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Canadian Rockies and Beautiful B.C.

Western Canada (especially the Rocky Mountains) is rightly considered to be one of the most beautiful places on earth.

Awe-inspiring mountain ranges with glistening snowcapped peaks, azure blue lakes, huge areas of unspoiled wilderness, an abundance of wildlife and a highly developed tourist infrastructure all combine to make this area one of the world's most desirable travel destinations.

On this tour we will experience the grandeur of Lake Louise, Banff and Jasper National Parks, as well as the exciting British Columbian cities of Vancouver (one of the world's favourite cities) and the capital of BC - Victoria, which resembles a transplanted piece of England. adventures ... the Columbia Icefields, the Gondola Lift at Sulphur Mountain, Hell's Gate Airtram and spectacular excursions on Maligne Lake and Banff's Bow River.

So join us in western Canada this year for a truly unforgettable experience.

* This tour is suitable only for the fit and active traveller.

Day 1: Departure / Calgary / Banff. We depart for Calgary. Upon arrival we enjoy the scenic transfer into the Rocky Mountains and our Banff hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Banff. This morning we take a gondola ride up Sulphur Mountain for breathtaking views of the town and Rocky Mountains. This afternoon we will enjoy a leisurely float trip along the Bow River enjoying the awesome views of the snow-capped Rockies all along the way.

Day 3: Lake Louise / Columbia Icefields / Jasper. We begin the day with a visit of Lake Louise. With its emerald waters set against the backdrop of Victoria Glacier, Lake Louise is probably the most photographed scene in the Canadian Rockies. We then proceed along one of North America's most spectacular highways - the Icefields Parkway, where wildlife sightings are common. Of course we will stop for photos at Peyto Lake. The highlight of the day will be our ride aboard a unique "Snocoach" up the Athabasca Glacier to the Columbia Icefield - the world's Iargest accumulation of ice south of the Arctic Circle. After our ride we continue on to see Athabasca Falls before arriving in Jasper.

Day 4: Maligne Canyon / Jasper. This morning we visit one of the most spectacular gorges in the Canadian Rockies - Maligne Canyon, where sheer limestone walls plunge to depths of 165 feet. We also visit Maligne Lake, the second largest glacial lake in the world. Our lake cruise offers us breathtaking views of the surrounding peaks, and also Spirit Island.

Day 5: Wells Gray Provincial Park / Kamloops. We enter British Columbia and are greeted with views in the distance of Mt. Robson - the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies, as well as Mt. Terry Fox. Today's highlight will be Wells Gray Provincial Park, with its towering mountains, deep canyons, volcanic cones, ancient old-growth forests, raging white-water rivers, and many beautiful waterfalls. After our visit we proceed to Kamloops. **Day 6: Cache Creek / Fraser Canyon / Vancouver.** Our first stop is the Hat Creek Ranch heritage site where we venture back in time to the 1860s for a glimpse into the history of this region. We then proceed to the scenic Fraser Canyon for a ride across the Fraser River on Hell's Gate Airtram, which offers a bird's eye-view of the point where the Fraser River squeezes through Hell's Gate - a narrow gorge where over 200 million gallons of water per minute flow through - twice the volume of Niagara Falls! We end our day in Vancouver.

Day 7: Vancouver. Our morning city tour includes Stanley Park, Gastown, Chinatown and much more. The afternoon is at leisure to explore this beautiful city on your own.

Day 8: Victoria. We take the scenic ferry ride to Victoria and upon arrival immediately proceed to the worldrenowned Butchart Gardens, where we can explore the 50-acre display of magnificent floral colour. We then proceed to downtown Victoria where we will see the Inner Harbour, the Empress Hotel, Legislative Buildings and Beacon Hill Park.

Day 9: Victoria. This morning we will enjoy a walking tour of Victoria's Inner Harbour with an entertaining local guide. The afternoon is at leisure to explore this quaint city on your own. With its turn-of-the-century buildings and tweed shops, you might think Victoria is a transplanted corner of Britain! Tonight we enjoy our Farewell Dinner.

Day 10: Home. We transfer to the airport for our Air Canada flight home.

Rocky Mountaineer Vancouver to Jasper by rail



The romance of travelling through the Rocky Mountains by train has always had immense appeal. For some, it is the only way to see what is considered one of the world's most spectacular regions.

The Rocky Mountaineer is considered one of the world's most spectacular rail experiences. As we enjoy the ultra-modern comforts of our train, we will be following the steps of the early explorers as the rails meander over trestle bridges, along rivers and past waterfalls - all the while in the shadows of the magnificent glacier-clad mountains. While onboard, our attendant will entertain us with interesting commentary, serve our meals and ensure our utmost comfort.

We board the Rocky Mountaineer in Vancouver. On the first day we journey through the Fraser Valley and the towering Coastal Mountains. After an overnight stay in Kamloops, we reboard the train en route to Jasper. The train follows the Thompson River to the Monashee Mountains, passing expansive glaciers until we arrive in Jasper in the evening.

There are two types of service aboard the Rocky Mountaineer. *Silver Leaf Service* includes hot breakfasts and lunches

served at your seat, as you enjoy the spectacular scenery through the oversized panoramic windows. *Gold Leaf Service* includes gourmet hot breakfasts and lunches served in the exclusive Gold Leaf Dining Room, and unparalleled panoramic views through the full-length dome windows. Both services include complimentary wine, beer, spirits and non-alcoholic drinks throughout the rail trip. Note - *Gold Leaf* passengers will be separated from the main group during the journey.

Also included on this tour are three nights in Canada's most beautiful city, Vancouver and three nights in Jasper National Park, with extensive touring and adventures throughout.

7 Senior Discovery Tours

Day 1: Vancouver. We fly to Vancouver and transfer to our First Class hotel located in the heart of downtown. The rest of the day is at leisure until our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Vancouver. Our city tour includes Stanley Park, Gastown, Chinatown and much more. A highlight of the day will be crossing the Lions Gate Bridge to visit the popular Capilano Suspension Bridge - an opportunity to walk across the 230-foot high bridge perched above the Capilano Canyon. The evening is at leisure to explore Vancouver - annually voted one of the world's favourite cities.

Day 3: Whistler / Vancouver. A spectacular drive on the "Sea to Sky Highway" takes us to beautiful Shannon Falls (for a photo stop) and then to Whistler. This quaint alpine village is North America's most popular mountain resort. There will be free time to enjoy the fresh mountain air while strolling in the village with its quaint shops.

July and August tours - We will board Whistler's "Peak to Peak Gondola" and ride from the peak of Whistler Mountain to the peak of Blackcomb Mountain, and experience the spectacular panoramic views of the Whistler area and surrounding Coast Mountains.

September tour (Gondola not operating) - We arrive in Whistler and visit the award-winning Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre, which showcases the art and history of the First Nations People of this area.

Day 4: Rocky Mountaineer / Kamloops. Today we begin our journey aboard "The Most Spectacular Train Trip in the World". Breakfast and lunch are served onboard. On today's full-day rail tour we will pass through the fertile Fraser Valley and enjoy the natural beauty of the scenic Fraser Canyon. One of the canyon's highlights is Hell's Gate, where millions of gallons of water per minute rush through the narrowest point of the canyon. Then, following the Thompson River we cross into Canada's arid interior, arrive in the city of Kamloops and transfer to our hotel for our overnight. **Day 5: Rocky Mountaineer / Jasper.** "All Aboard" as the Rocky Mountaineer departs and follows the Yellowhead Route to the quaint town of Jasper. Breakfast and lunch are again served onboard. The train follows the Thompson River along the rolling plateaus into the snowy peaks of the Monashee and Cariboo Mountains. View Pyramid Falls and the expansive glaciers of the Albreda Icefields. As we enter the Rocky Mountain range we pass by Mt. Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies. In the early evening we arrive in Jasper, transfer to our hotel and meet for our included dinner.

Day 6: Jasper. Our full day of wonderful Rocky Mountain experiences begins with an Interpretive Nature Walk conducted by an accredited local expert. Then our coach will take us along a beautiful stretch of highway teeming with wildlife to one of the most beautiful lakes in the Rockies (if not the world!) - Maligne Lake. Here we will enjoy one of the highlights of the tour - a narrated cruise on the lake's crystal blue waters, surrounded by summits of 10,000 ft. and higher! This area is called the "Hall of the Gods", and for good reason! The cruise features a fantastic view of Spirit Island - one of the most photographed sites in the Canadian Rockies.

Day 7: Jasper. To begin the day we will be gently transported into Jasper's alpine tundra on the Jasper Tramway - the longest and highest guided aerial tramway in Canada. Enjoy the spectacular views of six mountain ranges, glacial fed lakes, the Athabasca River and the scenic mountain town of Jasper. After some free time for lunch we'll enjoy a guided walking tour of the town during which we'll hear stories about the people, places and events that made Jasper what it is today. For the highlight of the day we'll embark on a leisurely raft trip down the Athabasca River, a route used by the fur traders. Here we will experience Jasper from a unique perspective as our guide will point out the natural and historic points of interest, as we take in the spectacular Rocky Mountain views on either side of us.

