations. Then we proceed to Killarney, a vibrant town brimming with Irish heritage, shops and cafes, with time to explore on our own.

Day 14: Ring of Kerry / Killarney. We embark on Ireland's most popular scenic drive, the Ring of Kerry. The winding route reveals breathtaking sights of coastal views, beaches and cliffs. We also visit the Skellig Experience to learn about the nearby islands where early Christian Monks lived in austere conditions.

Day 15: Foynes / Kildare. We first visit the Flying Boat Museum. to learn about transatlantic passenger flights and taste Irish Coffee which was invented there. Then we proceed to our 4-star country hotel in County Kildare. Enroute we will stop in Kildare Town - one of the oldest towns in Ireland with 1500 years of history. Today this vibrant town offers a wide selection of shops and cafes. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Home. We fly home, direct from Dublin to Toronto.

This unique tour takes in some of Britain's Canal Waterways and Welsh Railways.

The UK is criss-crossed with incredible canals and waterways that meander through stunning countryside and skirt past quaint towns and villages. A beautiful by-product of the industrial revolution and a testament to human engineering, these canals would have been heaving with cargo and people when they were first created. Now they make for a calm, quiet and relaxing way to explore Britain's varied landscapes.

Likewise, the Great Little Trains of Wales are a very special way of seeing some of the best scenery in the British Isles. While each of these narrow gauge steam railways are unique in their own way, all of them have a history spanning well over 100 years, and so they have the charm of old-time steam trains with plenty of polished paintwork and brass. The special attraction of narrow gauge railways lies in their modest size compared with mainline trains, and their leisurely speed gives time to take in some of the splendid scenery.

Itinerary for British Railroads and Waterways

Day 1: Depart. We depart for London.

Day 2: Bourton-on-the-Water. We arrive and head to Bourton-on-the-Water for our 4-night stay. This town is known as the 'Venice of the Cotswolds' because of the lovely small bridges that cross the river that runs through the centre of town. Our hotel is centrally located in the town.

Day 3: Kennet and Avon Canal. The Queen reopened the Kennet and Avon Canal in 1990, after it had been extensively refurbished by dedicated waterway enthusiasts and local volunteers. It runs through spectacular scenery between the Thames at Reading and the Avon at Bristol. We'll enjoy a horse-drawn boat trip down Kennet and Avon Canal, then we'll return to Bourton-on-the-Water for free time in the village for exploring and shopping.

Day 4: Cotswolds Canals, River Severn and National Waterway Museum. At Stroud we visit a restored section of one of the Cotswolds Canals, then on to Saul Junction where it meets the Gloucester and Sharpness Ship Canal. We proceed to Gloucester Docks to visit the National Waterway Museum and take a boat trip on the Ship Canal.

Day 5: Grand Union Canal and Blisworth Tunnel. We go to Northamptonshire, and at the Grand Union Canal we visit the canal museum. In the afternoon we visit Braunston where the Grand Union and Oxford Canals meet. See the boats moving to their locks, the workshops and basins, all in a rural idyllic setting.

Day 6: Ludlow / Snowdonia. We bid a fond farewell to the Cotswolds and our waterway excursions, and we head to Snowdonia in Wales stopping first in Ludlow. Nestled in an area of outstanding natural beauty in the heart of the Shropshire Hills, the town has a history of over 800 years and is surrounded by almost 500 listed buildings. From it's ancient Castle to its peaceful back streets with many cafes, bars, shops, and beautiful, fascinating architecture, exploring Ludlow is a real pleasure. Later we arrive at our Country House hotel for a 7-night stay.

Day 7: Aberystwyth Cliff Railway and the Vale of Rheidol Railway. We go to Aberystwyth to ride on the Cliff Railway which should give excellent views if the weather is favourable. Then to the Vale of Rheidol Railway which opened in 1902, for a trip through beautiful scenery to Devil's Bridge and return.

Day 8: Fairbourne, Talyllyn and Corris Railways. Today we will ride on 3 narrow-gauge lines. First, we'll go down to the coast at Fairbourne to ride the miniature railway to the Barmouth estuary and return. Then on to the Talyllyn Railway - one of the longest operating heritage railways (since 1865). Finally, the Corris Railway with a museum visit.

Day 9: At leisure. You may want to visit the nearby historic market town of Dolgellau, or venture further to Portmeirion - a quaint Italianate village well-known as the setting for the cult 1960's TV series "The Prisoner".

Day 10: Llanberis Lake Railway and Snowdon Mountain Railway. We first take the narrow-gauge Llanberis Lake Railway along the shores of Llyn Padarn, with a visit of the National Slate Museum. Then, weather permitting, we will ascend Snowdon by the unique Snowdon Mountain Railway which dates from 1896, for stunning views.


Day 11: Welshpool and Llanfair Railway and Bala Lake Railway. We head over to the charming Welshpool and Llanfair Railway, and travel through delightful pastoral scenery. Then it's on to ride the Bala Lake Railway - a narrow-gauge line re-opened on the former Great Western main line from Ruabon to Barmouth.

Day 12: Ffestiniog Railway and the Welsh Highland **Railway.** We take a journey on the two lines centred on Porthmadog. First, the Ffestiniog from Blaenau Ffestiniog to Porthmadog, which includes dramatic scenery and a spiral curve at Dduallt. Then on the Welsh Highland Railway, which passes through picturesque country with views of Snowdon (hopefully!) on its way to Caernarfon.

Day 13: Llandudno / Chester. We head to the seaside town of Llandudno, for some free time before we reach our final destination, Chester. The striking beauty and unique atmosphere makes Chester one of Britain's most popular destinations.

Day 14: Chester. On our walking tour of the city we see Britain's most complete city walls, its oldest racecourse and its largest Roman Amphitheatre, plus a 1000-year-old Cathedral with Europe's finest example of medieval carvings. The afternoon is at leisure to explore the attractions, cafés, pubs or the 700-year-old Rows galleries - a shopping delight! This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Glasgow.

Day 2: Pitlochry. Upon arrival we transfer to Pitlochry. Our hotel is located right in the centre of this beautiful Victorian town. The hotel's claim to fame, and one of the biggest surprises, is the award-winning gardens.

Day 3: Blair Atholl / Alltshellach. The spectacular Blair Castle has acted as gatekeeper to the Scottish Highlands for over 700 years. We will discover the turbulent history of the castle, which was home to the Duke of Atholl and Britain's only private army - the Atholl Highlanders. Our next stop is Athol Distillery, situated at the gateway to the Highlands. where we learn about their distilling process and enjoy a dram of their famous single malt. Day 10: Isle of Mull / Tobermory. Explore the quaint side streets with unique shops and stroll along the river and soak in the historical ambiance.

Day 6: Birmingham / Cadbury's World. We begin with a visit to Cadbury's World, where we will learn about the Cadbury family, see how Cadbury's products are made, and watch the chocolatiers demonstrate traditional chocolate making skills. Next is Birmingham's Frankfurt Christmas Market - the largest outdoor Christmas Market in the UK, and the largest authentic German Christmas Market outside of Germany or Austria. The Market offers a wide range of traditional goods, gifts and tempting food and drink, such as pretzels, schnitzels, bratwursts, and roasted almonds. Wash these delicacies down with gluhwein, weissbeer (wheat beer), or hot chocolate.

Day 7: Newmarket / Cambridge. Our visit today is Newmarket the Home of Horse Racing. This historic town is steeped in history, with an intriguing story as to how it became renowned as a centre for horseracing. Noted Royals over the past 2000 years have enjoyed countryside pursuits here. We will learn how Charles II fared in the first recorded horse race in history, why two royal palaces were built here and what the Queen does on her frequent visits here. Included in our tour is lunch and an afternoon Cream Tea. Later we arrive at our historic spa hotel a secluded haven located on the outskirts of Cambridge, for a 3-night stay.

Day 8: Thursford. We visit Thursford, home of the Christmas Spectacular - the UK's largest Christmas show! The show features mechanical organs, fairground carousels, and a cast of 130 professional singers, dancers, and musicians (including West End performers). The 3-hour performance delivers an extravaganza of singing, dancing, humour and variety.

Day 9: Cambridge. This city of history and discoveries is home to more Nobel Prize winners than any other city. Cambridge is also one of the UK's most beautiful cities to visit, with stunning architecture and charming cobbled streets. On our walking tour we'll see The River Cam, King's College Cathedral (a Gothic masterpiece) and The Fitzwilliam Museum (where DNA was discovered). There will also be free time to explore on our own.

Day 10: London / Winchester. We proceed to London, where our city tour will take in many of the iconic sites. We'll visit the Royal Albert Hall and discover how the building was founded 150 years ago, the royal love story that made it happen, and how the engineering challenge of the Royal Albert Hall echo was solved. After our tour it's on to our lovingly restored manor house hotel, which blends boutique chic with 16th century character, set in acres of glorious Hampshire countryside.

Day 11: Beaulieu and the New Forest. On our day in the New Forest, we step back in time and discover the natural beauty of this unique destination. We start at Beaulieu (with 800 years of heritage), and visit a stately home, a world famous motor museum and a 13th century abbey surrounded by picturesque gardens. Included is a sumptuous Christmas meal served in the magical surroundings of the Beaulieu Abbey Domus.

Day 12: Winchester. Our Winchester city walking tour shows us the city of Alfred the Great and England's ancient capital. bursting with historical and architectural treasures. We'll see the iconic statue of King Alfred, the historic High Street, the Great Hall with its Round Table and connections to King Arthur, the site of Winchester Castle and Winchester Cathedral. There will be free time to discover the city on our own.

Day 13: Salisbury. We go to Salisbury - a perfect English city with an ideal fusion of medieval magnificence and contemporary culture. We visit Salisbury Cathedral - Britain's tallest spire and home to one of the original Magna Carta manuscripts. There will be free time in the historic city centre where you will find tearooms, coffee shops, friendly pubs and fine shopping opportunities. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner raise a glass of cheer to celebrate this Holiday Season tour.

Day 14: Home. Air Canada flies us back to Canada.

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Milan, via London.

Day 2: Milan. We arrive in Milan and transfer to our hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Milan / Lake Garda. We have a brief tour of Milan before departing for Lake Garda, where we will take in the magnificent scenery with views of the Alps and picturebook villages along the shore. We will enjoy a lovely boat trip on the lake and visit medieval Sirmione - known as the "Jewel of the Lake". A spa town since Roman times, we will stroll the narrow, cobbled lanes and see the 13th century castle and well-preserved Roman ruins.

Day 4: Verona / Venice. We proceed through the cypress clad hills to Verona, where we see the Roman Arena and Juliet's famous balcony. A short drive brings us to the university town of Padua, home of many great Italians (Dante, Galileo, etc.) and numerous art treasures. We visit the famous Basilica of St. Anthony and then continue to the Venice area.

Day 5: Venice. We cross the Venetian lagoon by boat and spend a full day in the magical city of Venice. We see St. Mark's Square, the Bridge of Sighs and the Doge's Palace.

Day 6: Pisa / San Giuliano. We leave Venice and drive through the picturesque hills to Pisa and the famous Leaning Tower. We will also see the Duomo and the Baptistry. We continue on to the charming village of San Giuliano Terme, famous for its Spa Centre.

Day 7: Florence / Siena. We depart for Florence, Cradle of the Renaissance. Our walking tour will take in the multicoloured marble cathedral, Signoria Square, Santa Croce Basilica and more. We then head south for our overnight near Siena.

Day 8: Siena / Assisi / Rome. After a walking tour of medieval Siena, site of the famous horse race, we continue on to the pink stone city of Assisi, which is under the protection of St. Francis. The city is still enclosed by medieval ramparts. Our tour includes St. Francis Basilica, well known for its Fresco paintings. After our visit we continue on to Rome.

Day 9: Rome. Our touring in Rome begins in Vatican City official residence of the Pope. We'll visit St. Peter's Basilica - one of the holiest Catholic sites, and the Vatican Museum where we find the Sistine Chapel. The afternoon is free to explore Rome's many museums, shops and cafes.

Day 10: Rome / Sorrento. Our touring of Rome continues with the Roman Forum; the Arch of Constantine; Circus Maximus; Spanish Steps and an opportunity to visit the Coliseum. We then proceed to Sorrento on the beautiful Sorrentine Peninsula, which is characterized by majestic cliffs, terraced vineyards, orange groves and a striking rocky shoreline. We stay in Sorrento for 2 nights.

Day 11: Sorrento at leisure. A day at leisure to explore this beautiful coastal city. Your Tour Manager will be on hand with suggestions.

Day 12: Pompeii / Naples / Overnight Ferry. Today we visit fascinating Pompeii, the imperial city engulfed by the eruption of Vesuvius in 79 AD. We then proceed to Naples for a panoramic tour of the old city with its Gothic and Baroque churches. Later we board our ferry bound for Sicily. As we depart the Bay of Naples be on deck for the breathtaking views of Naples and Mount Vesuvius.

Day 13: Palermo / Agrigento. We arrive in Palermo, a fascinating city with a mix of Latin, Byzantine and Islamic buildings. We may have an opportunity to visit one of the huge and colourful markets with its riveting display of fruits, vegetables and other goods. We then drive through the scenic hills to Agrigento with its magnificent works of Doric architecture dating from the 6th century BC. In the evening the site is beautifully illuminated.

Day 14: Agrigento / Taormina. This morning we visit the famed Valley of the Temples (formerly a Greek stronghold) and visit the temples of Juno, Concord and Hercules - very well-preserved Greek ruins. Then it's on to the Taormina area with stunning views of the sea and Mt. Etna -Europe's tallest volcano.

Day 15: Taormina. This charming town has long been a favourite international resort and has wonderful parks. gardens and an ancient Greek theatre. We enjoy a morning orientation tour, and an afternoon at leisure. From Piazza Garibaldi one can enjoy the best views of Mt. Etna and the beautiful Ionian coastline. Our Farewell Dinner tonight will be at a local restaurant featuring Sicilian foods and wine.

Day 16: Home. We fly home via London.



The Amalfi Coast is a series of small bays, beaches, villages and towns, all with a backdrop of rugged cliffs.

The road that hugs the cliffs affords one of the most spectacular drives in Europe. Everywhere are orange, lemon and olive groves, vineyards, lush greenery and flowering shrubs - all near to the sparkling Tyrrhenian Sea. On this tour we will take in all the wonderful sights in the region and tantalize our taste buds by sampling the local specialties; extra-virgin olive oil, mozzarella cheese and Limoncello (the local liqueur). We will even have the opportunity to make our own "Neapolitan" pizza!

Our tour begins with 5-nights in the resort town of Maiori, which has its own beach and tree-lined promenade. The hills and cliffs form a wonderful backdrop, but the town itself is not hilly and it's easy to stroll through the narrow streets and lanes with their interesting shops, cafes and churches. For the more energetic there are superb walking trails to explore.

We then transfer to Sorrento for a 7-night stay. This is the most picturesque town on the Bay of Naples, perched high on the cliffs with stunning views over the Bay of Naples to the distant Mount Vesuvius. Sorrento offers many restaurants,

cafes, shops and a local market. Other small towns and villages along the coast are also accessible by local transport.

All hotels on this tour have a restaurant, bar and lounge, and the guestrooms are simply furnished and equipped with twin beds, telephone, TV and private bathroom.

Our Maiori hotel is the *Reginna Palace* (or similar), located in the town centre across from the beach and promenade. The local bus stops nearby and there are many restaurants and cafes all around.

Our hotel in Sorrento will be one of the popular Acampora properties, all of which are located seaside on the cliff, with impressive views of the Bay of Naples and within walking distance of the town centre.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Rome - a direct non-stop flight from Toronto.

Day 2: Rome / Maiori. Upon arrival in Rome we transfer to our hotel in Maiori, stopping en route for an included lunch.

Day 3: Maiori. We meet with our local guide for an orientation walking tour of Majori. We'll see the beautiful Italian style gardens, the interesting local church and winding narrow streets and shops.

Day 4: Ravello and Amalfi / Maiori. This morning we visit Ravello and the Villa Rufolo, the inspiration for some of musician Richard Wagner's famous works. We then continue to the beautiful town of Amalfi for a walking tour and some free time to explore.

Day 5: Positano / Maiori. Today we enjoy a boat trip to Positano, one of the coast's most picturesque towns, with steeply-stacked houses tumbling down to the sea in a cascade of sun-bleached peach, pink and terracotta colours. Its steep streets and narrow lanes are lined with wisteria-draped cafes, restaurants and boutiques.

Day 6: Vietri Sul Mare / Maiori. We visit the artisan town of Vietri Sul Mare, where the local people produce and sell beautiful Italian ceramics - a great place to buy that special souvenir.

Day 7: Sorrento. Today we travel over the mountains, taking in the scenic views as we proceed to the resort town of Sorrento.

Day 8: Sorrento / Galatea Farm. We begin our day with an orientation walking tour of the cliff-top town of Sorrento. We see the main square, Piazza Tasso - always a hive of activity, and we also visit the Wood Inlay Museum. We then proceed to Galatea Farm in the Sorrento hills where we are welcomed by the staff and given an

explanation of the workings of this small farm. We enjoy a tasting of local wines and participate in a cooking lesson and pizza making demonstration during which we make our own personal "Neapolitan" pizzas.