Day 8: Edmonton. We transfer to Edmonton, where we will have an afternoon at leisure and our Farewell Dinner.

Day 9: Home. Air Canada takes us home.

Known as "The Garden City", Victoria's climate is perfect for a wide variety of gardening, and there are countless impressive gardens throughout the city and surrounding area representing a wide range of styles.

The annual flower count in the spring can be up to 8.5 billion blooms, and so the towns in the Greater Victoria area count their flower blooms in a friendly competition, in order to be the "Bloomingest Community". One of the city's most recognizable trademarks is its hanging baskets. Each spring more than 1600 flower baskets hang from lamp posts in a medley of color. This tour is designed for the garden enthusiast to view the beautiful homes and unique gardens of Southern Vancouver Island, all in full bloom! An expert garden guide will accompany us on all garden visits.

Our hotel in Victoria will be the *Royal Scot Hotel and Suites.* This superior Canada Select 4-star, AAA 3-Diamond hotel is located one block from the Inner Harbour and within easy walking distance to the Legislative buildings and downtown. The hotel has an indoor pool, whirlpool, sauna and exercise room. There is also an onsite restaurant and lounge, gift shop, guest laundry facilities, billiards and games room, free WiFi, as well as a free

- 1. A sightseeing tour of the highlights of Victoria including a stop to tour beautiful **Finnerty Gardens**. Finnerty has over 4,000 trees and shrubs including 1,500 rhododendron and azalea plants, and companion plants ferns, vines, groundcovers, ornamentals artistically displayed on six acres at the SW corner of University of the Victoria's campus.
- 2. A walking tour of Victoria's fabled Inner Harbour area with an entertaining local guide.
- 3. We visit **Craigdarroch Castle**, a Victorian-era Scottish Baronial mansion, designated a National Historic Site of Canada.
- 4. We tour the **Jewel Box Cottage and Gardens**, one of Victoria's most beautiful spring gardens. This intimate cottage garden combines a large collection of spring flowers and wonderful foliage plants, with shrubs to create layered artistic borders.
- 5. We tour the beautiful **Waterfront Garden** and the award winning **Four Seasons Garden** voted Canada's #1 Residential Garden by Canadian Gardening Magazine. It was designed with attention to foliage combinations as well as sequence of bloom (first bloom is in January!) This garden has been an ever evolving garden with new beds, hardscaping and new plant introduction.
- 6. We tour the beautiful gardens at **Government House** official residence of British Columbia's Lieutenant Governor. Then we visit **Ross Bay Villa Historic House** a fine example of 19th century Victorian architecture. Afternoon Tea is included today
- 7. A fascinating guided walking tour of Victoria's downtown will focus on the French History in the area.
- 8. We visit the gardens of Hatley Castle, which were developed over 100 years ago and are now a National Historic Site and home of Royal Roads University. The four major gardens Japanese Garden, Formal Italian Garden, Walled garden and Rose Garden are set in a classic Edwardian park design. A pub lunch is included today.
- 9. We visit the famous Butchart Gardens, a 50-acre showplace of numerous incredible gardens. Lunch at the Gardens is included. Later we enjoy a guided tour of the Robert Bateman Centre – an exhibit of original works by the world's greatest wildlife artist. The collection is the largest ever assembled for public view.
- 10. We visit Point Ellice House a beautifully kept Victorian house that belonged to the O'Reilly family for generations. This estate offers a vivid glimpse into the life of one of BC's most influential families of the 19th century. Lunch at a local restaurant is included. Later we visit Miniature World, which consists of over 85 miniature dioramas and displays. including the World's Largest Doll Houses circa 1880, the Great Canadian Railway, one of the World's Largest Model Railways, the World of Dickens and Olde London Towne of 1670.
- 11. We tour **Abkhazi Gardens** an exquisite heritage home and garden, former residence of Prince and Princess Abkhazi of Georgia (formerly in Russia) who settled in Victoria. After touring the gardens, Afternoon Tea will be served in the former living room.
- Join in on an informative talk on the wildlife and ecosystems found along BC's southern coast, before embarking on a nature walk to Beacon Hill Park with a local naturalist.

Day 1: Victoria. We fly to Victoria, and upon arrival transfer to our hotel. This afternoon join in on the Orientation discussion. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Wildlife and Ecosystems / Victoria. This morning we enjoy an informative talk about the wildlife and ecosystems found along BC's southern coast, before embarking on a nature walk to Beacon Hill Park with a naturalist guide. After our included lunch we board a vessel for an exciting marine wildlife viewing adventure along the southern coast of Vancouver Island and the Strait of Juan de Fuca. Keep your eyes peeled for possible sightings of seals, sea lions, eagles and other marine birds, porpoises and even orcas!

Day 3: Chemainus / Courtenay. We begin the day with a scenic drive up the coast to the quaint fishing village of Cowichan Bay, where we learn about the lifecycle of salmon and marine habitat preservation. We then stop in the charming town of Chemainus, once home to the largest enclosed sawmill in North America. The town is now known for its beautiful murals, which we can view during our free time in the town. We continue to Courtenay for a 3-night stay.

Day 4: Deep Bay Marine Field Station / Courtenay. We visit Deep Bay Marine Field Station where we learn more about Marine biology and ecosystems. After lunch at a local restaurant we proceed to the Courtney Museum for a talk and visit.

Day 5: Marine Wildlife and Whale Watching Safari / Courtenay. We proceed to Campbell River for our marine wildlife and whale watching safari aboard a comfortable marine vessel. The nutrient rich waters surrounding Campbell River and the Discovery Island region makes this one of the most popular marine wildlife viewing destinations in the world, offering a great opportunity to sight humpback whales, orcas, dolphins, porpoises, seals, sea lions, as well as bald eagles, with a backdrop of spectacular scenery. **Day 6: Tofino.** We continue to Errington and visit the North Island Wildlife Recovery Centre. This non-profit, volunteer facility provides care and medical attention to injured wildlife from all over Vancouver Island. After our visit we proceed to Coombs – a farmers market where goats live on the roof of the moss covered store. Then it's on to the fabled town of Tofino on the wild west coast of the island. With its ancient rainforest, vast stretches of white sand and massive waves pounding in from the Pacific Ocean, Tofino boasts one of Canada's most breathtaking locations.

Day 7: Wild Pacific Trail / Tofino. We travel to Ucluelet to join a local naturalist who will lead us on a walk along the Wild Pacific Trail, where we'll learn about the region's unique flora and fauna, and possibly see some whales. Later we'll stop at the Kwisitis Visitor Centre, which focuses on the natural and cultural heritage of Pacific Rim National Park Reserve.

Day 8: West Coast Black Bears / Nanaimo. Abundant to the West Coast of Vancouver Island, the Black Bear makes its presence known when the tides are low. They roam the shores in search of their favourite delicacy, the Rock Crab. Cruising through these scenic passageways allows for many opportunities to view other wildlife like herons, eagles, harbour seals and porpoises in their natural habitat. All the while the crew will entertain you with interesting facts about wildlife and the surrounding area. After our cruise we'll enjoy free time in Tofino before continuing to Cathedral Grove - an old growth forest of Douglas Fir, Western Red Cedar, Western Hemlock, Broadleaf Maple and Balsam Fir, with some trees estimated to be 800 years old. We then travel to Nanaimo on the east coast of Vancouver Island.

Day 9: Victoria. We head south and stop in Duncan, famous for its Totems, before arriving back in Victoria. We'll enjoy a city tour before checking into our hotel. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 10: Home. We fly home from Victoria.

Day 1: Cranbrook. We fly to Cranbrook, and transfer to the *St. Eugene Resort.* This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 2: Fort Steele / Kimberley / Cranbrook. We first visit Fort Steele Heritage Town where we'll go back in time to experience the "wild west" in this restored 1860's gold rush town. Then we proceed to Kimberley - an old Bavarian town in a spectacular location between the Purcell and the Rocky Mountains. Here we'll hop on the Underground Mining Railway train which makes its way through Mark Creek Valley to the historic Sullivan Mine, where we will have an informative tour. There will be time to stroll around Kimberley, where we can see the world's largest standing cuckoo clock, as well as Cominco Gardens - home to more than 100 memorial roses, before returning to Cranbrook.

Day 3: Invermere / Ktunaxa First Nations / Fairmont Hot

Springs. We visit the Ktunaxa Interpretive Centre where we will learn from our hosts about the history and culture of the First Nations who inhabited these lands since time immemorial. Then we head to Windermere Lake to explore the charming town of Invermere, with a stop to admire the Hoodoos at Dutch Creek. We will overnight at the iconic *Fairmont Hot Springs Resort*. Enjoy a relaxing dip in the hot pools before dinner.

Day 4: Radium Hot Springs / Golden. Morning at leisure to enjoy the activities offered at the resort. This afternoon we proceed to Radium Hot Springs, which sits in the Rocky Mountain Trench carved over millions of years by the Columbia River. Bighorn sheep roam the streets of the town and even on rooftops (providing great photo ops). A few trailheads are accessible from the town centre for a quick nature walk. The Visitor Information Centre hosts displays of wildlife and First Nations culture. We continue to Golden, where we will walk on the Kicking Horse pedestrian bridge, and enjoy a brewery tour.

Day 5: Yoho National Park. Today we'll have a guided tour of Yoho National Park (Yoho means 'awe' in Cree language) - the 2nd oldest National Park in Canada (after Banff). It is home to wonders ranging from powerful waterfalls and pristine lakes, to 500 million-year-old fossil beds.

Day 6: Rafting Trip / Buffalo Ranch / Rogers Pass / Three Valley Gap. We begin with an exhilarating rafting trip down the Kicking Horse River, followed by a visit of a buffalo ranch to experience these amazing creatures up close. Then we'll drive across one of this region's most spectacular mountain crossings, Rogers Pass, to Three Valley Gap for a 2-night stay.

Day 7: Railway Museum / The Enchanted Forest. We begin with a visit to the Revelstoke Railway Museum, which showcases the historic construction and operation of the Canadian Pacific Railway in Western Canada's mountain region. The railway played a pivotal role in the founding of Canada. In the afternoon we'll get close to nature along a boardwalk surrounded by a variety of trees (including a giant 800-year-old cedar grove), where we'll also see a natural display of edible plants, herbs and roots used by First Nations People for nutritional and medicinal purposes The trail also provides a magical setting for a display of over 350 folk art figurines, as well as BC's tallest, grandest tree house which rises 50-feet into the forest canopy, and a giant cedar stump house. This evening we'll enjoy a BBQ dinner in a one-of-akind dining room in the "Ghost Town" at our resort.

Day 8: Revelstoke / Nakusp. During the 19th-century mining boom, Columbia River sternwheelers connected the town of Revelstoke to the railway. Today we'll walk through this alpine city to see the many restored heritage buildings, followed by a visit of the Revelstoke Hydro Dam to see how the river's power is harnessed for electricity. Then we'll hop on a ferry for a short ride across Upper Arrow Lake. Admire the gorgeous scenery of the Monashee, Valhalla and Selkirk mountains, as well as the deep blue lake water. We proceed to Nakusp for our overnight.

Day 9: New Denver / Kaslo / Ainsworth Hot Springs. In New Denver we'll visit the Nikkei Internment Memorial Centre, which pays tribute to the internment of Japanese Canadians during World War 2. In the afternoon we'll tour the lovingly restored Victorian *SS Moyie* - the world's oldest intact passenger sternwheeler, and other attractions from this bygone era. Later we arrive at Ainsworth Hot Springs for a 2-night stay.

Day 10: Nelson / Ainsworth Hot Springs. We enjoy a morning at leisure to soak in the soothing mineral waters at our resort, with its large lounging pool and a stream-fed cold plunge. These hot springs feature an unusual horseshoe-shaped cave lined with stalagmites and stalactites. This afternoon we'll venture of on a self-guided walking tour of Nelson - the "Queen City of the Kootenays", to view the more than 350 Victorian heritage buildings, with a chance to visit the Touchstones Museum housed in a beautiful 1902 building.

Day 11: Salmo / Creston / Cranbrook. We first stop in Salmo, home to a number of distinctive stone murals, then proceed to the Creston Valley Wildlife Management Area - a refuge for more than 300 bird species and many kinds of mammals. Here you may either explore the wetlands by naturalist guided voyageur-style canoe, or on foot. The 3-story viewing tower provides a bird's-eye view of the marshland. Later we return to *St. Eugene Resort* for our Farewell Dinner and final overnight.

Day 12: Home. We head to the airport for our flight home.

Day 1: Halifax We fly to Halifax and transfer to our downtown hotel. The balance of the day is at your leisure.

Day 2: Halifax. On our city tour of Halifax our kilted guide will tell tales of the past, present and future of Nova Scotia's capital. We will walk through the Victorian Public Gardens and stop at the top of Citadel Hill to view the Harbour and downtown area. Afternoon at leisure. Our unique dinner this evening at the Grafton Street Theatre features a musical comedy!

Day 3: Peggy's Cove / Lunenberg / Annapolis Valley. Our first stop is at one of the most picturesque locations in the Maritimes, Peggy's Cove. Day 4: Annapolis Valley / Saint John. We travel along the historic Evangeline Trail and first stop at the Grand-Pré National Historic Site, made famous by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's poem, *Evangeline*. We then board the Fundy Rose ferry for a delightful cruise across the Bay of Fundy to the Loyalist City of Saint John.

Day 5: St. Andrew / Saint John. This morning's tour of Saint John includes the famous Loyalist Trail and the Reversing Falls, where the ocean waters rushing upstream form a whirling, foaming torrent. We spend the afternoon in the picturesque town of St. Andrew where you will have free time for lunch and shopping, then return to Saint John for our overnight.

Day 6: Hopewell Rocks / Moncton. Today we visit the impressive Hopewell Rocks. Take a moment to appreciate the intricacies of nature and explore the quiet coves with flowerpot-shaped rock formations bearing such names as "Mother-in-Law", "ET" and "Lover's Arch". We continue to Moncton for our overnight.

Then we travel through the bright green rolling countryside and visit the home of Anne of Green Gables at Cavendish, and the famous wharf in North Rustico. Day 9: Baddeck / Sydney. We return to Nova Scotia by ferry and proceed to Baddeck, located in the heart of Cape Breton's most picturesque area. We visit the Bell Museum, where the famous inventor perfected his many inventions, and then proceed to Sydney for our overnight.

Day 10: Cabot Trail / Sydney. A full day tour of the scenic Cabot Trail. Nature lovers and photographers will have a field day with the meandering glens, rugged coastlines and the constantly pounding surf.

Day 11: Louisbourg / Sydney. We proceed to the impressive Fortress of Louisbourg for a guided visit. This National Historic Site was the largest historic reconstruction in Canada. Tentative Itinerary for Newfoundland and Labrador

Day 1: Corner Brook. We fly to Deer Lake, Newfoundland. Upon arrival we transfer to our hotel in Corner Brook.

Day 2: Corner Brook. Our city tour includes Captain Cook's Lookout for a spectacular view over the city and the Bay of Islands. We then enjoy the scenic drive along the Captain Cook Trail to the charming fishing village of Lark Harbour. This afternoon we visit the Corner Brook Museum with its outstanding display of old maps and memorabilia from this area's logging and fishing heritage.

Day 3: Gros Morne National Park / Northern Peninsula.

Today we tour Gros Morne National Park with its dramatically beautiful scenery. We will enjoy an entertaining boat crossing on lovely Bonne Bay, stop for the spectacular view at Lobster Cove lighthouse, and see the famous Arches carved by the pounding ocean. We then proceed to our hotel on the Northern Peninsula.

Day 4: L'Anse aux Meadows / St. Anthony. We first visit L'Anse aux Meadows, the fascinating historic site of North America's first Viking Settlement. Next is the Grenfell Centre, commemorating the life of medical missionary Sir Wilfred Grenfell. We proceed to our hotel in St. Anthony.

Day 5: Labrador. This morning we take the ferry from St. Barbe across to Labrador (one and a half hours). Our sightseeing in Labrador includes Point Amour Lighthouse - the tallest in Atlantic Canada, and Red Bay Whaling Station - a UNESCO World Heritage Site that was a major site of Basque whaling in the 16th and 17th centuries.

Day 6: Gros Morne National Park. We ferry back to Newfoundland and return to beautiful Gros Morne National Park, this time for a two-night stay.

Day 7: Gros Morne National Park. We spend the day in the park and see some of the world's most unique geological features (the park is also designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site). Included is a cruise inside an ancient fjord on Western Brook Pond (weather permitting). Tonight we attend the Gros Morne Theatre Festival for some fine local entertainment.

Day 8: Gander. We begin with a visit of King's Point Whale Pavilion to see the impressive 52-foot humpback whale skeleton on display. We will have time at the popular Pottery Museum and Shop, and then enjoy a delicious "Lunch By the Sea" overlooking Green Bay. We continue to Grand Falls for a visit of the Salmonid Interpretation Centre - one of North America's largest fishing projects.

This evening we will enjoy a visit and talk by the former mayor of Gander who will describe the experience of how the townspeople opened their homes to thousands of stranded travellers on 9/11/2001, as depicted in the popular play "Come From Away".