Day 9: Pompeii / Sorrento. We enjoy a morning tour to Pompeii, the ruins of a once thriving community destroyed by the eruption of Vesuvius in 79AD.

Day 10: Sorrento. A day at leisure. Of course there is so much to do and see in the city and in this region. Your Tour Manager will be on hand to offer suggestions and optional tours.

Day 11: Capri / Sorrento. We catch the ferry from Sorrento to the lovely island of Capri and its famous Blue Grotto. Capri was once a summer resort for Roman Emperors. During our tour we visit the famous Piazzetta and the Garden of Augustus with its view of the Faraglioni Rocks. There will be some free time for shopping before returning to Sorrento.

Days 12 & 13: Sorrento. At leisure to enjoy Sorrento's fine shopping and cafes, as well as the beautiful views and surroundings. Optional excursions will be offered. On one of the evenings we will attend a performance of local tradition, dance and songs at the Tasso Theatre.

Day 14: Naples / Rome. We depart for Rome. En route we will stop in the lively city of Naples for a panoramic tour, a visit of the Royal Palace and lunch at a local restaurant. Later we arrive in Rome for our Farewell Dinner and overnight.

Day 15: Home. We fly home to Canada.



There are many reasons why the Italian Riviera and Tuscany are two of Italy's most popular regions to visit.

We begin this leisurely tour in Milan, where we will see both the modern and historic sites. From Milan we travel to the Riviera di Levante (known as "The Italian Riviera") - a rugged coastline with many small bays and inlets. This area is incredibly picturesque, with hills sloping dramatically down to the sea. We will stay 4 nights in this region touring the major highlights. Nearby are the Cinque Terre villages that date from the 12th century - each village is different and all have dramatic coastal scenery.

The Tuscany region is home to some of the world's most famous Renaissance art and architecture, breathtaking scenery of medieval hilltop villages, olive groves, hillside vineyards and dramatic mountain ranges. We will stay 8 nights in Montecatini, located in the heart of Tuscany. This elegant and historic spa town is set amid green

Tuscan hills and olive groves. It features "Liberty" style buildings (an Italian equivalent to Art Deco), welcoming parks and beautiful gardens. Its many spas provide a range of treatments that take advantage of the healing properties of the therapeutic mineral waters, while the town offers many shops, restaurants and a weekly market to enjoy at your leisure. Local trains and buses operate a regular service to the surrounding towns and villages. Sightseeing in this region will include Florence, the famous Tuscan hilltop towns, elegant villas, farms and medieval towns like Lucca.

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Milan, via Paris.

Day 2: Milan. We arrive in Milan and transfer to our hotel. The balance of the day is at leisure until our Welcome Dinner tonight.

Day 3: Milan / Liguria. On our morning tour of Milan we see the Milan Cathedral (the Duomo di Milano), the castle. the Galleria and the famous opera house La Scala. After our tour we depart for the Ligurian coast.

Day 4: Portofino / Camogli / Liguria. We take a boat ride along one of Italy's most beautiful coasts, stopping in Portofino - a stunning port town that has long been a favourite destination for the rich and famous. We then continue to the picturesque fishing village of Camogli, known as the "City of the Thousand White Sailing Ships" for its maritime tradition.

Day 5: Cinque Terre / Liguria. We board the local train to Cinque Terre. This UNESCO World Heritage Site consists of 5 picturesque villages clinging dramatically to the cliffs along the rocky coastline of the Italian Riviera. Upon arrival at the village of Monterosso we will have time to explore before taking a scenic boat trip to Vernazza - one of the most beautiful villages. We continue by train to Manarola and after some free time there return again by train to our hotel

Day 6: Liguria. A day at leisure to explore the Italian Riviera, popular for its beautiful beaches, cliffside views and charming towns

Day 7: Portovenere / Montecatini. We depart for the village of Portovenere, situated on a rocky coastline. The village was dear to Lord Byron for its tranquility. The 12th century village centre still preserves the original coloured houses overlooking the harbour and the Tinetto Islands. We will see 13th century St. Peter's Church built on rocks before we continue to Montecatini.

Day 8: Siena and Chianti / Montecatini. This morning we enjoy a tour of Siena. Distinguished by its medieval brick buildings, the fan-shaped Piazza del Campo (where the famous annual horse race is held) is dominated by the Palazzo Pubblico - the gothic town hall. We will also visit

a castle in the Chianti District followed by a wine tasting. This evening there will be a talk on the history, art, local traditions and present-day rivalries in Tuscany.

Day 9: Local Farm / Montecatini. The morning is at leisure to explore this charming spa town with its many shops and cafes. This afternoon we visit a local farm to learn of the agricultural products Tuscany is well known for. The visit will be followed by dinner with a selection of local wine and produce.

Day 10: Lucca / Villa Bernardini / Montecatini. After a free morning, we enjoy the lovely Tuscan scenery as we travel to medieval Lucca to visit the 17th century Villa Bernardini - an elegant villa with magnificent gardens surrounded by olive groves and vineyards. The villa has its original furnishings and still houses a green theatre in the garden that seats 400. We then have some time to discover the historic centre of Lucca, followed by dinner at a local restaurant, before we return to Montecatini.

Day 11: Florence / Montecatini. A full day touring in Florence - the "Cradle of the Renaissance". We visit the Academia Gallery to see the magnificent statue of David by Michelangelo. We then have a walking tour and see the multi-coloured marble cathedral, Signoria Square, the Baptistery and Piazzale Michelangelo from where we have the best view over the city.

Day 12: Montecatini. At leisure to explore the town and stroll the lovely promenade.

Day 13: San Gimignano / Volterra / Montecatini. A full day to explore the unique hilltop towns set among the Tuscan vineyards and cypress trees. These small towns, with their medieval buildings and monuments, have existed since 1155.

Day 14: Montecatini. At leisure. You may like to take the cog train up the hill to the ancient upper town.

This evening's Farewell Dinner at a local farm will feature some specially prepared regional dishes.

Day 15: Home. We fly home via Paris.

Puglia (also known as Apulia) is known for its sun-bleached landscapes, silver olive groves, picturesque seascapes, memorable hilltop villages and coastal towns.

This unique region is skirted by an endless coastline dotted with castles and watchtowers, reflective of its history of conquering invaders: Normans, Spanish, Turks and Greeks. Despite its diverse influences over the centuries, Puglia has its own distinct identity with ancient customs and local traditions. In the many small villages and large cities alike, architectural wonders from different periods and faiths are everywhere, many displaying the intricate works of a variety of artists.

As for cuisine, Puglia's cucina povera (peasant cooking) is legendary. We will visit a winery, cheese producer, olive mill and bakery to learn about and taste the local products.

We will stay 3 nights in Lecce in the south, 3 nights in the town of Ostuni, 3 nights in Puglia's capital Bari, 2 nights in the mountain village of Monte Sant'Angelo and 2 nights in the coastal town of Barletta.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Puglia (Brindisi) with a change of planes in Rome.

Day 2: Lecce. Upon arrival in Brindisi we transfer to our hotel in Lecce for a 3-night stay. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Galatina / Lecce. Today we enjoy a walking tour of historic Lecce. We will see Santa Croce, Church of the Rosary and Palazzo Celestine. Later we visit a farm in Galatina to sample some of the region's finest local wine and enjoy a light lunch.

Day 4: Otranto / Santa Maria Lueca / Lecce. This wonderfully scenic day begins at the port town of Otranto. known for its historic center and beautiful sea views. We visit the Cathedral with its Chapel of 800 Martyrs, the crypt and one of the largest mosaics in the world. We finish at Santa Maria di Leuca at the southern tip of Puglia for views of where the Ionian and Adriatic seas meet.

Day 5: Cisternino / Ostuni. We visit Cisternino to see an old olive mill, then proceed to the "White City" of Ostuni perched on a hill overlooking acres of olive groves that roll out toward the sea. We will see the old center with its Gothic Roman Cathedral before checking in to our hotel in this region for a 3-night stay.

Day 6: Alberobello / Ostuni. We first visit the Castellana Grotto (cave) with its unique stalactites and stalagmites. We then continue to the town of Alberobello to see the famous UNESCO Trulli Village - a symbol of Puglia. There will be a tour of one these unique dwellings followed by some free time to wander in the village.

Day 7: Martina Franca / Regional Lunch / Ostuni. Today we discover Martina Franca - a lovely baroque town with palaces and beautifully decorated churches. Our visit will be followed by a special lunch featuring regional products and local hospitality.

Day 8: Monopoli / Polignano a Mare / Bari. This morning we visit the archeological area of Egnazia - once an important Roman town along the Appian Way, then proceed to medieval Monopoli, stretching along a jagged coastline and steeped in history and tradition. The town has fortifications of walls and castles, churches and a magnificent baroque Cathedral. Next is the seaside city

of Polignano a Mare, known for its picturesque balconies and also the birthplace of singer Domenico Modugno, who sang the universally known song "Volare". We continue to Bari for a 3-night stay.

Day 9: Bari. Today we discover the city of Bari. Although modern in many aspects it maintains its historic center with the Basilica of Saint Nicholas, the Cathedral and the Norman-Swabian Castle. After a walking tour there will be a free afternoon to explore the waterfront, historic buildings, many shops and cafes.

Day 10: Matera / Altamura / Bari. Today we visit the magnificent UNESCO city of Matera, starting with the upper part of the Civita dominated by the spectacular Romanesque Cathedral, and then visit the lower section and the Barisan Sasso. Later we'll stop in Altamura - a charming town with a well-known 13th century cathedral, to visit a traditional bakery before returning to Bari.

Day 11: Trani / Gargano Peninsula. We travel along the coast to the sophisticated seaside town of Trani, known as the "Pearl of Puglia".

Day 12: Gargano Peninsula. We explore the Gargano promontory that sticks out into the Adriatic Sea (the "spur" on the Italian "boot"), passing picture-book seaside villages and breathtaking scenery of blue waters and unique cliffs. Later we'll enjoy a boat cruise for even more spectacular views (weather permitting).

Day 13: Monte Sant' Angelo / Barletta. We first visit one of the oldest churches in Christianity in Monte Sant'Angelo, and then proceed to the coastal town of Barletta where we will see the 11th century fortress, the Cathedral and Cellar of the Challenge. Barletta will be our home for the final two nights of the tour.

Day 14: Castel Del Monte / Andria / Barletta. Today we visit the UNESCO site of Castel del Monte - a 13th-century citadel and castle of unique octagonal construction. We then learn of cheese production in the Andria region, famous for the soft mozzarella, ricotta and burrata cheeses. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 15: Home. It's arrivederci to Puglia as we transfer to Bari for our flight home via Rome.

The beloved region of Tuscany encompasses the best of Italy: stunning historic cities; artistic masterpieces; extraordinary views and landscapes; sea and mountains; sunny climate; not to mention the wonderful local food products (especially during the fall harvest season), fine wines and artisan shops with age-old traditions.

With its carefully tended hills covered with grape vines, cypress trees, olive groves, stone farmhouses and mild weather year-round, it is a delightful area for an interesting and relaxing stay-put holiday.

We will stay in Viareggio, a small resort town with a long, lovely Mediterranean coastline of wide sandy beaches, parks and pine forests. Parallel to the beach is a wide promenade and lively shopping area. The town has easy access to the great Renaissance cities of Florence, Siena, Pisa and Lucca, all of which are included in our tour. We will also visit Cinque Terre - the amazing cluster of villages clinging to the dramatic cliffs along the coast, the medieval town of Bolgheri - a beautiful historic hamlet with a famous avenue of cypress trees, and Livorno - with

its dramatic rocky coastline. On the day we explore Chianti we will sample many famous regional wines.

In Viareggio our hotel is located on the Tuscan coast in a region called the "Riviera Versilia", which features the backdrop of the magnificent Apuan Mountains. We'll stay at the *Hotel President*, a four-star hotel that overlooks the seafront promenade. The beach is across the road and shopping is just a short walk away. Hotel facilities include a pleasant lounge, bar and restaurant. The guestrooms are comfortably furnished with two beds, telephone, satellite TV, mini-bar, safe and individual climate control.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Tuscany with a change of planes in Paris.

Day 2: Florence / Viareggio. We arrive in Florence and transfer by coach to Viareggio on the Riviera Versilia.

Day 3: Viareggio. Today we have a walking tour of the town, with its delightful seafront promenade, market and shopping area.

Day 4: Farm Visit. We visit a farm that produces some of the fine wines and olive oil found in Tuscany. We also see the wine cellars and vineyards and partake in a tasting.

Day 5: Viareggio. At leisure to explore this lovely Italian town. The bus and train stations are close to the hotel, and public transport is very good, so it is easy to visit the many surrounding towns and villages.

Day 6: Florence. A full day in the city called the "Cradle of the Renaissance" and former stronghold of the Medici family. Today we visit the Academia Gallery to see the magnificent statue of David by Michelangelo. We then have a walking tour of the city and see the multi-coloured marble cathedral, the Baptistery, Signoria Square and Piazzalle Michelangelo from where we have the best view of the city.

Day 7: Viareggio. At leisure to perhaps join an optional excursion to see more of the region. Your Tour Manager will assist and offer suggestions.

Day 8: Bolgheri / Castagneto Carducci / Livorno. Today we travel "off the beaten path" as we visit some of the unspoiled medieval villages in the region. In Bolgheri we drive the impressive avenue of cypress trees stretching 5 km. long! The town has maintained its original historic buildings, old roads and small shops. The atmosphere is enhanced by the amazing views of the hills covered in olive trees and the sea in the distance. There will be time to shop for local products before we continue along the wine route to visit the famous cellars of Michele Satta. where some of the best wines in Italy are produced. Lunch will be at a restaurant in Castagneto Carducci, featuring

a selection of typical dishes including homemade pasta with wild boar sauce. We return to Viareggio via the beautiful rocky coastline of Livorno.

Day 9: Cinque Terre / Ligure. We travel by train to the five villages known as Cinque Terre, which cling dramatically to the cliffs along the rocky coastline. Upon arrival at the village of Manarola we explore the village and then take the local train to Vernazza for some free time. Then there will be a boat ride to Monterosso - one of the most attractive of the five villages. At the end of our visit we return to Viareggio by train.

Day 10: Viareggio. At leisure, perhaps to visit the street market or other nearby towns.

Day 11: Siena and Chianti. This full day tour begins in the medieval town of Siena - famous for its annual Palio horse race but also a lovely city in many other respects. We will see the wonderful cathedral and the Piazza del Campo - considered one of the most beautiful squares in the world. After a morning of history and art we unwind in Chianti with a tasting of their well-known wines.

Day 12: Viareggio. At leisure.

Day 13: Pisa / Lucca. This morning we visit Pisa, and yes, the tower is still leaning. The beauty in the area of Campo Dei Miracoli will amaze you. It includes the tower, the duomo, the baptistry and the cemetery. A visit to the cathedral is included. There will be time to stroll around after the tour. We then proceed through the countryside to Lucca, a charming town which looks like a movie set for a medieval epic film. Most of Lucca is traffic-free and it is a pleasant place to stroll through the narrow streets and see the magnificent churches, squares and statuary. We will have a little free time to visit the small shops and perhaps enjoy a coffee and people watch.

Day 14: Viareggio. At leisure. This evening we enjoy a Tuscan evening with a typical meal of local specialties.

Day 15: Home. We say arrivederci to Tuscany and head home via Paris.



Italy is renowned for spectacular scenery, famous cuisine and wines, and of course for its many delightful towns and villages.

We will savour it all as we explore the beautiful region of Umbria - an area of deep green valleys, rolling hills, olive groves and charming old stone villas. It is well known for its many enchanting picture-postcard towns and villages and also for the incredible cathedrals, castles and monasteries in the countryside. We will also absorb the timeless atmosphere in the many well-preserved medieval town centres as we stroll the ancient cobbled streets.

We will stay in the region of Perugia, famous for its rich chocolate and delicious fresh pasta. Some of our sightseeing will take us "off the beaten path" to places rarely visited by tourists, including the charming town of Gubbio which sits at the base of the Apennine Mountain range, a cruise on Lake Trasimeno to marvel at the beauty of its islands, coastline and the surrounding mountains, a visit to Orvieto - a ceramic centre located on a cliff high above the countryside which boasts one of Italy's most impressive Gothic cathedrals, and of course Assisi and its magnificent famous shrine - St. Francis Basilica.

Along the way we'll enjoy the local wine, savour the purest of olive oil and indulge in the finest chocolate and truffles.

We begin with 6 nights in Assisi, at the lovely *Hotel Assisi La Terrazza*, a perfect base for exploring this region. The hotel is beautifully situated among the olive groves of Assisi's hills overlooking the green Umbria valley. The historic city centre of Assisi is approximately 800 meters away to walk (or take the local bus which stops near the hotel). The hotel's restaurant serves regional specialties of Umbria as well as international cuisine. The hotel has a wellness centre and swimming pool (not heated).