Day 9: Twillingate / Gander. Our first stop is the Beothuk Interpretation Centre to learn of the indigenous people of the island. We then travel along the Road to the Isles to the rugged north coast and the fishing villages on Notre Dame Bay. We continue to Twillingate - one of the oldest seaports in Newfoundland and still a fishing and sealing town. Here we visit the Twillingate Museum with its fine collection of antiques, and St. Peter's - the oldest wooden church in Newfoundland. This evening we enjoy a "Jiggs" dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 10: Clarenville. We travel through Terra Nova Provincial Park and on to the picturesque historical fishing port of Trinity - first used by fishing ships around the 16th century and recognized for its beautiful heritage buildings. Our overnight is in nearby Clarenville.

Day 11: St. John's. We travel along the rugged coastline past scenic Conception Bay. We stop in Heart's Content to visit the Cable Station, then continue on to St. John's.

Day 12: St. John's. St. John's is one of North America's oldest settlements. Our city tour will trace this history and will include a visit to Signal Hill with its striking view of the city and historic port. Afternoon at leisure to explore this friendly, charming city. You may want to stroll in Old St. John's to shop for local handicrafts.

Day 13: Whale Watching / St. John's. We embark on an exhilarating marine wildlife adventure to Witless Bay Reserve - home to thousands of puffins and the best whale watching in North America. On the way back to St. John's, we stop at Cape Spear - the most easterly point of land in North America. This historic sight was, in WWII, used as a strategic defense position against Nazi submarines. The rugged scenery here is spectacular. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner featuring a traditional "Screech-In".

Day 14: Home. We fly home from St. John's.

California

Day 1: Departure / San Francisco. We depart for San Francisco. Upon arrival we transfer to our hotel in the heart of the city, with time at leisure before our Welcome Dinner.

Day 1: Nashville. We depart for Nashville, and upon arrival transfer to the *Gaylord Opryland Resort* where we will experience the finest in Southern hospitality.

Itinerary for Quebec's Gaspé & St. Lawrence

Day 1: Departure / Montreal. We depart by coach for Montreal. Upon arrival we check-in to our centrally located hotel, and enjoy our Welcome Dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 2: Saint-Jean-Port-Joli / Rivière-du-Loup. Our first stop today is Saint-Jean-Port-Joli. For generations the local artisans here have depicted French Canadian customs through sculptures displayed throughout the village. We will visit the Woodcarving Interpretation Centre and enjoy some time at leisure. Later we continue to Rivière-du-Loup on the south shore of the St. Lawrence River, for a 2-night stay.

Day 3: Whale Watching Cruise / Rivière-du-Loup. We embark on a half-day cruise at one of the world's best whale-watching sites. We should see various species of whales, including belugas, as well as seal colonies and a variety of seabirds, all the while enjoying the beauty of the rugged coast dotted with islands and heritage lighthouses. The afternoon is at leisure in Rivière-du-Loup to stroll along the promenade by the river, visit the St. Lawrence Exploration Centre or simply enjoy the facilities of our First Class hotel. Don't miss the stunning sunset on the St. Lawrence estuary!

Day 4: New Richmond. We continue along the St. Lawrence through the picturesque Matapédia Valley - renowned for its salmon rivers, heritage homes, historic churches and covered bridges. We will learn about the history of fisheries in Eastern Canada through images, artifacts and live storytelling. Then we head to quaint Percé village, with the famous nearby Percé Rock rising out of the sea. We will visit Percé's new attraction, Geopark. Supported by UNESCO, one of the main features of the park is a suspended glass walkway offering spectacular views over Percé Rock, and trails to some other local geological wonders. We will enjoy a 2-night stay in this wonderful place. Tonight we enjoy a dinner of fresh lobster at a local restaurant.

Day 6: Percé. This morning we enjoy an unforgettable cruise around Percé Rock and Bonaventure Island, where we can view the spectacle of 250,000 nesting birds (including puffins) on the rugged cliffs. You may want to disembark on the Island for a close encounter with the largest community of Northern Gannet in North America. The afternoon is at leisure to either enjoy a nature walk on Bonaventure Island or Percé Rock, or take in the spectacular views from the promenade along the seafront, lively with boutique shops and cafés.

Day 7: Matane. We enjoy the scenic drive around the Gaspé Peninsula, with its perfect blend of sea and mountains, coastal villages and sheltered fishing coves. En route we visit the Musée de la Gaspésie, and then venture into Forillon National Park, bordered by the Gulf of St. Lawrence and Gaspé Bay. The scenery is stunning here with its boreal forest, unique geological formations and abundant wildlife. In the afternoon we travel to Matane, famous for its "Nordic shrimps", windmills and the Matane River - the only place in Quebec where you can fish in the town square!

Day 8: Reford Gardens / Kamouraska / Quebec City. Our first stop today is Reford Gardens, internationally renowned as an exceptional horticultural achievement with its 3000 native and exotic plants. Then we visit the town of Kamouraska, with its old-world charm, ancestral homes and mesmerizing seascape. There will be some free time to perhaps enjoy some smoked eel or browse in the handicraft shops. We end this wonderful day in charming Quebec City for a 2-night stay by the old city walls.

Day 9: Quebec City. On our guided city tour we see Place Royal, little Champlain Quarter, the Plains of Abraham and more. In the afternoon we visit the iconic Château Frontenac for a guided tour and a special Afternoon Tea overlooking the Saint Lawrence River. Itinerary for Ancient Touring Routes of England

Day 1: Depart. We depart for London.

Day 2: Bristol. We arrive and transfer to our centrally located hotel in Bristol for a 6-night stay. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Bristol. Later we visit Bradfordon-Avon. Surrounded by glorious countryside, the ancient bridge in the centre of the town still retains its original 13thcentury arches. Next, we visit Castle Combe, known as 'The Prettiest Village in England' and with good reason. Step back several centuries as you stroll through this relaxed village of honey-toned Cotswold-stone cottages.

Day 8: Cotswolds / Blenheim. We leave Bristol and meander through the gentle hillsides and sleepy, honey-coloured villages of the Cotswolds - a designated area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. We arrive at Blenheim Palace - birthplace of Winston Churchill. This National Treasure houses some of Europe's finest antique collections. We'll tour the State Rooms and discover over 300 years of history. There will be time to explore this World Heritage Site and the 2000 acres of landscaped parkland, featuring some of the finest views in England. On this tour we will visit various styles of gardens, including those created by Britain's most famous landscape architects, such as Vita Sackville-West, Christopher Lloyd and Capability Brown. We will also discover some of Britain's grandiose estates and learn of their turbulent and romantic past.

We begin with a 7-night stay in the county of Kent, known as the 'Garden of England'. One of Britain's oldest counties, Kent is not only known for its enchanting gardens, but it is also home to more castles and historic houses than any other region of England. It has been the playground to royals and aristocrats for centuries.

We spend the next 6 nights in London - "Everybody's Favourite City". Our centrally located hotel is the perfect base for both touring and exploring on our own.

Itinerary for Stately Homes and Gardens of England

Day 1: Departure. We depart for London.

Day 2: Kent. We arrive and transfer to our 4-star hotel located on the edge of Canterbury, our home for the next 7 nights.

Day 3: Canterbury. We visit the jewel of Kent - Canterbury, where we embark on a historic river "punt" - a unique vantage point to see Canterbury's stunning architecture. On our city tour we will visit England's oldest cathedral (seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury) and see the beautiful cloisters, side alleys and chapels which have evolved over the ages.

Day 4: Leeds / Sissinghurst. We begin with a visit to 'The World's Loveliest Castle'. Set in 500 acres of beautiful parkland, Leeds Castle was the private property of 6 medieval English monarchs and is now one of Britain's most visited historic buildings. Later we visit Sissinghurst Castle, created by Harold Nicholson and Vita Sackville-West in the 1930's and is one of the world's most celebrated 20th century gardens.

Day 5: Isle of Thanet / Coastal Towns. Once an island off the English coast, the Isle of Thanet was where the Romans landed when they invaded Britain. Today it is home to a string of lovely Victorian seaside towns. We enjoy a walking tour of picturesque St. Peter's, where the past is brought to life by costumed characters! Then we stop in Margate - an old English seaside town that now has a modern flavour. We will stop at the Spitfire Museum, home to famous WW2 fighter planes. Dinner will be at a lovely 15th century coaching inn.

Day 6: At Leisure. Our hotel is a 10 minute walk from the centre of Canterbury, with its many boutiques, pubs, cafes and pedestrian streets. Tonight we enjoy some local entertainment.

Day 7: Great Dixter / Rye. Great Dixter was the family home of the famous gardener Christopher Lloyd, and since this historic house and garden was the focus of his work for over 40 years, it has become a centre of education and a place of pilgrimage for horticulturists from all over the world. We then visit medieval Rye - an important harbour since Roman times, where we will learn about its smuggled secrets and timeless tales, and discover many of its ancient nooks and crannies. Our day ends with dinner in a pub full of character!