Our hotel in Perugia, for the next 7 nights, is the *Residenza Fontanelle Hotel*. This property is laid out like a small European village - a quiet oasis near a lively shopping area and steps from public transportation which you can take to other nearby towns and villages. On free days the hotel will offer a cookery lesson, afternoon tea, country strolls and a market visit.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Rome with Air Canada.

Day 2: Assisi. We arrive in Rome and transfer to our hotel in Assisi. Afternoon at leisure until our Welcome Dinner this evening.

Day 3: Assisi. Our tour of Assisi today includes a visit of the famous St. Francis Basilica, Santa Maria degli Angeli, the 13th century gothic Basilica di Santa Chiara and the frescos of the Pilgrim's Oratory.

Day 4: Assisi. A day at leisure to further explore Assisi.

Day 5: Gubbio / Assisi. We visit Gubbio, one of the architectural jewels of Umbria. This city preserves important vestiges of Umbrian, Roman and medieval history. We will see the Roman theater, Palazzos dei Consoli, Bargello and Ducale, and the Duomo of St. Ubaldo Mount Ingino.

Day 6: Assisi. A day at leisure. You may want to join an optional excursion to historic Urbino and "holy" Loreto.

Day 7: Spoleto / Cascate Delle Marmore / Assisi. Today we visit Spoleto to see its historic monuments and buildings; the Roman Theatre, Piazza del Duomo, La Rocca and the San Salvatore and San Ponziano Churches. Our included lunch today will feature Italian truffles. In the afternoon we set off for Marmore's Falls - a manmade waterfall created by the ancient Romans. Enjoy the observatory near the top that offers a grandiose view of the falls and the Nera Valley below.

Day 8: Perugia. We depart for Perugia with a stop to sample the local olive oil. We then enjoy a tour of Perugia, the capital city of the region of Umbria and well-known cultural and artistic centre of Italy. We will see Cavallotti Square in the historical centre, San Lorenzo Cathedral and Palazzo dei Priori. In the afternoon we visit the historical museum of Perugina Chocolate.

Day 9: Spello / Deruta / Perugia. A full day tour to Spello, one of the most beautiful "borgo" in Umbria with its old churches, walls and narrow streets full of flowers - sights that adorn travel posters for Italy all over the world. After our tour there will be some free time to wander the village. In the afternoon we stop in Deruta to visit a workshop known for its ceramics that are exported worldwide.

Day 10: Perugia. A day at leisure to perhaps take a stroll in the countryside or join an optional tour to a wild deer and boar farm with jeep rides and a farm-fresh lunch of their specialties

Day 11: Orvieto. Today we visit medieval Orvieto - a unique town sitting atop the summit of a large butte of volcanic tuff. It dominates the surrounding area and offers spectacular views over the countryside. We will visit the old town centre and the Duomo, and enjoy a special lunch with local wine and medieval costumes!

Day 12: Perugia. A day at leisure, or take an optional tour to Cortona in Tuscany, rich in museums, history and art.

Day 13: Lake Trasimeno. A splash of inky blue on the hilly landscape, Lake Trasimeno is Italy's fourth-largest lake and is surrounded by silver-green olive groves, vineyards, forests of oak and cypress, and castle-topped medieval towns. We will enjoy a relaxing cruise on the lake and see the three picturesque small islands before enjoying lunch at a local restaurant overlooking the lake. This afternoon we will have time for a stroll around the charming lake-side town of Passignano, rich in history and beauty, before we return to our hotel.

Day 14. Perugia. A final day at leisure to relax at the hotel or do some further exploring of the region.

Day 15: Home. We transfer to the Rome airport for our flight back to Canada.



Both fall and Christmas are lovely times of year in Southern Italy, as the pleasant mild climate is ideal for walking and exploring the small villages and towns of the Calabrian region. The Holiday Season in particular is a very special time of year in Calabria. It is one of the few regions of Italy where old traditions thrive, and ancient festivals and customs are still enjoyed.

Calabria is Italy's most unspoiled region, and is off the major tourist routes. Each turn of the road here reveals secluded valleys, remote hilltop villages and architectural gems that range from Greek and Roman ruins to Norman castles, Byzantine monasteries and Romanesque cathedrals. The dramatic coastline features secluded sandy beaches and bustling resorts, including the city of Reggio Calabria with its lovely wide promenades.

We will stay in the seaside town of Siderno, which has a pleasant boardwalk along the seafront. Our hotel is the moderate *Grand Presidente*, owned by a local family with a long experience of welcoming visitors. It is modern in design and conveniently located on the main route between Catanzaro (the region's capital) and Reggio. The hotel overlooks the Ionian Sea, which is accessible via the hotel's private pedestrian tunnel. The centre of town and its boardwalk are 2 km. away and can be reached by road or a stroll along the beach. Visiting the nearby towns and villages is easily done by public bus.





WHILE IN SPAIN

- 1. MALAGA (Half day tour). Our tour of the modern yet historic port city of Malaga, Picasso's birthplace, will include "Gibralfaro" - an old Arab Fortress offering fantastic views over the city and the Mediterranean. We will also visit the Cathedral - one of the best examples of Spanish Renaissance architecture.
- 2. MIJAS (Half day tour). Situated in the foothills of the Sierra de Mijas, this picturesque village is known as the "Essence of Andalusia" for its white houses, windows full of flowers and narrow streets. During our walking tour we will see the Shrine of the "Virgen de la Peña", the Parish Church, the Bullring and the Auditorium.
- 3. ALFARNATEJO (Full day tour with lunch). A tour through the olive oil route to see the largest and oldest olive groves in the region. We visit a rural oil production plant to sample different varieties before continuing to the charming mountain village of Alfarnatejo. A special lunch with a local family showcases the world renowned gastronomy of the region.
- 4. SEVILLE (Transfer day). Known for its impressive monumental heritage, Seville boasts beautiful gardens at Maria Luisa Park, the Plaza de España and the typical, delightful district of "Santa Cruz" (the former Jewish Quarter). We also see the 15th century Cathedral, the largest Gothic Church in Christendom, with its magnificent chancel, carvings and paintings.

WHILE IN PORTUGAL

- 1. ALTE and SALIR (Half day tour). a visit to elegant Alte a typical Algarve village of whitewashed houses with lattice work, handcrafted chimneys and narrow, cobbled streets nestling in the foothills of the Serra do Caldeirão. The church is at the centre of the village and there are numerous little cafes in which to relax and soak up the tranquility of the village. We then step back in time as we travel to Salir where a white row of charming houses are surrounded by the typical Algarve Carob, olive and almond orchards. The Church of Salir is the pride of the population, located in the central square.
- 2. LAGOS and SAGRES (Full day tour). Lagos still has many architectural signs of its ancient past, with one of the buildings dating back to 1445 and recorded as Europe's first slave market. Some of the walls of the town remain after sections were restored. After some time here we visit Sagres and nearby Cape St Vincent, the most southwestern point of Europe. An impressive lighthouse has provided safety for hundreds of ships that pass the Cape every year. The surrounding cliffs present a very dramatic sight with their impressive sheer height and the constant pounding of the vast Atlantic Ocean.
- 3. FARO and OLHAO (Half day tour). The provincial capital of the Algarve, Faro is a thriving university town with a maze of twisting lanes and a lovely marina. Olhao is the Algarve's main fishing port and we will see the town centre, charming waterfront and visit the municipal market (mercado) with its display of an exceptional variety of seafood.
- 4. LISBON CITY TOUR (Half day upon arrival from the Algarve the day before we return home). The capital of Portugal is a legendary city with over 20 centuries of history. On our city tour we will see St. George's Castle with its panoramic views over the city, Jeronimos Monastery, Tower of Belem, Monument to the Discoveries and more.

Itinerary for The Poppy Trail

Day 1: Departure. We depart for London.

Day 2: Windsor / London. After arrival we will unwind with a relaxing cruise from Runnymede, and enjoy classic views of Windsor Castle as well as a traditional cream tea. Then we proceed to our central London hotel. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: London. As bombs fell during WWII thousands of Londoners volunteered to fight fires and save lives. Our 'London at War' tour (aboard a vintage double decker bus) provides a unique insight into life in London during the two World Wars. Afterwards there will be some time at leisure to explore London on your own.

Day 4: Portsmouth (D-Day Museum). We travel to Portsmouth and visit the D-Day Museum, which tells the story of the D-Day Landings in WWII and features the magnificent Overlord Embroidery - a tribute to the heroism of those who took part in the operation. We will also explore Historic Portsmouth Harbour, home to the *HMS Victory* - the Royal Navy's most famous warship, and *The* Mary Rose - flagship of the English Tudor navy of King Henry VIII.

Day 5: Channel Crossing / Port en Bessin. We take the ferry to the port of Caen, Normandy, to visit the Pegasus Bridge where the 6th British Airborne landed, captured and liberated the first house in Europe, the Café Gondree. After our visit of the museum here we will proceed to our hotel for our first dinner in France.

Day 6: Courseulles-Sur-Mer / Juno Beach / Port en Bessin. We begin at the Canadian Memorial Garden in the Abbaye d'Ardenne, and la Verrieres Ridge to view the area where the "Black Watch" suffered many casualties during "Operation Spring". Then we visit the Juno Beach Center, dedicated to the 3rd Division landings as well as Canada's full involvement during World War II. Afterward, we will visit Queens Own Rifles House on the beach of Bernièressur-Mer and the Canadian Military Cemetery at Beny-sur-Mer.

Day 7: Arromanches / Pointe du Hoc / Omaha Beach / Port en **Bessin.** We continue our focus on the Normandy Invasion with a visit to Pointe du Hoc, where the cratered landscape caused by the German battery can be observed. Then we see Omaha Beach and the American Military Cemetery to discover the harsh difficulties in landing on the beach. This will be followed by a visit of the German battery at Longues-sur-Mer, which is still relatively intact. Later we visit the Disembarkation Museum and Mulberry Harbour in Arromanches before returning to our hotel.

Day 8: Dieppe / Arras. We travel to the coastal town of Dieppe to visit the Dieppe Canadian Cemetery, before travelling to Green Beach at Pourville to view the Red and White landing beaches on the Dieppe seafront, as well as the Canadian Memorial Museum. Later at the Blue Beach in Puys we view the gun emplacements on the cliff tops which were responsible for the terrible Canadian casualties. Then we travel to Arras for a 3-night stay.

Day 9: Albert / Beaumont Hamel / Arras. Our focus switches to WWI as we explore the Somme, starting in Albert and the Musee

des Arbris. Then we visit the Somme Battlefields, the Memorial to the Missing at Thiepval, and one of the only intact First World War monuments - the memorial park at Beaumont Hamel. The park (maintained by Canada) remains as it was during the Battle of the Somme, and is dedicated to the Royal Newfoundland and Labrador Regiment which lost many men on that first day of battle.

Day 10: Vimy Ridge / Arras. We travel the short distance to Vimy Ridge. It was on Hill 145, in April 1917, that Canada truly became a nation in the eyes of the world. Canadian troops stormed the ridge after all other allied forces failed to do so. We will tour the tunnels, trenches and memorial, as well as the interpretation center. This afternoon we tour the Wellington Tunnels, used by the Allies to support the Western Front close to the town. There will be free time to explore Arras, Place des Heroes as well as the Belfroi.

Day 11: Lens / Ypres. We travel to Lens and the new Hill 70 Memorial, dedicated to commemorate one of Canada's major victories on the Western Front after the victory at Vimy. We then proceed to Ypres, where we visit the "In Flanders Fields" Museum.

Day 12. Flanders Fields / Ypres. This morning we'll orient ourselves with the Ypres Salient Battlefields with a visit to Essex Farm, where John McCrae wrote the famous poem "In Flanders Fields". Then we visit the German cemetery of Langemark - resting place of over 44,000 young Germans (many 'student volunteers'). We continue on to Vancouver's Corner to see the haunting memorial of the Brooding Soldier at Saint Juliaan. This afternoon an optional tour to Dunkirk will be offered. This evening you can witness the Last Post Ceremony at the Menin Gate, which records over 54,384 names of missing troops during the leper salient battles.

Day 13: Passchendaele / Ypres. We begin with a visit to the Canadian Memorial at Crest Farm, the objective of the 1st Canadian Corps on Passchendaele Ridge. Next we visit the largest Commonwealth Cemetery at Tyne Cot, where the Canadians first began the Third Battle of Ypres to take Passchendaele. The Passchendaele Museum features an actual battle ground with trenches and German defenses. We continue to Hill 62 to view a well preserved area which was part of the original Canadian Front Line (also known as Sanctuary Wood). We finish with some free time in Ypres to relax or to buy excellent Belgian chocolate.

Day 14: Paris. We travel to Paris, and we'll have some free time to stroll in the quaint quarter of our centrally located hotel before checking in. Tonight's dinner will be at a charming restaurant followed by a cruise along the Seine River.

Day 15: Paris. On our city tour of Paris we will see the Eiffel Tower, Place de la Concorde, the Louvre, l'Arc de Triomphe, Les Champs Elysées, Notre-Dame Cathedral, St-Germain des Prés and more! The afternoon is free in Paris, and this evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Home. A warm farewell to our new friends as we fly home.

Itinerary for London, Paris and Amsterdam

Day 1: Departure. We depart with Air Canada for London.

Day 2: London. Upon arrival in London we transfer to our centrally located hotel. The balance of the day is at leisure until this evening's Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: London City Tour. Today's full-day tour will be by both coach and walking to take in the major highlights: Big Ben, Houses of Parliament, Piccadilly Circus, Trafalgar Square, St. Paul's Cathedral, Tower Bridge, the Changing of the Guard at Buckingham Palace, along with visits to the impressive gothic Westminster Abbey (the traditional place of coronation and burial site for English monarchs) as well as to the Canadian Memorial (unveiled by the Queen in remembrance of the one million Canadians who served with British forces during the two World Wars).

Day 4: Oxford and the Cotswolds. We travel first into the green countryside and visit "The Cotswolds" - an area of many small old towns and villages with honey coloured cottages and dry stone walls nestling in the valleys and wooded hillsides. We will stop at one or two of the villages to explore. Then we will visit the university town of Oxford which for over 900 years has been home to royalty and scholars. A walking tour takes us past several of the 30 colleges and their picture-perfect courtyards. If possible we will tour one of them. A pub lunch is included today.

Day 5: London at Leisure / Theatre. A day at leisure to visit, or revisit, your favourite attractions in "Everybody's Favourite City". This evening enjoy a show in London's West End - your choice from 2 top performances!

Day 6: Paris via Eurostar! Cheerio to London and Bonjour Paris, as we whiz through the Channel tunnel at 320 km/h on the high speed Eurostar train! In just over two hours we will be in central Paris. We will have some time to relax before our dinner at a charming bistro.

Day 7: Paris. Our city tour begins with a visit of the Eiffel Tower. We will ascend the tower by elevator and take in the panoramic view of the city. We continue our tour and see the Champs Elysees, Arc de Triomphe, Place de la Concord, the Opera and Notre Dame Cathedral. Then we ascend to the beautiful and historic Montmartre area and visit the Sacre Coeur for wonderful views of Paris. Day 8: Countryside Tour to Giverny and Monet's Garden. Today we leave the city to visit Giverny, where the Impressionist artist Monet lived and created a stunning garden of symmetry and colour. Monet mixed the simplest flowers (daisies and poppies) with the rarest varieties. This is where he painted the 'Japanese Bridge', and the delicate 'Water Lilies' which have been forever immortalized in his incredible works!

Day 9: Paris at Leisure / Seine Cruise. At leisure to perhaps visit the Louvre, Versailles Palace by local train, take a full day excursion to Vimy Ridge or just stroll along the Champs-Élysées, sit at a cafe and people watch. Or take the "Red Light District" tour (beyond its salacious reputation the De Wallen area has some of the city's prettiest canals and winding cobblestone streets rich with fascinating stories of the city's character). Or do like the locals and ride a bike to explore the city! Our evening is complete with our Farewell Canal Dinner Cruise!

Day 14: Home. We fly home with Air Canada.

Renowned for its wonderful climate, charming towns and villages, world-renowned gastronomic traditions, unique landscapes and rich history, it is no wonder that Provence is one of France's top destinations, especially in the autumn harvest season, when the vineyards become a fabulous blaze of gold, bronze and red.

Our home base (10 nights) will be Avignon, located in the heart of Provence. This beautiful city has magnificent 18th century architecture, shaded squares, narrow streets named after ancient trades (bonnetterie, teinturier, infirmière etc.), gardens along the Rhône River, weekly and daily food markets, boutiques and museums. The city is also a lively art and cultural center, and boasts a fine transport system with regular routes to surrounding towns.

We will stay at the 4-star *Mercure Pont d'Avignon,* located within the old city walls in a quiet area - an easy walk to restaurants, shopping streets and main attractions. Hotel facilities include a bar, lounge, garden and free WiFi.

We conclude our tour with 2 nights in the multicultural city of Marseille with its rich maritime history, vibrant old port, quaint neighbourhoods, impressive esplanade and breathtaking views over the Mediterranean Sea.

Itinerary for Autumn in Provence

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Marseille via Paris.

Day 2: Avignon. We arrive in Marseille and transfer to Avignon. The rest of the day is free until our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Avignon Walking Tour. We begin our tour at Les Galles - Avignon's quaint food market, where a local chef will offer a cooking demonstration and tasting of Provencal specialities. Then our walking tour will show us the highlights of Avignon; the Pont D'Avignon, the lively "Place de L'Horloge" and the pedestrian streets. We conclude with a visit of the Palace of the Popes - an imposing Gothic structure where several popes resided in the middle ages.

Day 4: At Leisure in Avignon. A free day to explore the town. its quaint streets, museums and vibrant markets.

Day 5: Arles / Camargue. We begin with a visit of Arles. once Julius Caesar's capital of Gaul. Here we follow in the footsteps of Van Gogh to the sites immortalized in his many paintings. We will see the remarkable Roman and typical Provencal architecture. We then travel to Camargue -anational wildlife reserve of exceptional beauty. See the immense plain of marshes and lagoons - refuge to over 300 species of birds (including pink flamingos). We will enjoy a special lunch at a typical "Manade" specializing in the breeding of bulls, with "cowboys" working with the famous Camargue Horses. We end the day with a visit of Carmargue's capital, Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer, a city of traditions superbly situated at the mouth of the Rhone River and Mediterranean Sea.

Day 6: Uzes / Pont Du Gard / Nimes. This full-day excursion begins with a walking tour of Uzes - the premier duchy of France. This dazzlingly beautiful commune has shaded boulevards, medieval streets and handsome houses. Then we discover the Pont du Gard, built in the 1st century AD - a technical and artistic masterpiece. We finish the day in Nîmes, which boasts some of the world's best preserved Roman monuments. We will visit the impressive amphitheater and Maison Carrée (square house) followed by some free time in the historic centre.

Day 7: At Leisure in Avignon.

Day 8: Luberon Villages. Scattered across the countryside are the wonderful villages of the Luberon - known as "the most beautiful villages of France". We see Rousillon, with its ochre landscape, Gordes - a hill top village with narrow alleys and passageways that wind between medieval

buildings, Bonnieux with its amazing view across the valley with its patchwork of orchards and vineyards, and Coustellet for a most interesting visit of the lavender museum.

Day 9: Vaison-La-Romaine / Mont Ventoux / Winery. First we visit Vaison-La-Romaine, a small Provencal town nestled in a valley. Once a prosperous Roman city, it is known today for its fabulous Provencal market - the largest in Provence! Next is the summit of Mont Ventoux for a breathtaking view of the Toulourenc Valley. We finish this amazing day with a visit of a local winery, enjoying a stroll through the grounds and a taste of the wonderful wines produced in this region.


Day 10: At Leisure in Avignon.

Day 11: Orange / Truffle Hunting / Savoury Lunch. We first visit Orange - the "Gateway to Southern France". Founded in 30 BC, Orange remains marked by the dynastic seal of William III of Orange, who became King of England in 1689. We will see the famous Triumphal Arch and visit the Roman theatre. Then we proceed through the countryside to meet a warm-hearted family and discover the mysteries of one of the world's most coveted culinary treasures - the truffle. These "Black Diamonds" are known for their subtle aroma and earthy flavour. A delicious lunch of finely prepared truffle dishes awaits following our "cavage" demonstration with the family dogs.

Day 12: Aix / Cassis / Marseille. We travel to Aix en Provence (fondly known as "X"). This is one of France's most popular cities, with its majestic public squares, shaded avenues, graceful fountains and elegant Baroque style buildings built with the distinctive Provencal yellow stone. On our walking tour we see the Cours Mirabeau and the market where locals shop for fresh produce and flowers. We then proceed to visit Cassis - a former fishing village and today a resort town picturesquely located in a niche on the Mediterranean Sea at the foot of steep cliffs. We end up in Marseille for a 2-night stay by the quaint old port.

Day 13: Marseille. Highlights of our Marseille city tour include the Esplanade J4, Promenade Laffond, Notre Dame de la Garde and a walking tour through the ancient Le Panier neighbourhood. The afternoon is free to visit one of the famous museums or go shopping in the stylish boutiques of the Republic Quarter. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 14: Home. Air France takes us home via Paris.

Any visit to France is a feast for the senses, as each region offers a diversity of scenery, architecture, culture, attractions and cuisine. This tour will take in the 3 most popular destinations in France, with plenty of sightseeing as well as time at leisure to explore on your own.

Paris - We begin with a 4-night stay in France's capital, with its rich history and endless incredible attractions and cultural events. In addition to our touring program there will be free time to visit one of Paris' famous museums or to enjoy a stroll in one of its quaint quarters.

Avignon - We then spend 5 nights in this picturesque Provencal walled city - the perfect base from which to explore Provence with its Roman and medieval heritage. sculpted buildings and sumptuous food markets. The legendary countryside here is dotted with vineyards and lavender fields, all beautifully bathed in a golden hue.

Itinerary for Southern France and Paris

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Paris.

Day 2: Paris. We arrive in Paris, and enjoy a short tour of the quaint quarter near our hotel, and free time for lunch. The rest of the day is free until this evening's Welcome Dinner at a charming Parisian Brasserie.

Day 3: Paris. Our full-day panoramic tour will show us the Arc de Triomphe, the Eiffel Tower, the Opera, the "Left Bank", Notre Dame Cathedral, Champs Elysees, Montmartre and much more.

Day 7: St-Remy / Les Baux / Arles. This full-day tour in the heart of Provence begins in the pretty village of St-Remy-de-Provence, with its Roman vestiges and weekly Provencal market. Next is Les Baux-de-Provence, magnificently situated amidst incredible rock formations. Here we will enjoy an outstanding audio-visual show which will totally immerse us in the images. Finally we proceed to Arles - a city of art and culture. On our walking tour of Arles we see the charming old town, Van Gogh's famous "café de la nuit" and visit the Roman coliseum and theatre. There will be free time before returning to Avignon.

Day 8: Avignon. At leisure to enjoy Avignon's pleasant streets and interesting museums, or perhaps visit nearby Aix-en-Provence.

Day 9: Luberon Villages. We travel to the Luberon and discover, scattered across the countryside, the wonderful villages classified as "the most beautiful villages of France". See Gordes - a hill top village with narrow alleys and passageways that wind between medieval buildings, Bonnieux - a typical Provencal market town, Rousillon with its ochre landscape and Coustellet for a most interesting visit of the lavender museum.

Day 10: Pont Du Gard / Rhone Valley. This morning we discover the famous Pont Du Gard. Built by the Romans, it was a technical and artistic masterpiece ahead of its time. Then we travel through the countryside and vineyards to Châteauneuf-du-Pape for a vineyard visit and tasting. We return to Avignon for an afternoon at leisure.


Day 11: St-Tropez / Cote D'Azur / Nice. Today we travel to the French Riviera with a stop in quaint St-Tropez enroute. This one time fishing village has become a fashionable resort frequented by writers, artists and celebrities. After some time on our own to stroll the charming old town and lively harbour we continue our journey along the Cote d'Azur to the elegant city of Nice.

Day 12: Nice. Our city tour takes in the Promenade des Anglais, Cimiez Quarter and Convent Gardens. We will also see Nice's old town with its flower market, City Hall and pedestrian streets lined with shops and cafes. Afternoon at leisure.

In Bordeaux we will discover incredible architecture, fine cuisine and vibrant culture. We will also explore the delightful vineyards of St. Emilion and Medoc, and the stunning lagoon and sand dunes of Arcachon Bay. In Lourdes (in the picturesque Pyrenees Mountains), we'll visit the famous sanctuary. Then in spectacular Pyrenees National Park we'll see the majestic peaks, deep valleys, charming villages and the wonder of Gavarnie - an incredible amphitheater surrounded by 16 summits of over 3000 metres high! We'll enjoy a walking tour in Bayonne, one of southern France's prettiest towns, en route to Biarritz - the resort town of royalty. While here, we'll explore lively fishing villages and traditional Basque farms. Our final base is Bilbao, home of the iconic Guggenheim Museum - the symbol of the city. Bilbao has lovely riverside walking paths and pedestrian-friendly streets with endless shops, bars and restaurants. In this region we'll discover chic San Sebastian, the famous iron "hanging bridge" over the Nervion River, and the Magdalena Palace on its rocky peninsula. All along the

Itinerary for Bordeaux to Bilbao, and the Pyrenees

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Bordeaux, via Paris.

Day 2: Bordeaux. We arrive in Bordeaux and enjoy a small drive to familiarize ourselves with this elegant city and enjoy a typical bistro lunch. Then we'll proceed to our centrally located hotel. The rest of the day is free until our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Bordeaux. We explore Bordeaux with its gorgeous neoclassical architecture, tree-lined avenues, charming old quarters with their sculpted mascarons (faces) and the revitalized quarters along the Garonne River. There will be free time for lunch and to further explore the narrow streets of the old town or stroll along the lively quaysides. This afternoon we visit "The City of Wine" - an interactive exhibition and feast for the senses located in an architectural marvel.

Day 4: St. Emilion / Medoc / Bordeaux. We first explore the gorgeous streets and monuments of the medieval village of St-Emilion. Then we visit a renowned winery and taste some delicious Saint Emilion wines, with some free time to explore. Afterwards we head to the mythic "Route des Châteaux" with its unique concentration of worldrenowned properties, and taste the famous Margaux wine in Medoc.

Day 5: Arcachon Bay / Bordeaux. We head to beautiful Arcachon Bay, site of the Dunes of "Pilat" - the biggest sand dunes in Europe, and we'll enjoy a leisurely cruise on the bay. Since the bay is also the home of the traditional culture of oysters, we'll stop in the quaint port of Larros in Gujan-Mestras at a local producer to taste some oysters with a glass of local white wine while overlooking the bay!

Day 6: Lourdes. We travel into the Pyrenees and the town of Lourdes, famous for its sanctuary visited by millions of people from around the world each year. This afternoon we'll visit the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes, a place of beauty and serenity. Every evening here thousands of pilgrims join an impressive torchlight procession.

Day 7: Pyrenees National Park / Cauterets / Lourdes. We enter the picturesque Haute-Pyrenees region and proceed to the Pont d'Espagne - gateway to Pyrenees National Park (France's oldest National Park). The park contains 6 high valleys that border Spain and boasts exceptional biodiversity. We'll enjoy a trail walk to take in the beauty of the rushing streams, waterfalls and ancient pine forest. Then we visit Cauterets - a charming and lively mountain village famous for its thermal baths, ski resorts and delicious "Berlingots" sweet. We conclude with the Unesco World Heritage Site of Gavarnie where we'll see a spectacular natural amphitheater created by glacial erosion, topped by 16 summits of over 3000 meters!

Day 8: Bayonne / Biarritz. We head for the Basque Coast and stop in the fortified town of Bayonne - an official "Town of History and Art" for its 2000-year -old heritage. The town also boasts many gourmet traditions that reflect both its Basque and Gascon influences. On our walking tour we'll see the Gothic cathedral, the old town restoration, the ramparts, the cloister, Château-Vieux, the lively pedestrian streets and food market. We continue to Biarritz for a 3-night stay.

Day 9: Biarritz. 19th century Biarritz was an aristocratic capital, thanks to Napoleon III who built for his wife a magnificent palace by the ocean. On our tour we'll see the lighthouse which offers breathtaking views, the "Chambre d'Amour" (Love Chamber), the fisherman's wharf, the "Rocher de la Vierge (Virgin Rock) and the city center with its market square, cafes and boutiques. The afternoon is free to enjoy the wonderful ocean vistas or to relax in one of the world-renowned Thalassotherapy centres in town.

Day 10: Basque Villages / St. Jean de Luz / Biarritz. Today we explore the Basque Mountains with their green hills strewn with typical farms and villages with whitewashed walls and timbered houses. See the villages of Ainhoa and Espelette, known for the paprika that hangs on the house facades, so we'll enjoy a tasting of this paprika acclaimed by chefs worldwide. We continue to St Jean de Luz - a town of sailors and famous travellers. The fishing port here is still active, and the old town is full of "labourdine" architecture steeped in history. On our walking tour we'll see the house of Louis XIV, the Maison de l'Infante, the Church of St. John the Baptist and walk along the Bay.

Day 11: San Sebastian / Albaola / Bilbao. En route to Bilbao we visit the Maritimes Heritage Museum in Albaola to learn about the Basque whalers and fishermen. Then we proceed to the chic town of San Sebastian - once the meeting place of kings and aristocracy, and a popular place in which to stroll along the wonderful seaside promenade with its elegant buildings. We will take the funicular up the cliff for spectacular panoramic views of the bay, ocean and surrounding islands. After a walking tour of the old town there will be free time to stroll in the maze of the old streets. We continue to Bilbao where we'll stay for the remaining 4 nights of our tour.

Day 12: Guggenheim Museum / Bilbao. On our Old Quarter tour we'll see the Church of San Nicolas (patron saint of sailors), Santiago Cathedral, the Teatro Arriaga, the Mercado de la Ribera (the largest covered market in Europe) and the Plaza Nueva, built in neoclassical style. We then visit the famous Guggenheim Museum, to marvel at the building itself and enjoy the masterpieces of modern and contemporary art housed within. The afternoon is free to spend more time at the museum and further explore the city.

Day 13: Santander / Bilbao. We head to beautiful Santander, known for its "Palacio de la Magdalena" - once the royal summer residence situated at the mouth of the Bay of Santander on the rocky La Magdalena Peninsula. We'll enjoy a leisurely tour of this pretty town and some free time for lunch and a stroll on the charming "Paseo de Pereda" promenade with the historic "Jardines de Pereda" gardens.

Day 14: Nervion River / Gexto / Bilbao. We begin with a visit of the Maritime Museum in Bilbao, followed by a boat trip along the Nervion River to the marina of Getxo. See the famous iron "hanging bridge" an architectural wonder and the world's first bridge to carry people and traffic on a high suspended gondola. Then we'll enjoy a walk in the fishing village of Algorta before returning to Bilbao where we'll have a taste of some local drinks and "pintxos" in a typical Gastrobar - a wonderful way to bid farewell to our fellow travellers and Bilbao!

Day 15: Home. We fly home, via Paris.



This unique tour begins in Switzerland, whose very name conjures up images of snow-capped mountains, majestic peaks reflected in glassy lakes and a countryside filled with picture-book villages and crystal clear air.

The moment we arrive in Zurich, the breathtaking Alps emerge as we travel through the picturesque countryside to the beautiful lakeside town of Lucerne for a 2-night stay.

After our stay in Lucerne we proceed, via touring in Bern and Interlaken, to the welcoming mountain resort town of Villars-sur-Ollon (also known as Villars) for a 5-night stay. We will experience the utmost in Alpine splendour at this traditional resort which is beautifully situated in the heart of the Vaudoise Alps, in view of the peaks of the Dents du Midi and the chain of Mont Blanc, with a sweeping view of the Rhone Valley. While the town has a busy little downtown area, it still retains a sense of coziness and tradition in the true Swiss sense. Villars will be our base for visiting the surrounding region with visits to Montreux, Gruyeres, Vevey, L'Etivaz and Zermatt - home of the mighty Matterhorn!

Next, we traverse the Simplon Pass into Italy for a 7-night stay at Lake Maggiore's most beautiful resort town - Stresa. Bursting with flowers, sprinkled with fine old villas and famous for its lush gardens and mild climate, Stresa has been a holiday resort since the 19th century. On our non-touring days you can enjoy people-watching in the lovely town square, or take the cable car to the top of Monte Mottarone for famous views of distant snowy peaks and all 7 of the major Italian lakes. This idyllic spot is an ideal base for touring the beautiful Italian Lakes area, including the lively city of Milan. This will be a perfect opportunity to experience la vera Italia (the real Italy).

Itinerary for Swiss Alps and Italian Lakes

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Zurich, non-stop from Toronto.

Day 2: Zurich / Lake Lucerne. We arrive in Zurich, then proceed to Vitznau where we board a boat and enjoy our first views of the breathtaking Swiss Alps while cruising on Lake Lucerne to our hotel. Tonight we enjoy our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Lucerne. On this morning's walking tour we'll stroll along Lake Lucerne and through the city's Old Town, seeing the Hofkirche Church, the Old Town Hall, Chapel Bridge (the symbol of Lucerne) and the world famous Lion Monument carved in relief into a sandstone cliff. Afternoon at leisure to explore this beautiful city on your own, or to shop for a Swiss watch or chocolate.

Day 4: Interlaken / Bern / Villars. This full-day tour begins in Interlaken, the main tourist centre of the Bernese Oberland. The town lies between two lakes amid the towering Alps, and so views from the town are spectacular. We will see typical Swiss architecture, several 16th century churches and palatial hotels. We then travel to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Bern. We'll stroll in the old town and see the Zeitglockentrum clock tower, Munster Cathedral, the Bear Pits and the historical fountains for which the town is known. We continue on to Villars for a 5-night stay.