Day 8: Hever Castle / Penshurst Place. Today we visit two historic estates located just a few miles apart and brought together by Henry VIII and Anne Boleyn. We start with Penshurst Place, once the hunting lodge of Henry VIII. It is now considered 'the grandest and most perfectly preserved example of a fortified manor house in all England'. The Head Gardener will show us around one of the finest examples of Elizabethan design gardens. Then we visit Hever Castle, childhood home of Anne Boleyn (2nd wife of Henry VIII and mother of Elizabeth I). This castle was the unlikely backdrop to a series of tumultuous events that changed the course of Britain's history, monarchy and religion. Included today is a delicious 'proper' cream tea.

Day 9: Chatham Dockyards / London. En route to London we visit Chatham's Historic Dockyard. For 400 years the Royal Dockyard at Chatham made ships for the Royal Navy, including the nation's most loved – *HMS Victory*. We enjoy a tour and lunch, then proceed to London for a 6-night stay.

Day 10: London. On our city tour we will see sites such as Big Ben, Trafalgar Square, the Tower of London and much more. Just a short walk from our hotel we visit the Royal Albert Hall one of London's most iconic buildings. Experience the excitement inside one of the world's most famous venues as it prepares for the next performance. The afternoon is at leisure.

Day 11: Savill Gardens. In the heart of historic Windsor Great Park lies Savill Gardens. With plants collected from around the world this is one of England's finest woodland gardens. Today we also enjoy a narrated cruise along the River Thames which will provide some of the best distant views of Windsor Castle.

Day 12: Royal Botanical Gardens (Kew). We visit the worldfamous UNESCO World Heritage Site of Kew Gardens - a beautiful botanical gardens as well as the most biodiverse place on Earth, with over 50,000 living plants. From Victorian glasshouses to an Alpine rock garden, there is something to see in every corner. For dinner we will dine in a modern pub, overlooking the gardens.

Day 13: London. A day at leisure for you to explore on your own.

Day 14. Hampton Court Palace / Wimbledon. This morning we visit the magnificent Hampton Court Palace, grown from humble beginnings in the 11th century to one of the finest palaces in the world. You can explore the Tudor kitchen, see the Queen and King's apartments and admire the sumptuous tapestries in England's greatest Great Hall. Outside, try not to get lost in the world's most famous maze and the Privy Garden, restored to its 1702 glory. Our next stop is Wimbledon, where we can experience the history of 'The Fortnight' in the museum, get up close to the Championship Trophies and, feel the fabrics of tennis fashions from the Victorian era with clothing and equipment donated by tennis' top stars. Dinner tonight is in a 19th-century cottage on the edge of Wimbledon Common. Our Farewell Dinner will be in an elegant English pub!

Day 15: Home. Air Canada takes us home.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for London.

Day 2: Bury St Edmunds. We arrive in London and transfer to the historic market town of Bury St Edmunds, for a 3-night stay.

Day 3: Hertfordshire. The southernmost section of The Explorer's Road is the county of Hertfordshire. The town of Hertford is laid out in its original medieval plan, and on our walking tour we'll notice that there is a pub on every street, due to Hertford's brewing legacy. We'll enjoy a tour of Castle Brewery and then stop in Hitchin, which feels like a quaint English village with its timber-framed buildings and cobbled streets. Here we'll visit the Henry Moore Studio and Gardens.

Day 4: Norfolk. Our tour of historic Norfolk begins at Holkham Hall, where a stunning coastal landscape meets one of England's great agricultural estates. We proceed to Norwich, for a walking tour of this unique city which is a designated UNESCO City of Literature.

Day 5: Stamford / Leeds. We begin with a walking tour of the handsome Georgian town of Stamford, with its unspoilt streets of honey-coloured stone buildings. It has been called 'England's most attractive town' and has formed the backdrop for countless films. Next we visit Burghley House - a grand 16th century house and an impressive example of the Elizabethan 'prodigy' houses. We end in Leeds, for a 4-night stay.

Day 6: York. The beautifully preserved medieval city of York has both Roman roots and a Viking past. We will walk the famous "Shambles" - a street of 14th century timber-framed buildings, and see York Minster - the largest gothic cathedral in Northern Europe. After a leisurely river cruise we'll have some free time to explore the city's cobbled streets. Dinner will be at a country pub before returning to our hotel in Leeds.

Day 7: Leeds. A day at leisure in this city which is bursting with cultural energy. You may want to visit one of the impressive museums, like the Leeds Art Gallery or the Royal Armouries Museum, go shopping in one of the quaint Victorian arcades, or for foodies, explore Leeds' renowned independant food scene!

Day 8: Bradford. Bradford is well known for its spectacular Victorian architecture, in fact there are 55 listed buildings here! Our tour will take in Little Germany and the Grade 1 listed iconic City Hall with its amazing 220-foot-high clock tower which rises above the skyline. After our tour we'll enjoy a leisurely ride on the The Keighley & Worth Valley Railway - a preserved gauge line which runs 5-miles through the valley. **Day 9: Darlington / Durham.** This region of the Explorer's Road is an intriguing combination of industrial heritage and remote, wild countryside. Our first stop is the busy market town of Darlington. With modern boutiques lining medieval streets, arts hubs dotting the town centre and lively markets everywhere, the town is a perfect blend of old and new. We then visit the 1000-year-old city of Durham, and stroll along the cobbled streets and riverside footpaths, viewing some of England's finest architecture and hearing gripping tales of kings, bishops and local people who have made Durham one of England's most historically fascinating cities. We visit Durham Cathedral - a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site, then proceed to Newcastle for a 3-night stay.

Day 10: Alnwick. 950-year-old Alnwick Castle dates back to Norman times, and boasts an illustrious history. It has served as a military outpost, a teaching college, a refuge for evacuees, a film set, and a family home. After our castle tour we'll head to the coast for a delicious lunch of fish and chips!

Day 11: Newcastle-upon-Tyne. With impressive Neo-classical monuments and winding medieval streets, Newcastle-upon-Tyne is a favourite UK destination. On our city tour we'll see the green arc of the iconic Tyne Bridge, Grey's Monument and Grey Street, and Antony Gormley's *Angel of the North* - the largest angel sculpture in the world! The afternoon is at leisure to explore this city on our own.

Day 12: The Borders. We cross into Scotland, and our first stop is Hawick, where tweed was invented. We'll visit a woolen mill (for purchasing opportunities) and the Borders Distillery, then enjoy a tour of Abbotsford, home of the famour author Sir Walter Scott. We proceed to Scotland's capital, Edinburgh, for our final 3 nights.

Day 13: Edinburgh. On our city tour we'll see Edinburgh Castle, Holyrood Palace, The Houses of Parliament, The Royal Mile, Princes Street Gardens, The Old and New Towns and much more. We'll visit the Royal Yacht Britannia - a Royal residence for over 40 years. The yacht sailed over a million nautical miles on state visits with the Royal Family. Tonight we enjoy a rousing night of Scottish food and entertainment!

Day 14: Edinburgh. A day at leisure, and there is so much to see and do. Explore the Medieval Old Town and the elegant Georgian New Town, the Castle, one of the many museums, Princes Gardens or enjoy a pint in one of the many pubs! Tonight we enjoy our Farewell Dinner and share memories of our journey along the Explorers Road!

Day 1: Departure. We depart for London.

Day 2: Bath. We arrive and transfer to our first class hotel, centrally located in the UNESCO World Heritage city of Bath, for a 3-night stay. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Bath. We enjoy a morning walking tour of Bath. Famous for its Roman Spa, gothic Abbey and elegant Georgian architecture, it is considered one of Britain's most beautiful cities. Afternoon at leisure.

Day 13: Exeter. Exeter is one of the most vibrant and historical cities in England. Itinerary for The Heart of England

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Manchester.

Day 2: Church Stretton. We arrive and transfer to our countryhouse hotel in Church Stretton for a 7-night stay. Known as Britain's "Little Switzerland", the rolling hills here offer fabulous views in all directions. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Shrewsbury. Shrewsbury is home to 660 listed buildings, and is most famous as the birthplace of Charles Darwin. His statue sits by Shrewsbury Library, which was his school. Our guided tour will take in the stunning Tudor buildings and bring to life their history. Then we'll enjoy beautiful views along the Severn River on a cruise with entertaining commentary. There will be free time to explore Shrewsbury's shops, cafes and cozy pubs.

Day 4: Stokesay Castle. Stokesay Castle is England's bestpreserved fortified medieval manor house, with a great hall unchanged for over 700 years. See the characters carved in the 17th-century gatehouse, and climb to the top of a fairytale tower for breathtaking views of the Shropshire Hills.