Day 5: Montreux / Chateau Chillon / Vevey / Gruyere. We take a tour to Montreaux – naturally beautiful and one of Lake Geneva's most popular resorts. The nearby Chillon Castle is built on a rocky islet and has towers that reflect on the lake - very picturesque! The turrets offer fantastic views of Montreux, the lake and the Alps. The castle and its dungeons have been used as a prison over the years (Lord Byron wrote The Prisoner of Chillon here, and carved his name in one of the cells). After our castle visit we proceed to the fortified hilltop town of Gruyere in time for lunch and some time to stroll. We visit a cheese factory to learn about the traditional method for making cheese. A cellar visit with wine tasting is included.

Day 6: Zermatt. We board a train for the short ride to Zermatt - a village that lies at the foot of the Matterhorn. This is one of the most photographed mountains in the world, and has been visited by mountaineers from all around the world for centuries! We will tour the historic part of the village and enjoy some leisure time to stroll or to enjoy an optional ride on the cog wheel tram for a better view of the famous mountain.

Days 7 & 8: Villars. At leisure. Your Tour Manager will offer suggestions. There are many walking trails in and around the town, or opt for a train ride through the Alps.

Day 9: Stresa. We traverse the Simplon pass into Italy - a wonderful scenic day. We proceed to Stresa on the shore of Lake Maggiore for a 7-night stay.

Day 10: Stresa. We take a boat trip to Isola Bella to see the magnificent 16th century palace and gardens, built as a wedding gift. The garden features statues, fountains and terraces where peacocks roam among the scented shrubs.

Day 11: Locarno. Today's full day excursion takes us on one of Europe's most scenic railways — the narrow gauge Centovalli Railway – which threads its way across "a hundred valleys", past sleepy villages and over deep ravines. Upon arrival in Locarno we take an orientation tour of the town and then enjoy some free time. Explore the picturesque Old Town, see the beautiful subtropical gardens filled with palm trees and exotic flowers, stroll the lakeside promenades and enjoy the excellent shopping under the arcades of the Piazza Grande. Later we cruise back down the lake to Stresa.

Day 12: Stresa. A day to explore this town and appreciate the beautiful panoramic setting. Relax and enjoy a cappucino at one of the lakeside cafes and observe the local lifestyle and magnificent scenery.

Day 13: Lake Como Area. A very scenic day as we travel to Lake Como and the area around it - adorned with ancient villages, exquisite villas and beautiful gardens. Our first visit will be to the "the Pearl of Lake Como" - the town of Bellagio, and then the town of Como, Our walking tour of these beguiling towns will take us along cobbled lanes lined with elegant buildings exuding Old World elegance, and through the gardens of one of the many local Villas.

Day 14: Milan. We visit this very modern city, which also boasts the third largest Gothic Cathedral in the world. We see the Galleria, which was the first indoor shopping mall in Europe - a beautiful, elegant area built in the 19th century. This is the place to have a coffee, people watch and shop.

Day 15: Stresa. At leisure in Stresa, an ideal town for strolling. The walking trails around the lake are lovely, as is the shopping! Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Home. We transfer to the Milan airport for our flight back to Canada.



This unique rail tour will transport us through some of the most majestic and stunning panoramic routes in the world!

There is no better way to experience Switzerland than by rail. Relax onboard and gaze through the large picture windows as our train climbs and winds its way through the Alps. Sometimes we will ascend to dizzying heights which offer some of the most spectacular views on earth, consisting of crystal clear mountain lakes nestled in pristine wilderness set against towering mountain ranges, and lakeside towns and picture-perfect villages dotting the landscape. To experience this from the comfort of a modern train is truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

- Bernina Express This UNESCO Heritage line from St. Moritz to Tirano passes over an incredible 196 bridges!

- **Panoramic Express** (part of the *Golden Pass Line*) From Lucerne we travel through Interlaken to Montreux, passing lakes, pastures, waterfalls and quaint chalets trimmed with flowerboxes, all nestled in picturesque valleys surrounded by jagged, snow-topped peaks. This is the quintessential Swiss experience.
- Glacier Express Perhaps the most popular route.
 Beginning in Zermatt and ending in St. Moritz, it takes us through mountain landscapes (including the mighty Matterhorn), deep gorges, 91 tunnels and across 291 bridges. The highest point of the trip is crossing the Oberalp Pass over 6600 feet above sea level!
- Mount Pilatus Panoramic gondolas take us to the summit to view 73 mountain peaks of Central Switzerland.

Itinerary for Swiss Rail Tour

Day 1: Departure. We board our direct flight for Zurich.

Day 2: Zurich / Lucerne. We arrive in Zurich and transfer to the town of Vitznau, situated on Lake Lucerne. From here we enjoy breathtaking views of the lake and surrounding mountains as we cruise to our hotel in Lucerne - our home for the next 3 nights. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Lucerne. A guided walking tour takes us through the city's Old Town. We'll see the Hofkirche Church, wooden covered Chapel Bridge (the symbol of Lucerne) and the famous Lion Monument (carved into a sandstone cliff), followed by a visit of the interactive Swiss Museum of Transport. After some time at leisure to explore this beautiful city on our own, we'll enjoy a wonderful Swiss dinner.

Day 4: Mount Pilatus / Lucerne. We board an aerial cableway and panoramic gondola, to reach the summit of Mount Pilatus. Known as the "Dragon Ride", the cockpit-like cabin of the gondola has windows extending to the floor and provides breathtaking views in every direction.

Day 5: Golden Pass Train / Brienz / Panoramic Express / Interlaken. Our scenic train ride on the Golden Pass Line and the *Panoramic Express* train takes us via the Bruenig Pass to Interlaken through the heart of the Swiss Alps. Our first stop is Brienz, set in the midst of towering mountains, for some free time. Then we cruise along the turquoise-coloured Lake Brienz to Interlaken, where we'll board a steam mountain railway that whisks us up 5000 feet for fabulous views of the deep blue lakes below and snow-capped mountains in the distance. including one of Europe's highest mountains — the Jungfrau!

Day 6: Jungfrau Railway / Interlaken. We board the Jungfrau Railway and cable car to Kleine Scheidegg - home to Europe's highest mountain, Jungfraujoch. We first take the *Bernese* Oberland Railway to Grindelwald, where we'll board the brand new Eiger Express, (a tri-cable aerial cableway) and ascend in just 15 minutes. This state-of-the-art cabin takes us very close to the north face of the Eiger at 1800 metres, so the views are breathtaking. To descend, we take a combination of the Wengeralp and Bernese Oberland Railway to return to Interlaken.

Day 7: Golden Pass / Montreux. The elegant Golden Train takes us from Interlaken to the shores of Lake Geneva. We'll travel along Lake Thun and through the scenic Simme Valley to Zweisimmen, where we board the Golden Pass Panoramic to Montreux. We arrive in Montreux for a 2-night stay on the chic, palm-studded Swiss Riviera.

Day 8: Chillon Castle / Montreux. Our walking tour will include a visit of Chateaux Chillon, Located on a rock on the banks of Lake Geneva, this water-castle is Switzerland's most visited historic building. For 400 years it was the residence of the Counts of Savoy, as well as where Lord Byron was imprisoned when he wrote "The Prisoner of Chillon". Be sure to look for his name carved into his cell wall! Afternoon at leisure. You may want to visit the museum dedicated to the rock group Queen (where many recordings were done) and see the Freddy Mercury statue on the promenade!

Day 9: Chocolate Train / La Gruyere / Broc / Visp (Zermatt). We board the stunning *Belle Époque* Coaches to experience the Chocolate Train en route to La Gruyere, where we will have some free time and enjoy a typical fondue lunch at a local chalet! Then we continue to Broc, home to the famous chocolate factory - Cailler, where we'll learn about chocolate production and taste some of the finest offerings. Later we'll proceed by train to the pretty town of Visp, in the Zermatt area (known as the 'Sun Terrace of Switzerland'), for a 2-night stay.

Day 10: Zermatt / Visp. A short train ride takes us to Zermatt for a casual walking tour of this quaint village, with the rest of the day at leisure. The air here is clear and clean because only electric cars are allowed to operate in the village. You may wish to climb to Gornergrat on Europe's highest open air cogwheel train. The train crosses impressive bridges and goes through tunnels with views of the majestic Matterhorn the most photographed mountain in the world.

Day 11: Glacier Express Train / Chur. We travel aboard The Glacier Express (perhaps the most famous railway in the world) to Chur. The train meanders through untouched pristine mountain landscapes, deep gorges, breathtaking valleys, through 91 tunnels and across 291 impressive bridges!

Day 12: Bernina Express / St. Moritz / Chur. We board the Bernina Express for a truly spectacular rail journey. This 100-year-old heritage line has earned UNESCO World Heritage status for its ingenious engineering and the striking beauty of the scenery it winds through. Travelling past craggy mountain peaks and cascading waterfalls we make our way to Poschiavo, then before returning to Chur we stop in St. Moritz.

Day 13: Zurich. Our scenic train ride to Zurich passes by snowcapped mountains and sparkling lakes. Upon arrival we enjoy a guided walking tour of this beautiful lakeside city. followed by our Farewell Dinner.

Day 14: Home. We board our direct flight back to Canada.

Sicily was once a Greek colony, a Roman province, an Arab emirate and a Norman kingdom, so today we can enjoy exploring this eclectic history. With a diversified landscape of orange and lemon orchards, lush forests, ancient olive groves, rugged shorelines and crystal blue waters, there is no other place on earth quite like this Mediterranean gem.

After our stay in Sicily we take a flight to Malta. Blessed with a warm, sunny climate year round, friendly people and 7,000 years of intriguing history, Malta is a wonderful vacation destination. The diverse nationalities that have occupied Malta over the centuries have blended to result in a fascinating culture. The narrow meandering streets of the towns and villages are crowded with Renaissance

cathedrals and Baroque palaces, and the countryside is dotted with some of the oldest known human structures in the world, which is why Malta has often been described as an open-air museum.

In Malta we stay at the First Class *Dolmen Hotel*, located right on the promenade overlooking the Bay of St. Paul. The small town of Buggiba is just a few minutes walk from the hotel and offers a variety of shops, cafes, bars and restaurants. Features of the hotel include restaurants, bar, casino, comfortable lounges, indoor and outdoor swimming pools, sauna, exercise classes and live music on most nights. The comfortable guestrooms have a seaview and are contemporary in design.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Palermo, Sicily with a change of planes in Munich.

shopping in the Piazza Duomo. Later we fly to Malta and upon arrival transfer to our hotel situated on the picturesque Bay of St. Paul's, for a 7-night stay in seaview rooms!

Day 9: Bay of St. Paul / Harbour Cruise. Morning at leisure. In the afternoon we will have a welcome orientation followed by a delightful harbour cruise.

Day 10: Valletta. Our city tour of Malta's capital, Valetta will include the Upper Barracca Gardens, St. John's Cathedral, the Grand Master's Palace and a film viewing of "The Malta Experience". Day 13: Mdina. Our morning excursion to Mdina, Malta's old capital city, includes a visit to the Cathedral and the catacombs in Rabat. We finish at Ta' Qali Crafts Village where you can admire the local artisans at work and find some souvenirs.

Day 14: Bay of St. Paul. A free day to enjoy a stroll along the harbour, visit St. Julian's, see the countryside or try your luck at Sliema's popular casino. This evening will be our Farewell Dinner.

On this outstanding tour we will visit historic cities, fairytale medieval villages, Gothic castles and famous monuments in three of Europe's oldest countries.

We begin in the Golden City of Prague - the ancient capital of Bohemia and the best-preserved Baroque city in Central Europe. Built on seven hills and spanning the Vltava River, the city is small enough for a good walker to see most of the major sights, including its beautifully preserved Old Town, massive castle, statue-lined bridge, famous city squares and evocative Jewish Quarter, while enjoying the city's love of music and perhaps the best beer in Europe. In the Czech Republic we'll also visit the UNESCO World Heritage City of Cesky Krumlov - a fairy-tale town with Renaissance and Baroque architecture.

Next is Vienna - one of Europe's most elegant and historic cities. Vienna boasts opulent buildings, impressive museums and the musical traditions of its famous Opera, Choirs and Orchestras. Vienna's cultural legacy was shaped by its residents like Mozart, Beethoven, Gustave Klimt and Sigmund Freud. Of course the elegant shops that line the great avenues add to its captivating charm.

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We finish off in Hungary's architecturally stunning capital - Budapest. With over 1000 years of history, Budapest today is perhaps the most exciting commercial, cultural and entertainment centre in Eastern Europe. Majestic bridges span across the Danube River joining "Buda's" medieval grandeur with "Pest's" magnificent 19th century buildings, grand boulevards, beautiful Opera house as well as Europe's oldest and 2nd largest Parliament building. The city is abundant with lively pedestrian streets, squares and cafes and boasts numerous museums, art galleries and Spas — earning its moniker of "Spa City". While in Budapest, we will stay in a lovely Spa hotel!

Itinerary for Magic of Eastern Europe

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Prague, via Paris

Day 2: Prague. We arrive in Prague and transfer to our centrally located hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Prague. Our coach and walking tour will show us the stunning sights of the Hradcany Castle district, with a visit to the majestic St. Vitus Cathedral, the Loretto Chapel and "The Golden Lane" - named after the goldsmiths who lived here in the 17th century. Some of the alchemists attempted to turn metal into gold here!

Day 4: Prague. We continue our guided walking tour with a stroll across the Charles Bridge to Lesser Town's winding narrow streets, where we see the artisan houses, small 17th century palaces, the Jewish Ghetto and the famous astronomical clock. We will enjoy a 1-hour river cruise through the historic district, then an afternoon at leisure.

Day 5: Prague. At leisure in the Golden City. Prague is a very pleasant and lively city in which to stroll, so you may want to revisit Little Town and some of the quaint shops (best buys are crystal and garnet jewelry). Enjoy a coffee (and people watching) in Old Town Square. After dinner, why not visit one of the local pubs to enjoy the famous dark ales brewed here.

Day 6: Cesky Krumlov / Vienna. We depart Prague and drive to the UNESCO World Heritage city of Cesky Krumlov. This picture postcard, beautiful fortified medieval town is surrounded by unspoiled countryside. Our walking tour will take us through the historic centre of narrow cobblestone streets winding along romantic nooks abundant with lively shops, cafes, and museums. Lunch is included. After our tour we will proceed to Vienna for a 4-night stay.

Day 7: Vienna. Our city tour of Vienna captures the true elegance and magnificence of the "Ringstrasse" lined with palatial and extravagant buildings like the Opera House, Hofburg and more, built when Vienna was the capital of the Austro-Hungarian empire. We visit the Schonbrunn Palace with its 440 rooms and lavish interiors. It is here in the Grand Gallery that Mozart gave his first royal concert. This evening we will dine at the Palace followed by a concert performance of the works of Mozart and Strauss in the Palace Orangery.

Day 8: Vienna. Our tour of the lovely Vienna Woods includes visits of the 12th century Cistercian Abbey and the former Imperial hunting lodge at Mayerling. Before returning to Vienna we enjoy a special dinner with musical entertainment and wine at one of Vienna's famous wine villages.

Day 9: Vienna. A day of leisure. The city planning of "The Ringstrasse" makes it easy for exploring. You may want to visit the Spanish Riding School to catch a Lipizzaner horses training session, or maybe venture to the countryside blanketed with vineyards and quaint villages including the opulent Melk Abbey. Vienna is known for its coffee culture, so stop to enjoy coffee and a taste of Sacher Torte!


Day 10: Bratislava / Gyor / Budapest. En route to Budapest we stop in two charming cities: Bratislava (capital of Slovakia), and the old Hungarian city of Gyor - the "City of Waters". We will have walking tours of both cities, through their quaint pedestrian Old Town centres abundant with statues, old city squares and 18th century pastel-coloured buildings. Later we arrive at our spa hotel in Budapest.

Day 11: Budapest. Our city tour begins on the Pest side at the magnificent Heroes' Square - an epic display of the history of the Magyars! A drive down the Grand Boulevard takes us past the magnificent Opera House, the House of Parliaments, the Jewish Quarter (with the world's 2nd largest synagogue) and more. We'll stroll through the lively pedestrian streets to the "Great Market Hall" and enjoy an included "food tasting" lunch! Later we cross over to Buda to the top of Gellert Hill with its bird's eye view over the Danube River and city. We finish in the Castle District, home to the Royal Palace, where we visit the famous Mathias Church and Fisherman's Bastion. Tonight we enjoy a typical Hungarian dinner and folklore show.

Day 12: Danube Tour / Budapest. We drive along the Danube into Hungary's countryside and the Baroque, artisan village of Szentendre - an 18th century town with cobblestone streets, hidden alleys and colourful old houses. It is a perfect town in which to stroll and visit some of the many galleries and shops. A tour and tasting awaits us at the Marzipan Museum, featuring sculptures made of Marzipan! Lunch is included in Visegrad, a town with a 13th century fortified fortress that has housed many notorious visitors (and according to one legend, even "Dracula" was imprisoned in its tower!)



Itinerary for Croatia and Slovenia

- Day 1: Departure. We depart with British Airways for Dubrovnik, via London.
- Day 2: Dubrovnik (Croatia). We arrive in Dubrovnik and transfer to our hotel. The remainder of the day is at leisure until our Welcome Dinner this evening.
- Day 3: Dubrovnik. Our city tour of Dubrovnik shows us the city walls and fortifications, the Rector's Palace, set-piece churches and public buildings that blend seamlessly with green-shuttered stone houses, and Europe's oldest apothecary in the Franciscan Monastery. Later we travel by coach to the region of Konavle with a stop at the little mountain village of Gruda to see the mills and enjoy a tasting of local ham, cheese and grappa.
- Day 4: Dubrovnik. At leisure to return to the old city or take a boat ride along the coast. An optional tour will be offered to Montenegro.
- Day 5: Ston / Mostar. We travel to Mostar, en route visiting the village of Ston with its impressive series of defensive walls which once surrounded and protected the city. Upon arrival in Mostar a guided tour of the city will show us the beautiful old town, the famous old bridge and the Turkish section, including a visit of a Turkish home and the Mosque.
- Day 6: Split. We head back to the coast and enjoy a scenic drive to the energetic town of Split, the second-largest city in Croatia with the perfect balance of tradition and modernity.
- Day 7: Split. Our tour of Split features the historic inner city - the biggest in Dalmatia, built around a Roman Palace. We see the remnants of Split's Roman heritage, its Gothic structures, Jupiter's Temple and the Peristyle. The afternoon is at leisure to explore this popular seaside town's dozens of cafes, restaurants and shops.
- Day 8: Trogir / Zadar. We visit the UNESCO Heritage Site of Trogir Island - a Croatian artistic centre. Scholars from all over the world gather to study and paint here, and you will see why. We continue to Zadar where our tour shows

- us the harbour, the historical center, the Romanic marks and the pre-Romanic church of Saint Donat.
- Day 9: Plitvice Lakes / Zagreb. We depart for Plitvice Lakes National Park, a lush valley with 16 terraced lakes strung together by countless cascading waterfalls and miles of pleasant paths and wooden bridges. Our visit here will include a boat ride on the still waters of Kozjak Lake and an electric train around the park. We then continue to Zagreb, Croatia's capital.
- Day 10: Zagreb. Our city tour will include a funicular ride to the Upper Town where a complex of churches, palaces, museums, government buildings and galleries has retained much of its old-world charm.
- Day 11: Ljubljana (Slovenia). We continue to Slovenia's medieval capital, Ljubljana. Our city tour will include a funicular ride to Ljubljana castle for a panoramic view of the old town and red-roofed houses. The afternoon is at leisure to stroll the old town with its small shops, outdoor cafes and charming restaurants.

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along the path atop the city ramparts. The old town has many cafes, bars, restaurants and shops.

- 1. In the 15th century Dubrovnik was the only part of the Dalmatian coast not under the rule of Venice, and it remained an independent republic for centuries. UNESCO recently designated the city a World Heritage Monument. We walk through the old town's pedestrian-only streets to visit the Gothic and Renaissance-era Rector's Palace, the Franciscan Monastery (1424), the baroque cathedral and the Sponza Palace where, for hundreds of years, trade societies and art academics met.
- 2. Cavtat and Konavle: We enjoy an orientation tour of Cavtat, one of the prettiest towns on the Adriatic coast. We visit the Franciscan Monastery and Church of Our Lady - a renaissance edifice with marvellous works by 16th century Croatian artists. We continue in to the countryside to Konayle, a green landscape of rivers and canals that has been cultivated since pre-history. We visit the typical Konavle village of Komaji and try the wine in an old cellar.
- 3. Dalmatian Village: We continue our sightseeing in the countryside with a visit to the village of Cilipi, where we receive a welcome drink and a presentation of local dance styles in traditional dress. There are some shopping opportunities for the embroidery produced in this area and the chance to attend a local mass.
- 4. Montenegro: We enjoy the region's countryside as we drive to Montenegro a small republic tucked in between Croatia and Serbia. The coastal road follows the rugged coastline of the Adriatic, leading us to Kotor Bay and the world's southernmost fjord. This region is famous for its' breathtaking landscapes of mountains, beaches, forests, hidden coves and diverse flora and fauna.

Athens Mykonos Crete Santorini

The charm of the Greek Islands has fascinated visitors for many years. On this tour we start in Athens, with its historical treasures, vibrant culture and celebrated monuments (out of Athens we also enjoy a day cruise and an excursion to classical Delphi). Then we visit three of the most popular islands in Greece.

Mykonos is a delightful port with winding cobblestoned streets, white washed houses and picturesque churches. Its famous windmills look glorious against the backdrop of the blue Aegean Sea and sandy beaches. The shops and cafes are on the waterfront. Sit a while in a taverna, sip the local Ouzo and watch the sunset ... heaven!

Santorini is known for its high cliffs, black volcanic sand beaches and spectacular landscapes formed by centuries of volcanic activity. The main town of Fira sits atop a cliff edge which plunges almost 900 ft. to the sea. The island's cafes and shops line the streets of the town, and the white houses with distinctive blue doors spread down to the long, black beaches. From the west end of town there are stunning views of the harbour, coastline and the neighboring islands. One of the great pleasures is to

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wander the cobblestone streets, browse through the craft shops and arrive at the western edge of town to watch the sun bathe the harbour and sea in a magenta glow. Mules are used as transport to and from the harbour.

Crete is the largest Greek island, and its attractions are many - mosques, monasteries, gorges, grottoes, beaches and wonderful mountain scenery. The walled capital city of Heraklion is just 3 miles from the restored ruins of the 5,000 year old Minoan Palace of Knossos, believed to be the site of the mythical labyrinth of King Minos. Heraklion also has one of the finest archaelogical museums in Greece. There are coastal fishing communities and rustic farming settlements in the hills. This diversity makes for an interesting and lively stay.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Athens.

Day 2: Athens. We arrive in Athens and transfer to our hotel, located in the heart of Athens within walking distance of The Plaka - the oldest section of Athens with churches, shops, cafes and ruins of ancient temples. It is a safe and delightful area to explore.

Day 3: Athens. Day 5: Cruise / Athens. We cruise to the Saronic Islands via Aegina, a busy port in antiquity and today a tranquil resort. We continue on to Paros where we will enjoy a stroll by its enchanting little harbour, and then the quaint, colourful harbour of Hydra. Lunch is included. We return to Athens for our overnight.

Day 6: Crete. We fly to Crete and transfer to our hotel. The remainder of the day is at your leisure.

Day 7: Crete. Today's excursion will include a visit to the Palace of Knossos - the largest Bronze Age archaeological site on Crete that has been named Europe's oldest city at various points in history. We then visit the town of Heraklion and the Archaeological Museum, showcasing the most notable and complete collection of artifacts of the Minoan civilization of Crete.

Day 8: Crete. Today we will enjoy a full day tour of the countryside which will take us past vineyards and olive groves to Gortys - the old Greek and Roman town with ruins of Saint Titus Church. Then on to Phaestos for a visit of the Minoan Palace and for the beautiful view over the Messara Plain and Ida Mountain.

Day 9: Santorini. We ferry over to the dramatic island of Santorini and transfer to our hotel.

Day 10: Santorini. At leisure to explore the town at your own pace. See the Orthodox Cathedral, now a Byzantine museum, and marvel at the dazzling white houses topped with blue domes.

Day 11: Mykonos. We ferry to Mykonos for a 3-night stay. Enjoy the facilities of our resort hotel and beach, stroll into the quaint village or perhaps take the local bus to explore the small churches, chapels, glittering white houses, arcades and narrow streets.

Day 12: Mykonos. This morning we will have an orientation of Mykonos, including the beautiful esplanade lined with cafes and outdoor terraces overlooking the busy harbour.

Day 13: Mykonos. Our tour today takes us to the island of Delos - birthplace of the legendary Gods Apollo and Artemis. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Delos is one of the most important mythological, historical, and archaeological sites in Greece.

Day 14: Athens. We fly to Athens for some time at leisure to further explore the Plaka or revisit one or more of the many attractions. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 15: Home. We transfer to the airport for our flight home.

Israel today is a modern, progressive country where English is spoken everywhere. The warm, friendly people have come to Israel from over 100 countries, producing a potpourri of custom and dress that is reflected in the panorama of everyday life.

These diverse cultures and beliefs co-exist in a land full of scenic contrasts. There are mountains, subtropical valleys, lovely beaches, fertile farmland and arid deserts. Furthermore, everywhere you look there is the abundance of flowers that Israel is renowned for.

14 DAYS • NOVEMBER 4 - 17

A highlight of our visit here will be the Golden City of Jerusalem, sacred to Christians, Jews and Muslims alike. With all of the excavations of the past few years, the City of Peace has never looked more awe-inspiring.

We will also spend time in vibrant Tel Aviv, the beautiful Golan Heights and Sea of Galilee, mystic Safed, historic Nazareth and Bethlehem, dramatic cliff-top Masada and the buoyant Dead Sea. Also included in our tour will be some unique experiences to connect with the local people and various cultures as we enjoy a Shabbat dinner in Jerusalem, take part in Bedouin hospitality and see a lively folklore show.

Itinerary for Israel - The Holy Land

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Tel Aviv on our direct non-stop flight from Toronto.

Day 2: Tel Aviv. We arrive in Tel Aviv and proceed on a brief orientation of the city with a stop at Sarona Market. The rest of the day is at leisure until this evening's Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Tel Aviv. Our city tour shows us modern Tel Aviv and its lovely seafront promenade. Included is a visit of the Museum of Diaspora - a multi-media depiction of the history of the Jewish people.

Day 4: Caesarea / Acre / Haifa / Galilee. Today we explore Caesarea, the Roman capital of Judea for 600 years and now an important archaeological site, where we see the remains of the Roman Amphitheatre, aqueduct, hippodrome and the Crusader's City. Then we depart for Haifa - Israel's largest port, where we stop for a view of the famous Bahai Gardens and Shrine, and the Carmelite Church of Stella Maris where the prophet Elisha is said to be buried. We continue to the Galilee for a 3-night stay.

Day 5: Sea of Galilee / Capernaum / Galilee. We take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee and see the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus delivered three significant speeches. We stop at Capernaum where Jesus stayed during his ministry, and then Tabgha to visit the church, mosaics and site of the "bread and fishes" miracle. This evening we will see (and participate in) a cultural dance demonstration

Day 6: Golan Heights / Galilee. Today we ascend Mount Bental for a panoramic view of the Golan Heights. We will visit the city of Qazrin, enjoy a wine tasting at the Golan Heights Winery and visit the modern olive oil mill to learn about skin care products made of this Mediterranean culinary staple.

Day 7: Nazareth / Jerusalem. Our first stop is Nazareth (where Jesus spent his boyhood) to visit the Basilica of the Annunciation and Joseph's Workshop. We then proceed to Jerusalem for a 4-night stay. This evening we enjoy a special "Shabbat" evening, including a festive homemade Shabbat dinner and ceremony, hosted by a Jewish family.

Day 8: Bethlehem / Jerusalem. We first visit Bethlehem and the Church of the Nativity where pilgrims have come for centuries. Then we visit the Israel Museum and the Shrine of the Book that houses the Dead Sea Scrolls.

Day 9: Jerusalem. Our tour of Jerusalem's Old City begins at the Mount of Olives for spectacular views over the city. We visit the Garden of Gethsemane, Church of All Nations, Mt. Zion to see the room of The Last Supper and Tomb of King David. We will walk through the winding streets to David's Tower, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the "Wailing Wall" and the Via Dolorosa (His path to the crucifixion). There will be free time to shop in the Old City bazaars or relax at one of the many coffee houses.

Day 10: Jerusalem. Further touring of Jerusalem brings us to the Hadassah complex to view the impressive Chagall Windows. We then continue to visit Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust memorial and museum, where we will walk along the Avenue of the Righteous and see the Children's Pavilion. On the way back to the hotel we will drive through the Mea Shearim for a glimpse of the ultra-orthodox area.

Day 11: Massada / Dead Sea. We drive through the Jordan valley to the Dead Sea, passing Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found, and follow the shores of the Dead Sea to Masada. It was here at the site of Herod the Great's Palace that the Jewish Zealots held off the Roman army for three years before committing mass suicide. We ascend by cable car to tour the ruins and take in the breathtaking views. After our visit we continue to our Dead Sea hotel for a relaxing dip and perhaps a regenerative mud bath!

Day 12: Ramon Crater / Bedouin Hospitality / Tel Aviv. We first stop at the huge and beautiful Ramon Crater, a unique geological formation. Then we enjoy Bedouin hospitably with a hosted lunch and a chance to learn more about this unique desert-dwelling Arab tribe. An optional camel ride is available, before we continue to Tel Aviv.

Day 13: Jaffa / Tel Aviv. This morning we visit old Jaffa for a walk through the ancient streets, the restored artist's quarter, the central plaza and the Franciscan Monastery of St. Peter. The afternoon is free until our Farewell Dinner this evening.

Day 14: Home. We transfer to the airport for our direct, non-stop flight back to Canada.



With unique historical and archaeological sites, breathtaking natural beauty, religious and cultural diversity, and a welcoming tradition of hospitality, Turkey is one of world's most fascinating destinations.

- Ephesus the world's grandest and best-preserved ancient city
- Historic Bursa a UNESCO World Heritage Site

Itinerary for Highlights of Turkey

- Day 1: Departure. We depart for Istanbul, via London.
- Day 2: Istanbul. We arrive in Istanbul and transfer to our hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Istanbul. Our full day tour starts at the magnificent Byzantine church of St. Sophia, one of the first and largest architectural works of art in the world: then on to the famous Suleyman's Mosque and the beautiful Blue Mosque. We also see Topkapi Palace - a former imperial residence from where the great Ottoman sultans once ruled. We finish with a visit to the Grand Bazaar.

Day 4: Istanbul / Bosphorous Cruise / Whirling Dervish.

This morning we cruise the unforgettable Bosphorus. We pass by palaces, churches, villages, old wooden houses, mansions and modern villas. In the afternoon we visit the Asian side of Istanbul via the two bridges that link the east to the west. This evening we enjoy a "Whirling Dervish" performance, which is both a form of entertainment and a spiritual journey.

Day 5: Ankara. Our morning drive will take us through the Bolu Mountains to Ankara - capital city of Turkey. Our tour of Ankara will include the Mausoleum of Ataturk (the founder of modern Turkey) and the Museum of Anatolian Civilization, considered the best in Turkey.

Day 6: Cappadocea. We depart this morning for the unique Cappadocea region. In the afternoon we visit the Goreme Valley, also known as the Petrified Valley, where the wind and rain have eroded the volcanic soil into a spectacular. bizarre landscape of rock cones, capped pinnacles and deep ravines. This area is also famous for its rock churches.

Day 7: Cappadocea. Our tour of this fascinating area features ancient excavated towns, troglodyte villages and breathtaking scenery. This area, a UNESCO world heritage site, has changed little over time - with locals travelling between villages in horse-drawn carts.

Day 8: Konya. Konya, scenically situated high on a plateau, has long been a centre of the Muslim faith. The Whirling Dervishes were actually founded here in the 11th century. We visit the mausoleum of Mevlana, founder of the sect.

Day 9: Pamukkale. Appearing at first as as an enormous, chalky white cliff, as we approach Pamukkale it takes on

the appearance of a cotton castle. This thermal spring has attracted the weary and the curious for over 2000 years. We spend time at the mineral pools for those who wish to try the healthy warm waters. We also visit the holy city of Hierapolis - a spa and religious centre since Roman times.

Day 10: Kusadasi. We travel across a highland plateau rich in farms to Aphrodisas, one of the most important artistic sites. See the beautiful Temple of Aphrodite - goddess of love. Later we arrive at the picturesque seaside resort of Kusadasi, where we spend the next 4 nights.

Day 11: Kusadasi. A day of leisure to explore. The town centre has an interesting waterfront, modern shopping, colourful bazaars and several interesting teahouses.


Day 12: Ephesus. This morning we visit Ephesus, once the capital of the Roman's province of Asia. Here the Temple of Diana was counted among the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. St. Paul wrote his most profound epistles here. A white marble avenue known as the Arcadian Way stretches through the city with ruins of great buildings such as the Library of Celsius, the Temple of Hadrian and the public latrines! Finally we see the house of the Virgin Mary where it is believed she spent her last years.

Day 13: Kusadasi. We take an excursion to Miletus and Didyma, where we see the beautiful Great Theatre - a remarkably intact 25,000 seat amphitheatre, the Roman baths and gymnasium. We continue to the Temple of Apollo - one of antiquity's most sacred places.

Day 14: Bursa. Today we drive to this famous town known for its spa and silk markets. It was here that Ottoman architecture bloomed. The minarets above the 125 mosques make for a grand skyline. One of Turkey's more prosperous cities, it is a pleasing mix of old stone buildings and wealthy suburbs with vintage wood-frame Ottoman villas. Bursa is called the Green City, both for the green tiles that decorate some of its most famous monuments and for its parks and gardens.

Day 15: Istanbul. We return to Istanbul. The afternoon is free to explore or revisit the Grand Bazaar for last minute purchases. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Home. We return to Canada, via London.



Because this ancient kingdom is where Africa meets Europe, Morocco has long been known as "the Gateway to Africa". It is a land of cultural and scenic contrasts with exotic old-world charm that delights every visitor.