Day 5: Ironbridge. This World Heritage Site was the heart of the Industrial Revolution. We begin at Blists Hill Victorian Town, where we meet the Victorians and learn about their culture. Then at the Jackfield Tile Museum we'll see magnificent tiles that decorated Victorian Britain. Finally, we'll walk across the famous Iron Bridge and see the charming Tollhouse.

Day 6: At Leisure. A free day. You may want to stroll through the extensive grounds and the woodland sculpture trail that threads through the trees, dip into the heated outdoor pool, relax in the lounge with its wall of glass showing the idyllic views of our surroundings, or enjoy a local pint of Shropshire Lad or Lass with your fellow guests. The town is a few minutes walk away and offers shops, pubs and cafes.

Day 7: Ludlow. We'll enjoy a tour and free time in Ludlow - a thriving medieval market town and architectural gem with a lively community feel. The historic town centre and the 11th century Ludlow Castle both sit on a cliff above the river, surrounded by the beautiful countryside of Shropshire and the Welsh Marches. Then in Kidderminster, we'll board the Steam Train for the 16-mile journey to Bridgnorth. Breathtaking scenery, and charming towns and villages, make every trip on the Severn Valley Railway unforgettable.

Day 8: Birmingham. Birmingham was one of the world's greatest industrial cities. On our tour we'll see the canals (the

'roads' of the 18th century), and the impressive Victorian buildings, including the Jewellery Quarter where skilled workers produced their wares. After some free time we'll head back to our hotel, stopping first at the 'model' village at Bournville created by the Cadbury (chocolate) family.

Day 9: Peak District. We head to the magnificent Peak district, stopping en route at RAF Cosford to hear amazing stories of the brave pilots who served in the Royal Air Force, and see the fantastic display of old aircrafts and other exhibits. Later we arrive at Dovedale, for a 3-night stay.

There are 25 rooms to explore, including the magnificent Painted Hall, regal State Rooms, restored Sketch Galleries and beautiful Sculpture Gallery. After our visit we stop in Bakewell, best known for its unique and delicious pudding. With its mellow stone building and quaint courtyards, Bakewell is a magnet for painters and photographers.

Day 12: Manchester. We proceed to Manchester, the world's first Industrial City. We'll enjoy a city tour which will include a visit of the RHS Garden Bridgewater - one of Europe's largest gardening projects, which blends the heritage of an old garden with contemporary designs and world-class horticulture.

Day 13. Manchester. A day at leisure to explore this diverse and energetic city. The city centre is packed with unique restaurants, cafés, shops, museums, and the Salford Quays where you may want to visit the BBC Media City, or the Award Winning Imperial War Museum. You may also want to visit the Old Trafford Stadium - famous home of the Manchester United Football Club! Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

With a blend of cultures and an enviably mild climate, the Channel Islands have long been a favourite destination for both the British and the French.

Although they lie just 14 miles off the French coast, the islands are British, having been connected to the British Crown for over a thousand years. These self-governing islands maintain their own individual culture. The food and wine are French, but habits and manners are English.

We begin with 4 nights on Guernsey, an island full of local charm and stunning beaches and seascapes. The wealth of history here includes Neolithic settlements, smuggler and pirate adventures, and the German Occupation during WWII. St. Peter Port is the lively, compact capital, with cobbled streets and a picturesque marina. It is considered to be one of England's prettiest harbour towns.

The other 9 nights will be on the island of Jersey, the largest of the islands. It is known for its glorious woodland walks, lovely rolling countryside, historic castles, Victorian markets and interesting sightseeing. The capital, St. Helier, is built around a harbour, and the town itself is a maze of narrow streets, many of which are banned to traffic, and is situated on one of Jersey's best beaches.

Day 2: Guernsey. We arrive on the island of Guernsey and transfer to our hotel located on the outskirts of St. Peter Port. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Guernsey Island Tour. We follow the beautiful Guernsey coastline past picturesque beaches, through Val de Terre and the former garrison of Fort George. The Germans occupied the Channel Islands during WW2, so we'll see fortifications and other reminders of those days of occupation. We'll have a tour of Sausmarez Manor - a stately home built in the 13th century which serves as a time capsule of the many generations of the family that has lived here for 700 years. The house is believed to be haunted and you may return here on our free day for the "Ghost Tour". We also visit the Little Chapel, beautifully decorated with seashells, pebbles and broken china. It is thought to be the smallest chapel in the world.

Day 4: St. Peter Port and Herm. We stroll through St. Peter Port and learn about its history dating back to Norman times. The town consists of lovely cobbled streets and narrow lanes lined by old shop fronts and impressive houses. Later we'll take the short ferry ride to the idyllic island of Herm, which is steeped in history and mystery. It has been home to Neolithic man, monks, quarrymen, farmers, writers, artists and entrepreneurs.

Day 5: Guernsey. A day at leisure to explore on our own. You may want to take an excursion to the quaint island of Sark.

Day 6: Jersey. We take the one-hour ferry crossing to Jersey, and transfer to our hotel located just outside the capital, St. Helier.

Day 7: Walking Tour. We enjoy a guided walk through town, visiting Royal Square, wonderful Victorian Markets and Liberation Square. We end at the Jersey Museum and Art Gallery with a viewing of the 'Story of Jersey' film. The afternoon is free to perhaps explore the town or stroll in the lovely park near our hotel.

Day 8: Mont Orgueil. Mont Orgueil Castle has cast its imposing shadow over the beautiful fishing port of Gorey for over 800 years, and is one of the world's most well-preserved medieval fortresses. Take in the breathtaking views of the French coast as our guide takes us through the network of staircases, towers, secret rooms and hidden treasures. This afternoon we visit Woodland Farm to meet the Boutillier family, who have been raising Jersey cows for 5 generations. Included is a scrumptious traditional Cream Tea.

Day 9: St Malo. We board a ferry to St. Malo (90 minute crossing). As we walk through the cobbled streets of St. Malo's spectacular old town we'll feel as though we've stepped back in time. The quaint cobbled and bustling streets are lined with cafes, buskers and shops selling various traditional Malouin and Breton fare and goods.

Day 10: Orchid and Wine. The Channel Islands are known for their beautiful orchids, so this morning we visit the world famous Eric Young Orchid Foundation. Later we enjoy a vineyard tour and wine tasting at La Mare Vineyards. They also make their own chocolate (which we will sample) and many types of preserves, all available in the winery shop.

Day 11: At Leisure / Liberation Day. The Channel Islands were the only part of Britain to be occupied by German forces in WW2. The five-year occupation came to an end on May 9th, 1945 - Liberation Day, considered Jersey's national day which is celebrated annually on this date. The streets of St. Helier come alive with patriotic pride and bands, parades, street entertainment, street markets, food stalls and more!

Day 12: Durrell Wildlife. We visit the Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust. Founded by the celebrity naturalist Gerald Durrell, this wildlife zoo is dedicated to saving threatened wildlife species from extinction. We will have an orientation of the zoo, followed by some free time to explore on your own.

Day 13: Jersey War Tunnels. We tour this underground complex, Jersey's most evocative museum of the five years of enemy occupation during World War II. The video presentation and collection of memorabilia bring the island's wartime experience to life; a poignant and unforgettable experience. After our visit we will enjoy a traditional pub lunch.

Day 14: At Leisure. There is so much to do and see on the island (your Tour Manager will assist). This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 15: Home. We fly home via London.

Railroads and Waterways of Britain

This unique tour takes in some of Britain's Canal Waterways and Welsh Railways.

The UK is criss-crossed with incredible canals and waterways that meander through stunning countryside and skirt past quaint towns and villages. A beautiful by-product of the industrial revolution and a testament to human engineering, these canals would have been heaving with cargo and people when they were first created. Now they make for a calm, quiet and relaxing way to explore Britain's varied landscapes.

Likewise, the Great Little Trains of Wales are a very special way of seeing some of the best scenery in the British Isles. While each of these narrow gauge steam railways are unique in their own way, all of them have a history spanning well over 100 years, and so they have the charm of old-time steam trains with plenty of polished paintwork and brass. The special attraction of narrow gauge railways lies in their modest size compared with mainline trains, and their leisurely speed gives time to take in some of the splendid scenery.

Itinerary for British Railroads and Waterways

Day 1: Depart. We depart for London.

Day 2: Bourton-on-the-Water. We arrive and head to Bourton-on-the-Water for our 4-night stay. This town is known as the 'Venice of the Cotswolds' because of the lovely small bridges that cross the river that runs through the centre of town. Our hotel is centrally located in the town.

Day 3: Kennet and Avon Canal. The Queen reopened the Kennet and Avon Canal in 1990, after it had been extensively refurbished by dedicated waterway enthusiasts and local volunteers. It runs through spectacular scenery between the Thames at Reading and the Avon at Bristol. We'll enjoy a horse-drawn boat trip down Kennet and Avon Canal, then we'll return to Bourton-on-the-Water for free time in the village for exploring and shopping.