The Moroccan people, famous for their hospitality, are a mix of Arab and Berber, and their rich culture lives on in their dress, food, customs and festivities. The best place for people watching is the markets, where the shopping is colourful in both the wares available and also the crowds in the local bazaars with acrobats, snake charmers, water sellers and the occasional camel vying for your attention.

On our tour we will see medieval walled cities rich in culture and history, with palaces, mosques and local markets. The wonderful scenery along the way includes snow-capped mountain peaks, deserts with sand dunes and beautiful fertile valleys.

So join us and discover why Morocco has been attracting so many visitors for so many centuries.

Itinerary for Morocco

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Casablanca, via Montreal.

Day 2: Casablanca. We arrive in Casablanca and transfer to our hotel. The rest of the day is free.

Day 3: Casablanca / Rabat. Our tour of Casablanca, Morocco's largest city, begins at the old Medina - a labyrinth of streets, barbers, butchers, ironmongers and grocers. Nearby is majestic Mohammed V Square with its combination of French and Moorish architecture. We also see the Royal Palace and the famous Hassan II Mosque situated directly on the ocean - the world's third largest mosque. Then we proceed to Morocco's capital - Rabat, the seat of the Royal Family and home to many palaces and mosques. Our city tour will show us the imposing exterior of the Royal Palace official residence of King Mohamed VI, the Royal Mausoleum of Sultan Mohammed V - the man who led Morocco to independence, and the exquisite Hassan Tower.

Day 4: Tangier. We depart for Tangier, a cosmopolitan city combining all of its historical inhabitants - Phoenician, Romans, Vandals, Berbers, Arabs, Portuguese, Spanish, British and French. Our tour of the old city shows us the crowded Souks where traditional products are made and sold. then through the archway to the walled Medina - a medieval world of narrow lanes leading to the lively bazaars.

Day 5: Chefchaouen / Meknes. We proceed to the mountain city of Chefchaouen, known as the "Blue City". It is famous for the old Medina, houses with blue doors, wrought iron windows and tile roofs. The local markets are animated with traditionally dressed locals and colourful goods. After our tour we continue to Meknes.

Day 6: Meknes / Volubilis / Fez. Like a mirage looming up out of the rock in the countryside, the former royal city of Meknes is yet another unexpected delight of Morocco. This beautiful city has old city walls, monumental gates and palatial ruins. We visit the city walls, the Royal stables and the intricate Bab Al Mansour Gates. We then visit the remarkable ancient Roman ruin of Volubilis (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) before proceeding to Fez.

Day 7: Fez. A maze of stone and marble surrounded by orchards, Fez is the spiritual centre of Morocco. The old town's maze of alleys, houses and shops sit in the shadow of the mosque's minarets. From their workshops in the back alleys potters, charcoal burners, goldsmiths and weavers still practice their ancient trades. The Jewish Quarter here has long had a reputation for producing the finest ironwork in the country. On our full-day tour you will see the Medina

(a UNESCO World Heritage site), the Najjarine Fountain, the Moulay Idriss Mausoleum, the Karaouine Mosque and more.

Day 8: Erfoud. We travel to the town of Erfoud, built by the French and known for its red sand buildings that contrast with the surrounding desert. We stop in Midelt in the Atlas Mountains with wonderful landscape views.

Day 9: Merzouga / Boulmane. An optional tour to ride a camel over the the sand dunes at sunrise will be offered. We proceed to Merzouga and see its famous sand dunes, some of which are 160 metres high. Then we continue to Boulmane, en-route visiting the magnificent Todgha Canyons and marvel at the carved out cliff-sided canyons with sheer rock walls.

Day 10: Ouarzazate. We travel to Ouarzazate on the edge of the Sahara - an ancient garrison town made famous when the film Lawrence of Arabia was filmed nearby, then through Dades Valley, or "Valley of One Thousand Kasbahs". We also visit Taourirt - one of Morocco's most beautiful Kasbahs.

Day 11: Marrakech. We first visit Ait Ben Haddou - a 16th century UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Morocco's best preserved and spectacular Kasbahs. Then we proceed to Marrakech via the Tichka Pass - Morocco's highest pass. The views of the High Atlas Mountains interspersed with small Berber villages typical of the region are breathtaking.

Day 12: Marrakech. The 1,000-year-old "Red City" of Marrakech is drenched in culture and history. Our full-day tour includes the Mejorelle Gardens, the Saadian Tombs, El Bahia Palace and the Medina. At Djemaa El Fna Square we see snake charmers, acrobats and scribes writing letters for the illiterate.

Day 13: Ourika Valley / Marrakech. We travel to the Ourika Valley, enjoying views of the snow-capped Atlas Mountains and tiny villages clinging to the steep hillsides, with rocky landscapes merging with the desert.

Day 14: Essaouira. En route to the coastal town of Essaouira we will visit an Argan co-operative to see how local woman produce Argan oil. In Essaouira our city tour includes the beautiful medina (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) and the Orson Welles Square and Memorial, dedicated to the famous director's filming of Othello. We may get lucky and spot the famous tree climbing goats in the Argon trees.

Day 15: Casablanca. We travel back to Casablanca. The afternoon is free to explore until tonight's Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Home. We fly home via Montreal.



Tanzania, the largest country in East Africa, is considered by many to offer the best game viewing on the continent and the greatest variety of wildlife in the world.

On this tour we will enjoy several exciting game drives in the finest National Parks and game reserves, including Lake Manyara and the Serengeti Plains. Expect to see rhinos, hippos, cheetahs, leopards, elephants, buffalo and the common plains game such as zebra, giraffe, a variety of bird life and several species of antelope and monkeys.

We will travel safely and comfortably in specially designed 4 x 4 vehicles seating six people with large viewing windows (each person has a window seat to afford unobstructed viewing). Your driver / guide is an expert on the local customs, traditions and location of wildlife.

This part of the world also boasts an amazing natural environment, as we will see when we visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Ngorongoro Crater with its striking scenery and close range viewing of wildlife.

15 DAYS • NOVEMBER 13 - 27

The island of Zanzibar, just 40 kms off the coast of Tanzania, is a tropical paradise with mile upon mile of pristine white sand beaches, fringed by coconut palms. During our stay we visit Stone Town (also a World Heritage Site), with its maze of narrow streets and alleys that have changed little over the last 200 years. You will see why Zanzibar is often referred to as "The Spice Island" as we visit a local Spice Farm and learn about the rich history that makes this destination so intriguing.

While on safari we will enjoy a mixture of accommodations including beautiful lodges. While in Zanzibar we will stay at a First Class hotel.

Itinerary for Tanzania Safari and Zanzibar

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Kilimanjaro, with a change of planes in Amsterdam.

Day 2: Kilimanjaro. We arrive in Kilimanjaro in the evening and transfer to our hotel.

Day 3: Lake Manyara. We travel to Lake Manyara National Park and our lodge overlooking the Great Rift Valley and the stunning Manyara Soda Lake. The wall of the Rift Valley forms a fantastic backdrop to the park and its forest, open grassland, swamp and lake. Wildlife includes baboons, rhino, impala, giraffe, leopard, water buck and blue and vervet monkeys. The lions here have honed their tree-climbing skills. Manyara is also noted for its wonderful bird life.

Day 4: Lake Manyara / Ngorongoro Crater. This morning we enjoy a game drive in Lake Manyara National Park, home to a variety of primates and other wildlife. The extraordinary birdlife has made this place world-renowned among ornithologists, who come to observe the masses of pink flamingos and great birds of prey.

Then in the afternoon we depart for the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Ngorongoro Crater. Our lodge is perched atop the uppermost rim of the crater and offers breathtaking views of the crater floor far below. The 100 square miles of this collapsed volcano is 10 miles across and 2,000 feet deep.

Day 5: Ngorongoro Crater. We descend in to the crater for a full-day game drive. This is the world's largest intact caldera, the floor of which is primarily grassland with freshwater ponds, a salt lake and small forests. It harbours 20,000 large animals - a virtual Noah's Ark! Buffalo, wildebeest, zebra and gazelle graze the grassland while elephants roam the wooded areas and hippos gather in the marshes and ponds. Lions, spotted hyenas and jackals are easy to spot. Resident ostriches, crowned cranes and kori bustards are joined seasonally by other migrating birds.

Day 6: Ngorongoro Crater. This morning we enjoy a special Bush Breakfast in the crater, followed by some more game viewing. In the afternoon we visit a Masaai village.

Day 7: Serengeti. After breakfast we drive into the seemingly endless plains of Serengeti National Park. The National Park here, considered the finest in Africa, has spectacular concentrations of migrating game.

Days 8, 9 & 10: Serengeti. We enjoy three days of safari in the Serengeti. Travelling through this unique conservation area provides a spectacular game-viewing experience. We take our game drives in the early morning to catch the animals as they start their day and again in the evening to spot the nocturnal beasts that are beginning their prowl.

Day 11: Arusha / Zanzibar. We depart for Arusha where we will have lunch before boarding our plane to Zanzibar. Upon arrival, we transfer to the Bluebay Beach Resort and Spa located on the beautiful north-east coast.

Day 12: Zanzibar. We have a morning city tour of historic Stone Town and later visit a spice farm for an interesting and educational tour.

Day 13: Zanzibar. A day at leisure. You may consider taking an optional Blue Safari Fumba boat trip with a beach visit. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 14: Zanzibar / Depart for Home. At leisure at our resort hotel, with late check-out, until we fly back to mainland Tanzania to connect with our international flight home.

Day 15: Home. We fly home via Amsterdam.

Itinerary for South Africa

- Day 1: Depart. We depart for Johannesburg, via Amsterdam.
- Day 2: Johannesburg. We arrive in Johannesburg in the late evening and transfer to our hotel.
- Day 3: Victoria Falls. We fly to Victoria Falls and transfer to our lovely lodge hotel.
- Day 4: Victoria Falls. We enjoy a morning tour of the Falls - a sight to behold! The afternoon is free, and there will be an opportunity to take an optional helicoptor flight over the falls. This evening we enjoy a sunset cruise on the Zambezi River, with a special African dinner experience.
- Day 5: Chobe. We proceed to our safari lodge near Chobe National Park - home to a splendid variety of wildlife, including hippo and elephants that troll the river paths to drink. We take our first game cruise this afternoon.

- Day 9: Kruger National Park Area. A full day of game viewing in open safari vehicles. We start early in the morning, the best time to find the world's largest variety of wildlife including the Big Five (lion, elephant, rhino, leopard and buffalo), hippo, cheetah, giraffe, zebra and crocodile. The park is also home to more than 400 bird species.
- Day 10: Kruger National Park Area. A morning at leisure to enjoy the various activities at the hotel. Relax by the pool, do some game or bird watching or take a nature walk. Later we depart for our evening game drive to see if we can catch some nocturnal animals in the spotlight.

- Day 11: Johannesburg. We drive back to Johannesburg. This afternoon we visit the Apartheid Museum - the preeminent museum in the world dealing with 20th century South Africa, at the heart of which is the apartheid story.
- Day 12: Soweto / Garden Route. We begin with an unforgettable tour of the township of Soweto, which sets the trends for South Africa in politics, fashion, music and dance. After our visit we will transfer to the airport for our flight to George, on South Africa's fabled Garden Route.
- Day 13: Garden Route. We travel over the mountains to Oudtshoorn to visit an ostrich farm, followed by a visit of the Cango Caves, whose stalagmites and stalactites will leave a lasting impression.
- Day 14: Garden Route. Today we visit a township near George, where we will have a chance to meet the children at a local primary school. Then we travel to Knysna and ferry over to the Featherbed Nature Reserve, dedicated to the protection of the local flora.
- Day 15: Garden Route / Cape Town. Our Garden Route drive takes us along the coast, around lakes, mountains, golden beaches and cliffs - an enchanting drive with a romantic history. We arrive in Cape Town and take a cable car ride up Table Mountain for panoramic views.

- Day 19: Capetown / Departure. A day at leisure in Capetown. After dinner we depart for home.

The island of Borneo is known for its ancient, biodiverse rainforest - home to unique wildlife such as orangutans and gibbons, as well as its wide array of cultures and age-old traditions.

We begin with a jungle adventure in Sabah - home to the world's oldest jungles and one of Southeast Asia's highest peaks - Mount Kinabalu. We will explore rainforests and jungle trails, float along rivers spotting wildlife, snorkel in colourful coral reefs and stroll serene white-sand beaches.

We will also visit local tribes who have lived in the jungle for generations and visit the lively local markets. At our jungle lodge on Mount Kinabalu we will experience the flora and fauna – home to thousands of species of orchids, hundreds of varieties of birds, monkeys and other jungle creatures. There will be river safaris, night-time walks to spot nocturnal animals and an excursion to Gomantong Caves to see the exodus of millions of bats.

We will visit Sepilok Orangutan Reserve - a rehabilitation centre that prepares orphaned animals for a return to life in the rainforest, Sun Bear Rehabilitation Centre to meet

the world's smallest bears and Proboscis Sanctuary to delight at the elusive and peculiar monkeys of this region. At Abai Jungle we enjoy spectacular scenery among the magnificent mangroves, and at scenic Pitax Oxbow Lake we may glimpse families of pygmy elephants bathing in the wild.


After our jungle adventure we fly to the vibrant metropolis of Kuala Lumpur, known for its fantastic shopping, great restaurants and surrounding natural wonders. From here we travel overland to Malacca - the historical state of Malaysia rich in heritage buildings and ancient landmarks. We complete our tour in the island city of Singapore.

Itinerary for Borneo, Malaysia and Singapore

- Day 1: Departure. We depart for Borneo, via Hong Kong and Kuala Lumpur.
- Day 2: Kota Kinabalu: We arrive in Kota Kinabalu and transfer to our hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.
- Day 3: Sapi Island. We take a ferry to Sapi Island for a relaxing day of strolling the picturesque beach, swimming in the turquoise waters, snorkelling to see the abundant tropical fish and marine life, and enjoy a delicious BBQ lunch.
- Day 4: Kudat / Sahab. We take the scenic drive to the northern tip of Borneo, passing expansive paddy fields, bustling villages, oil palm plantations, and stalls selling local produce and handicrafts. En route we stop at Sumangkap Village, known for its "Gong" making, and later at the Gombizau Honey Bee Farm to sample raw honey straight from the honeycomb! We continue to the Tanjung Simpang, known as the "Tip of Borneo" for spectacular views of the South China Sea before returning to Sahab for our overnight.
- Day 5: Kinabalu Park / Sepilok. We travel the winding mountain road to Kinabalu Park - home to a wide range of exotic flora and fauna. First we stop at Nabalu Market where produce and handicrafts are sold, then enjoy the spectacular view of Mount Kinabalu. At the Park's Exhibit Centre and Mountain Gardens we'll discover the beautiful local plant life, then proceed to our nature resort in Sepilok for a 2-night stay.
- Day 6: Sepilok. We visit the Orangutans at the Sepilok Orangutan Rehabilitation Center, where these majestic apes are rehabilitated before release into the wild. Then we continue to the Sun Bear Rehabilitation Centre for a close encounter with the world's smallest bear. Later we visit Labuk Bay where the mangrove forest is a sanctuary for the unique Proboscis Monkey - unique to Borneo and one of the world's most peculiar animals. We will also visit the Rainforest Discovery Centre before returning to our hotel where we may see the "flying squirrel" in action!
- Day 7: Boat Safari / Abai Jungle Lodge. We begin with a onehour cruise through the striking scenery of the Mangrove Forest to Abai Jungle Lodge. After lunch at the lodge we take another boat trip in search of wildlife, and after sunset we'll see the magic of the fireflies who light up the foliage like Christmas trees. After dinner those who wish can do a guided night stroll on the nature boardwalk in search of birds and other wildlife.
- Day 8: Pitax Oxbow Lake / Sukau. We take a river trip to Pitas Oxbow Lake where we see elephants, monkeys, orangutans

- and even crocodiles in their natural habitat. We then enjoy the lunch prepared by the villagers. In the afternoon we cruise up river to Sukau village in search of the Proboscis Monkeys. birds and other wildlife and later take a boat ride on the Menanggul River before arriving at Kinabatangan Riverside Lodge in Sukau for a 3-night stay.
- Day 9: Sukau. We take a cruise on the Kinabatangan River to search for wildlife, and explore the Menanggul River, a smaller tributary.
- Day 10: River Safari / Gomantong Cave / Sukau. The calls of Gibbons and Hornbills rouse us this morning, before we travel overland to the area of Gomantong Caves. We will hike on a forest trail and witness the sunset exodus of over two million bats, as well as raptors, from the Gomantong Cave.
- Day 11: Boat to Sandakan / Kuala Lumpur. We travel by boat back to Sandakan and transfer to the airport for our flight to Kuala Lumpur. Upon arrival we transfer to our hotel.
- Day 12: Kuala Lumpur. Our tour of the city's highlights takes in the Railway Station, the National Mosque, Merdeka Square, Sultan Abdul Samad Building and the National Monument. At the Central Market we see local handicrafts, and there will be a photo-stop at the iconic Petronas Twin Tower. This evening dinner is at a local restaurant featuring Malay specialties.
- Day 13: Malacca. We travel to historical Malacca. Our fascinating walking tour includes the Baba and Nyonya Heritage Museum, bustling Jalan Hang Jebat Street, the river dock where wooden barges deliver charcoal and rice from Sumatra, the Town Square with its terracotta Dutch colonial buildings, the Malaccan Sultanate's Palace and a visit of the great 16th century Portuguese Fort A'Famosa.
- Day 14: Singapore. We proceed overland to Singapore. This evening we tour Chinatown, which has a rich history and heritage. We'll visit a Chinese Medical Hall, enjoy dinner at a local Chinese restaurant and wander along the narrow lanes of the Night Market. The highlight is a trishaw ride through the alleyways of Chinatown, then a bumboat cruise along the river to see the city lights.
- **Day 15: Singapore.** Our city tour takes in the Singapore Cricket Club, the "Padang", historic Parliament House and Marina Bay. We will visit Thian Hock Keng Temple - one of Singapore's oldest Buddhist-Taoist temples, the Singapore Botanical Gardens and Little India. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner at the Orchard Café.
- Day 16: Home. We fly home to Canada via Hong Kong.



On this exciting tour we will walk through impressive countryside and picturesque villages led by experienced, expert hiking guides.

Each day there will be a choice of 3 different levels of walks, each designed for the avid walker. The gentle walks will range from 5 - 6 kms with ascents of up to 150m. More challenging walks will also be offered daily for those interested.

The first 7 nights will be in the Cotswolds town of Bourtonon-the-Water (voted one of England's prettiest towns), where gentle hills, picture-postcard villages and tempting tea shops combine to make this quintessentially English countryside perfect for walking. Here we will stay at the Harrington House, which retains many of its stunning original Georgian features - the most breathtaking is the sunny walled garden with a landscape of green rolling hills and timeless golden stone villages in the background.

We will spend the following 3 nights in Brecon (Wales) - a quaint market town at the foot of the Brecon Beacons - an area of sweeping high moorland and beautiful green valleys. Our hotel, the historic *Nythfa House*, is a charming country house on the edge of Brecon within easy

reach of the Brecon Beacons National Park and many fine walking areas - a location is perfect for walkers and outdoor enthusiasts.

Our final 2 nights will be at a centrally located hotel in 'everyone's favorite city', London.

Itinerary for Walking in Wales and the Cotswolds

Walks described are the easier option. More challenging walks will also be offered each day.

Day 1: Depart. We depart for London

Day 2: Bourton-on-the Water. We arrive in London and transfer to our country house hotel in the centre of Bourton-on-the Water. On our guided walking over the next few days we'll discover glorious golden stone villages with thatched cottages, mansions, pastoral countryside and quiet country lanes. This evening is our Welcome Briefing and Dinner.

Day 3: The Slaughters and the Windrush Valley (Walk 7km with 40m ascent). We start by following the Monarch's Way before crossing the Windrush Valley, passing some of the quarry lakes to Salmonsbury Camp and Bourton. At the end of our walk there is plenty of time to explore Bourton-on-the-Water. Enjoy a pint in one of the pubs, visit the shops, or find a bench beside the River Windrush and soak up this charming rural village.

Day 4: Fish Hill to Broadway (Walk 5km with 40m ascent). Starting at Fish Hill we follow the Cotswold Way with time to visit Broadway Tower. Then we descend to spend time exploring Broadway. Broadway Tower was the brainchild of the great 18th Century landscape designer. Capability Brown. His vision was carried out for the Earl of Coventry and was completed in 1798.

Day 5: Stratford-upon-Avon. We spend the day in Shakespeare country! We start at Shakespeare's Schoolroom and Guildhall, where Shakespeare spent his schooldays, discovered theatre and was educated and inspired to become the world's greatest playwright! There will be free time before we head out to Shakespeare Distillery, where we'll learn about the history of gin, how it is made and the many different ingredients used. There will of course be a tutored tasting to finish off our day.

Day 6: Chedworth Roman Villa (Walk 6.5km with 140m ascent). We start this walk by exploring the beautiful 12th century church of Hampnett, with its astonishingly ornate patterns of mock-medieval stencilling. We then follow the Macmillan Way to the small rural parish of Yanworth. Finally we arrive at the Roman Villa at Chedworth.

Day 7: Hailes Abbey to Sudeley Castle (Walk 4.5km with **60m ascent).** We explore Hailes Abbey before walking to

Winchcombe. We enjoy the views of the heritage steam railway before arriving at Sudeley Castle. Steeped in history, the castle was home (and now the burial place) of Queen Catherine Parr - one of Henry VIII's many wives.

Day 8: Lower Slaughter (Walk 5km with 50m ascent).

A picturesque circular walk to Lower Slaughter. With its' fine old houses and cottages sitting alongside the River Eye, this is one of the most photographed villages in England. There will be time to visit the church and look at the mill before we return to Harrington House.

Day 9: Brecon, Wales. We depart the Cotswolds and make our way to Brecon, arriving at our country house hotel, Nythfa House, for a 3-night stay. The hotel is surrounded by hidden coves, breathtaking scenery and some of the best walks in Wales.

Day 10: Black Mountains and Crickhowell. (Walk 6km with 60m ascent). We take a circular walk around the lovely town of Crickhowell. After crossing the picturesque Usk bridge, we follow the canal passing the village of Llangattock, then return to explore Crickhowell with its shops, cafes and art galleries featuring local artists.

Day 11: Western Beacons (Walk 6.5km with 150m ascent). We start our walk in the village of Panycae in the upper Swansea Valley and pass Craig-y-Nos - a 19th century castle once owned by opera diva Dame Adelina Patti - the Madonna of her time. We walk around the park with its lake and tea room before continuing up the valley to Dan-yr-Ogof where we will have the opportunity to visit some of the most spectacular show caves in Europe.

Day 12: Bath / London. Enroute to London we stop in Bath for some free time to explore this UNESCO World Heritage City, famous for its beautiful architecture, Roman Baths and fascinating history which has attracted visitors for centuries. Later we arrive at our central London hotel.

Day 13: London. A free day in London to visit or revisit some of the countless attractions. At our Farewell Dinner we will raise a glass to say 'Cheers' for this memorable walking tour.

Day 14: Home. Air Canada takes us home.



Between the solitude of Yorkshire's glorious wilderness. and the charm of cobbled streets in its quaint villages. the quiet beauty of Yorkshire will have you hooked.

This unique walking tour will include "gentle' walks that range from 6 - 11 km with a maximum ascent of 320m, led by experienced hiking guides. There are 2 other walks available each day for those who prefer more of a challenge. Our walks will take in the amazing landscapes that Yorkshire is known for, and we will also stop at historic pubs oozing with character, so we can sample the local culture, cuisine and perhaps a pint or two as well!

We'll spend the first 7 nights in The Yorkshire Dales - the quintessential landscape of Northern England. Our country house hotel, Newfield Hall, sits in open countryside where we can enjoy the surrounding scenery of green patchwork fields, drystone walls and wild moorland hills.

The next 3 nights will be in Sedbergh, known for its oldworld atmosphere. Our country house hotel, *Thorns Hall*, is set in the magnificent western dales of Yorkshire Dales National Park, near the rugged fells of the Lake District.

Our final 2 nights are in Liverpool. The birthplace of the Beatles brims with maritime culture, magnificent Georgian and Victorian architecture, and countless attractions.

Tentative Itinerary for Hiking in the Yorkshire Dales

Walks described below are the easier option. More challenging walks will also be offered each day.

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Manchester, via London.

Day 2: Malham, Yorkshire Dales. Upon arrival in Manchester we transfer to our country house hotel - Newfield Hall House, situated in an enviable location close to Malham Cove in the Yorkshire Dales, for a 7-night stay.

Day 3: Airton and The Pennine Way (Walk 6.5km with ascent of 100m). We start out north on the Pennine Way, along the banks of the River Aire. After passing an old mill, we have the chance to walk along the old leat and return via fields and farms to Newfield Hall. We may see 'dippers' in the River Aire and visit the 17th century village of Airton.

Day 4: Clapton Beck and Ingleborough Cave (Walk 6km with ascent of 200m). We walk through the traditional Dales village of Clapham, passing through the Ingleborough Estate, to Ingleborough Cave. We'll have a tour of the cave with its impressive stalactites and stalagmites, then return to the village for some time on our own. You may want to enjoy coffee and cake in the village café.

Day 5: Leisure. Newfield Hall sits in rolling open countryside, 7 miles from the market town of Skipton where there are shops, pubs and cafes. You may want to enjoy the facilities of our hotel, which include a heated indoor swimming pool, extensive gardens with views of the Yorkshire Dales and a walled garden with putting green.

Day 6: Eshton Moor and the Haw Crag (Walk 6.5km with ascent of 140m). Our circular walk explores the Pennine Way, before going over the Eshton Moor to the Haw Crag, then rejoining the Pennine Way back to our hotel. The views today are spectacular, and if you feel energized you will have the opportunity to climb Haw Crag (200m).

Day 7: Wharfedale and Grassington (Walk 6.5km with ascent of 120m). We follow the Dales Way along the beautiful River Wharfe, first to Linton Falls - the largest waterfall on the river, then to picturesque Grassington where there will be plenty of time to explore or relax in one of the many tea shops.

Day 8: Janet's Foss & Malham (Walk 7km with ascent of 150m). We first cross National Trust land to view Janet's Foss. Then a gentle walk takes us up to the magnificent Malham Cave - truly spectacular! Look out for peregrine falcons nesting on the cliffs, and the river emerging from the base of the cave. We then make our way back to Malham village.

Day 9: Lake District / Sedbergh. We venture north to Windermere, England's largest lake and the most popular area in the Lake District. Here we enjoy a lake cruise and free time to explore one of the lakeside towns. Later we arrive at Thorns Hall in West Yorkshire, for a 3-night stay.


Day 10: Thwaite To Gunnerside (Walk 9km with ascent of **300m).** Starting from the village of Thwaite, we cross farmland to the hamlet of Angram. We then ascend onto the shoulder of Kisdon Hill and follow the route of the River Swale, enjoying the views along Swaledale and the surrounding hills before descending to the village of Muker. We enjoy lunch at the Farmers Arms - a 'proper' Dales pub with hearty home cooking (no frills) - a very typical village Yorkshire pub! After lunch we stroll back along the banks of the River Swale to Thwaite and the Kearton Hotel for a welldeserved drink!

Day 11: Sedbergh To Dent (Walk 9.5km with ascent of 180m). We walk along the River Rawthey, then up the open moorland of Frostrow Fells to admire the views of Dentdale and the Howgills before descending into the village of Dent. Our lunch will be at the Sun Inn - a lovely white-painted. traditional pub at the top of the village, with an interior untouched for decades. The pub serves traditional locally brewed ales. After lunch there will be time to explore the village.

Day 12: Liverpool. Leaving the Yorskshire Dales we make our way to Liverpool. The birthplace of the Fab Four has a maritime history that stretches back over 800 years. Our city tour begins at the historic waterfront area, now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Then we drive along Hope Street and take in both of Liverpool's cathedrals. Of course no tour of Liverpool would be complete without taking in some of the Beatles landmarks, such as Penny Lane and Strawberry Fields!

Day 13: Liverpool at Leisure. A day to explore one of England's most beautiful and historic cities at your own pace. Liverpool's Waterfront is one of the most recognizable waterfronts in the world. Explore the Albert Dock and world class museums, including "The Beatles Story". Our Farewell Dinner will be at a restaurant on Albert Dock.

Day 14: Home. We fly home from Manchester, via London.

Designed for the avid walker (and moderate hiker), each day we will enjoy walks ranging from 5 - 12 km with ascents of 100m – 400m, led by experienced hiking guides on good paths (which are sometimes rocky underfoot).

We begin in Provence with 5 nights in charming Gréouxles-Bains - an ancient Roman town with thermal baths. Our hotel is the Villa Borghese, a member of the prestigious Château Demeures de Tradition group. The hotel has beautiful grounds, a spa, an outdoor heated swimming pool shaded by century old oak trees and a restaurant renowned for the quality of its regional cuisine.

We spend the next 5 nights in the Riviera's best kept secret - Menton, known throughout the country as "The Pearl of France". Menton's old town with its pastelcoloured buildings, fragrant lemon trees and pristine beachfront is a delight. Situated at the base of the Alps, the town is a hiker's paradise. We will stay at the lovingly

restored *Hotel Royal Westminster -* a 19th century Belle Epoque style palace located directly on the seafront promenade (all of our rooms are seaview!)

Itinerary for Provence and the French Riviera

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Marseille via Paris.

Day 2: Greoux-Les-Bains. We arrive in Marseille and transfer to Gréoux-les-Bains for a 5-night stay. This evening we enjoy our first delicious dinner in France.

Day 3: Rustrel / Simiane-la-Rotonde / Banon (Walk 5km) with 150m ascent). We travel to Rustrel, known for its amazing ochre cliffs and small canyons which gave the village the nickname the "Provencal Colorado". On our walk we will see an incredible succession of rust-coloured rocks. golden cliffs and red earthen chimneys which rise majestically out of the vegetation. Then we visit Simiane-la-Rotonde, listed as one of the most beautiful villages of Provence. Simiane is a place where Mediterranean and Alpine influences meet. We will enjoy a visit of the medieval castle and free time to wander the charming streets of the village. Our last stop will be in the quaint village of Banon, renowned for its goat cheeses. We will sample some specialties at a goat cheese factory.

Day 4: Moustiers Sainte Marie (Walk 6km with 110m ascent OR 10km with 350m ascent). We walk along the ridge above the Moustiers-Ste-Marie, listed as one of the Most Beautiful Villages of France. The town has ancient gates, medieval architecture, pottery shops and a gorgeous location at the base of rocky cliffs. Enjoy the breathtaking views of the Provencal Alps and Lake Sainte Croix as we walk on the old Roman path down towards the village.

Day 5: Forcalquier / Mourres Plateau / Abbey of Salagon (Walk 7km with 200m ascent OR 11km with 400m ascent).

We begin at the picturesque hilltop town of Forcalquier home to one of the largest and liveliest Provencal markets. We will explore the market, then visit a typical olive mill and take in the gorgeous views over the Luberon landscape. Then we proceed with our walk on the Mourres Plateau. where mushroom shaped formations resemble human faces - a true geological wonder! We finish the day with a visit of the Abbey of Salagon - a peaceful 13th century priory with lovely theme gardens.

Day 6: Verdon Gorge (Walk 8km with 150m ascent OR 12km with 250m ascent). We head to the village of Quinson for a scenic walk along the lower Verdon Gorges. The walkway follows an old canal previously used to carry drinking water to Aix-en-Provence. The views of the turquoise waters of the Canal are wonderful. We return to Gréoux where the rest of the day will be at leisure.

Day 7: Menton. We proceed to sunny Menton for a 5-night stay. On our walking tour of this delightful seaside resort we see the lovely pastel-coloured architecture, the old town, the cemetery where many prominent 19th century English and Russian figures are buried and the wonderful views of the surrounding countryside.


Day 8: Menton. At leisure in Menton to explore this exquisite town, enjoy a swim in the Mediterranean Sea, visit the museum dedicated to the artist Jean Cocteau, or nearby towns like Monaco or Nice.

Day 9: La Turbie / Eze (Walk 5km with 100m ascent OR 10km with 300m ascent). Our walk begins in La Turbie. Overlooking the Principality of Monaco, this small town resembles a balcony hanging over the Mediterranean and seems to float in the sky. The tall Trophee d'Auguste built 2,000 years ago for the glory of Emperor Augustus is impressive while the rest of the town, with its medieval vaulted passageways, bell tower and baroque fountains is enchanting. Then walk on the trail towards Eze - a fine 14th century village built on a hill. We'll enjoy a visit of the exotic garden and magnificent views over the coast.

Day 10: Italy / Dolceacqua / Aprical. We cross into Italy for a beautiful day of sightseeing. We first discover the beautifully preserved medieval town of Dolceacqua located in the Lugarian Hills. The town enchant visitors with its scenic bridges and small houses that circle the Castello dei Doria. French painter Claude Monet immortalized the town in one of his famous paintings. We will enjoy a typical Italian lunch at a local restaurant featuring fresh locally grown food. Later we visit the perched village of Aprical - surrounded by forested hills it is on the list of the 'Most Beautiful Villages in Italy'. Dinner is on our own this evening.

Day 11: Cap Ferrat / Villa Ephrussi (Walk 11km with 150m ascent). Our last walk is on the picturesque hiking path along the rocky seaside from Beaulieu and around the main peninsula of Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat. We pass magnificent villas and see how unspoiled Cap Ferrat has remained. We conclude our walk with a visit of the Villa Ephrussi - home of the Rothschild family. The villa's opulent furnishings, garden with musical dancing fountains and views of the Mediterranean are breathtaking - a wonderful way to end our walking journey! Tonight enjoy a farewell cocktail followed by dinner.

Day 12: Home. We fly back to Canada via Paris.

- You may not make any changes to your flight arrangements after the final payment due date.