Day 4: Cotswolds Canals, River Severn and National Waterway Museum. At Stroud we visit a restored section of one of the Cotswolds Canals, then on to Saul Junction where it meets the Gloucester and Sharpness Ship Canal. We proceed to Gloucester Docks to visit the National Waterway Museum and take a boat trip on the Ship Canal.

Day 5: Grand Union Canal and Blisworth Tunnel. We go to Northamptonshire, and at the Grand Union Canal we visit the canal museum and enjoy a boat trip to Blisworth Tunnel. In the afternoon we visit Braunston where the Grand Union and Oxford Canals meet. See the boats moving to their locks, the workshops and basins, all in a rural idyllic setting.

Day 6: Ludlow / Snowdonia. We bid a fond farewell to the Cotswolds and our waterway excursions, and we head to Snowdonia in Wales stopping first in Ludlow. Nestled in an area of outstanding natural beauty in the heart of the Shropshire Hills, the town has a history of over 800 years and is surrounded by almost 500 listed buildings. From it's ancient Castle to its peaceful back streets with many cafes, bars, shops, and beautiful, fascinating architecture, exploring Ludlow is a real pleasure. Later we arrive at our Country House hotel for a 7-night stay.

Day 7: Aberystwyth Cliff Railway and the Vale of Rheidol

Railway. We go to Aberystwyth to ride on the Cliff Railway which should give excellent views if the weather is favourable. Then to the Vale of Rheidol Railway which opened in 1902, for a trip through beautiful scenery to Devil's Bridge and return. **Day 8: Corris, Talyllyn and Fairbourne Railways.** We will ride on three narrow-gauge lines today. First, the section of the Corris Railway that has recently re-opened. On to the Talyllyn Railway which has managed to keep running since 1865. Finally we go to the Fairbourne Railway for a journey to the Barmouth estuary and return.

Day 9: At leisure. You may want to visit the nearby historic market town of Dolgellau, or venture further to Portmeirion - a quaint Italianate village well-known as the setting for the cult 1960's TV series "The Prisoner".

Day 10: Snowdon Mountain Railway and Llanberis Lake Railway. Today, weather permitting, we will ascend Snowdon by the unique rack Snowdon Mountain Railway which dates from 1896. Then we take the narrow-gauge Llanberis Lake Railway along the shores of Llyn Padarn, with the opportunity to visit the National Slate Museum

Day 11: Welshpool and Llanfair Railway and Bala Lake Railway. We head over to the charming Welshpool and Llanfair Railway, and travel through delightful pastoral scenery. Then it's on to ride the Bala Lake Railway - a narrow-gauge line re-opened on the former Great Western main line from Ruabon to Barmouth.

Day 12: Ffestiniog Railway and the Welsh Highland

Railway. We take a journey on the two lines centred on Porthmadog. First, the Ffestiniog from Blaenau Ffestiniog to Porthmadog, which includes dramatic scenery and a spiral curve at Dduallt. Then on the Welsh Highland Railway, which passes through picturesque country with views of Snowdon (hopefully!) on its way to Caernarfon.

Day 13: Llandudno / Chester. We head to the seaside town of Llandudno, for some free time before we reach our final destination, Chester. The striking beauty and unique atmosphere makes Chester one of Britain's most popular destinations.

Day 14: Chester. On our walking tour of the city we see Britain's most complete city walls, its oldest racecourse and its largest Roman Amphitheatre, plus a 1000-year-old Cathedral with Europe's finest example of medieval carvings. The afternoon is at leisure to explore the attractions, cafés, pubs or the 700-year-old Rows galleries - a shopping delight! This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 15: Home. We fly direct from Manchester to Toronto.

BRITAIN

Itinerary for Bonnie Scotland

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Glasgow (non-stop from Toronto).

Day 2: Edinburgh. We arrive and transfer to our hotel in central Edinburgh for time to relax before our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Edinburgh. Our welcoming city guide takes us through the 'Old' and 'New" towns (combined they now have UNESCO World Heritage status). We will visit the Royal Yacht Britannia - home to the Queen and the Royal Family for over 40 years, (they sailed over 1,000,000 miles around the world on this yacht). This evening we attend the Edinburgh Tattoo.

Day 4: Inverness. Our first stop is St Andrews, home to the famous golf course and University. During our walking tour we see the ruins of St. Andrews cathedral, the castle and a glimpse into the campus grounds. You will have free time to enjoy the ancient town. This afternoon we travel into the hills of the highlands as we make our way to the city of Inverness.

Day 5: Wick. A day of breathtaking scenery as we make our way to the remote north. We stop at Culloden, where Bonnie Prince Charlie was defeated in 1745. We also visit Dunrobin Castle - perched on a high terrace above walled gardens, with fairytale spires and turrets, this castle rises above the North Sea like a picture from a storybook. We overnight near Wick.

Day 6: Orkney Islands / Wick. We drive to the northernmost tip of Scotland and board a ferry for the short crossing to South Ronaldsay, one of the Orkney Islands. Our local guide will show us the the Italian Chapel, the Ring of Brodgar (Orkney's Stonehenge) and Kirkwall - the island capital with a Viking flavour and red sandstone cathedral. We ferry back to the mainland. Tonight is an evening of Scottish entertainment.

Day 7: Ullapool. Few places in the world match the mountains, moors and beaches of Scotland's northwest coast. We first visit Smoo Caves, Britain's largest limestone cave, then continue to the picturesque fishing village of Ullapool.

Day 8: Inverewe / Drumnadrochit. We continue along the coast, taking in the spectacular vistas of the Summer Isles, and arrive at Inverewe Gardens. This world-famous historic garden is a lush, tropical oasis perched on a peninsula on Loch Ewe amid rugged landscape. Later we arrive in the Highland village of Drumnadrochit for a 3-night stay.

Day 9: Skye. Today we explore the magical Isle of Skye - the largest of the Inner Hebrides islands, and home to some of Scotland's most iconic landscapes. After crossing the Skye Bridge, we stop in the quaint town of Broadford, then proceed to the Trotternish Peninsula to view Kilt Rock - a 90 metre basalt column that looks like a pleated kilt. Our final stop is the picture-postcard harbour town of Portree. There will be free time to explore and try the best fish & chips in Scotland!

Day 10: Loch Ness. Our exporation of Loch Ness begins at Fort Augustus, where we see the ladder locks of the Caledonian Canal. After a visit of the Clansman Centre we take in the spectacular views as we circumnavigate the Loch. A highlight will be our narrated Jacobite Cruise that will take us to the 1000-year-old Urquhart Castle, considered the greatest castle in the Highlands. Before returning to the hotel, we enjoy a delicious meal at the local Inn.

Day 11: Isle of Mull. A day of spectacular scenery as we drive along the Great Glen, stopping at Spean Bridge to visit the Commando Memorial and hopefully see the top of Ben Nevis. Making our way along the Road to the Isles, we arrive in the thriving port of Mallaig and board our ferry to Tobermory - the picture-perfect main town on the Isle of Mull, and then proceed to our hotel for a 2-night stay.

Day 12: Iona / Isle of Mull. We enjoy the scenic drive past rugged mountains, dramatic sea lochs and small villages until we board a ferry to the sacred island of Iona. Known as the "cradle of Christianity", this wee island attracts thousands of pilgrims each year, not only for religion, but also for the unspoiled nature and tranquil atmosphere.

Day 13: Stirling / Glasgow. We sail back to the mainland and make our way through Glen Coe - Scotland's most famous and scenic glen. We'll visit Stirling Castle - once a residence of the Stewart Kings and Queens and one of Scotland's most historically important sites. After our visit we proceed to our centrally located hotel in Glasgow for our final 3 nights.

Day 14: Glasgow. Glasgow is renowned for its culture, prizewinning Victorian architecture and the friendliness of its people. Our city tour will show us the City Chambers, Central Station, University of Glasgow, and Glasgow Cathedral. We end at the River Clyde, most notably known for shipbuilding, and visit the Clyde Distillery, where we'll taste their famous Lowland-style Single Malt Whisky and learn about Glasgow's history and its bonds with the whisky industry.

Day 15: Glasgow. A day at leisure. Glasgow is home to some of Scotland's best cultural attractions, with many museums, galleries and unique shops (next to London's West End Glasgow is considered the second largest retail centre in the UK). This evening, we enjoy our Farewell Dinner and raise a glass to cheer 'Slainte' to this brilliant tour of Scotland.

Day 16: Home. We fly non-stop to Toronto.

Itinerary for Scottish Rail & Sail

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Glasgow.

Day 2: Pitlochry. Upon arrival we transfer to Pitlochry. Our hotel is located right in the centre of this beautiful Victorian town. The hotel's claim to fame, and one of the biggest surprises, is the award-winning gardens.

Day 3: Blair Atholl / Alltshellach. The spectacular Blair Castle has acted as gatekeeper to the Scottish Highlands for over 700 years. We will discover the turbulent history of the castle, which was home to the Duke of Atholl and Britain's only private army - the Atholl Highlanders. Our next stop is Athol Distillery, situated at the gateway to the Highlands, where we learn about their distilling process and enjoy a dram of their famous single malt. Then we proceed to *Alltshellach House* for a 7-night stay. This fine highland residence sits on the dramatic shores of Loch Leven, with magnificent mountain views, excellent accommodation and superb home-cooked meals.

Day 4: Strathspey Railway. We board the Strathspey Railway for a round-trip journey from Aviemore to Broomhill. It is the longest heritage railway in Scotland and has some beautifully restored stations and beautiful views.

Day 5: The Jacobite. One of the tour highlights - a ride on the steam-hauled 'Jacobite' train from Fort William to Mallaig. The journey is incredibly scenic - taking in the spectacular viaduct at Glenfinnan and outstanding coastal scenery around Arisaig. Widely regarded as one of the world's greatest train journeys, this journey is known as the railway that took Harry Potter all the way to Hogwarts. There will be time to explore the bustling fishing port of Mallaig.

Day 6: At Leisure. There are plenty of local walking routes, so you may want to explore the countryside, or use the public transport and head into Fort William for some shopping. Your Tour Manager will suggest and assist.

Day 7: The West Highland Lines. We take a West Highland train over the remote and wild Rannoch Moor to Crianlarich, where we change lines for the picturesque route to the harbour town of Oban - 'Gateway to the Isles', with free time to explore its horseshoe bay. If you feel energetic you can climb to McCaig's Folly - a 19th century tower reminiscent of the Roman Colosseum.

Day 8: Boats, Lochs and Views. We take a cruise on Loch Shiel to see 'The Jacobite' crossing Glenfinnan Viaduct. We'll be surrounded by magnificent Highland scenery and hopefully spot some of the local wildlife. Weather-permitting, we'll also travel on Britain's only ski-slope mountain gondola at Aonach Mor - Britain's 8th highest mountain.

Day 9: The Kyle Line. Our coach takes us through spectacular Highland scenery to Kyle of Lochalsh - gateway to the Isle of Skye. We'll then take the train along the gorgeous Kyle line to Inverness. On our return coach journey we'll travel alongside Loch Ness and see more of the Caledonian Canal.

Day 10: Isle of Mull / Tobermory. We take the scenic route along the Ardnamurchan Peninsula to the wild and beautiful Isle of Mull, where there are 300 miles of dramatic coastline and Duart Castle - ancient home of the Clan McLean (and used in several films). Then we sail to Tobermory - capital of Mull and one of Scotland's most picturesque ports, with its colourful houses and a sheltered bay where legend has it one of the Spanish Armada ships sank in 1588 carrying gold bullion. There will be free time to explore.

Day 11: At Leisure. Explore the many nearby places to visit.

Day 12: Loch Ness. We travel along the Great Glen to Drumnadrochit - one of the Highland's most beloved villages. Here we board our cruise on the infamous Loch Ness. Sit back, enjoy the commentary and breathtaking scenery, and try to spot the loch's most infamous resident! We disembark at the foot of Scotland's most iconic ruin, Urquhart Castle, with its beautiful natural setting and 1000 years of history.

Day 13: Stirling / Falkirk / Glasgow. We begin with a visit of Stirling Castle - one of Scotland's most historically important sites, it was once the residence of the Stewart kings and queens who held grand celebrations there. In the afternoon we visit The Falkirk Wheel - an engineering masterpiece and the world's only rotating boatlift. It used to connect the Forth & Clyde and Union canals. We proceed to Glasgow for a 3-night stay.

Day 14 Loch Lomond: Today we start with a cruise on the Bonnie banks of Loch Lomond, relax as we enjoy a leisurely cruise taking in the legendary beauty of the shores and views of Ben Lomond. Afterwards we make our way back to our hotel via the Trossachs, this area is renowned for having some of the best views in Scotland!

Day 15: Glasgow. On our city tour we'll see Glasgow's famous architecture and the renowned River Clyde. There will be free time in the city. Tonight at our Farewell dinner we raise a glass 'Slainte' to our memorable Scottish holiday.

Day 16: Home. We fly home from Glasgow.

On this tour of Southern and Northern Ireland we begin in Dublin with its fine Georgian squares and lively pubs.

Dublin has been home to many of Ireland's greatest authors who immortalized their country in poetry and prose: Wilde, Shaw, Swift, O'Casey, Behan, Joyce, Yeats, Samuel Beckett and more. For such a small island the literary traditions and legacies are astounding.

Venturing south from Eire's capital we explore regal cities, Gothic cathedrals, medieval castles and picturesque villages. We then move to the northern coastline and highlands of Donegal's National Park, with visits to Derry and the wondrous Giant's Causeway. We continue through the idyllic glens of Antrim ending our tour at the foot of the Mountains of Mourne and a visit to the Capital of Northern Ireland, Belfast, a delightful city with magnificent Victorian architecture.

We will also experience the magic and mystery of this historic land which celebrates its past in poems, traditional dancing and beautiful music. We stop at local inns and pubs to join the friendly Irish in a pint or two of Guinness or a tot or two of Irish whiskey. Day 4: Waterford. We proceed to Waterford and visit the factory where they once made the famous crystal. Later we visit a small historic pub for local Irish music and drinks.

Day 5: Blarney. We travel to County Cork, site of Blarney Castle. En route we tour Cork City and visit Cobh Heritage Centre, a portside display depicting the exodus of potato famine victims to America in the 19th century. We continue to Blarney for an opportunity to kiss the Blarney Stone, an act that bestows the "gift of the gab".

Day 6: Killarney. We head west for the quaint town of Killarney. This afternoon we take a jaunting car ride to the lakes, and visit Muckross House, an old Irish estate. This evening we enjoy a performance of SIAMSA, the National Folk Theatre of Ireland.

Day 7: Ring of Kerry / Killarney. A day of splendid scenery as we tour the famous Ring of Kerry. We pass Daniel O'Connell's Cahirsiveen, the fishing village of Waterville and Molls Gap in the heart of the Black Mountains. We will also stop at a sheep farm to watch a sheep dog demonstration and learn about the different types of sheep and herding techniques, before returning to Killarney.

Day 8: Galway. Following the coast, we drive through many pretty villages until we reach the Cliffs of Moher, which rise 700 feet above sea level and display a magnificent, lush landscape. We continue through the beautiful countryside to Galway, a quaint old town of narrow streets and stone houses. Dinner this evening will be at a local restaurant.

Day 9: Westport. We pass through beautiful Connemara National Park and the rugged mountain ranges of Twelve Pins. We stop at Kylemore Abbey, with its dramatic setting overlooking Kylemore Lough (now a convent for Benedictine nuns). We overnight in Westport, a charming Georgian town with a delightful tree-lined mall and quaint shopping area.

Day 10: Letterkenny. We head north to the town of Drumcliff and visit the grave of the poet W.B. Yeats, who set many of his poems in and around Sligo. We then enter Northern Ireland and visit the Belleek pottery factory, known for its exquisite cream-coloured china. Our next two nights are in Letterkenny, Donegal County.

Day 11: Derry / Letterkenny. Our guided tour of Derry shows us this fascinating city's controversial history, depicted on many houses in the form of striking murals. We visit the old city walls for panoramic views of the city and countryside. Then we proceed to Glenveagh National Park, in the Derryveah Mountains, for a guided tour of Glenveagh Castle and its beautiful Victorian Gardens.

Day 12: Giant's Causeway and Glens / Belfast. We drive to Antrim's north coast and the Giant's Causeway. These vast outcroppings were formed by volcanic action millions of years ago. We view this wonder from a cliff top and allow time for those who wish to climb them. Then it's on to the small town of Bushmills, home to Bushmills Irish whiskey since 1608, to view the distilling process. We drive through Antrim's lovely glens and coastal villages to Belfast (Northern Ireland's capital), for a 2-night stay.

Day 13: Belfast. Belfast is a beautiful city of imposing Victorian architecture set within picturesque hills. On our guided tour we see the City Hall with its copper-domed roof, the Grand Opera House and the Parliament Buildings set amid beautiful parklands. This afternoon we visit the newly-opened Titanic Museum, which features special effects, original drawings, full-scale constructions and interactive elements to explore the Titanic story. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 14: Trim. We see the picturesque mountain scenery of the Mourne Mountains as we drive to the charming medieval coastal town of Carlingford. We will explore the town before continuing on to Trim - a designated heritage town. This afternoon we will explore Trim Castle - a stunning Norman castle on the bank of the River Boyne. It is the largest Anglo-Norman castle in Ireland. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 15: Home. We return to Dublin for our flight to Canada.

On this tour of two Celtic Countries we will experience constantly changing landscapes, magnificent seascapes, historic castles and monuments and the carefree Celtic spirit of the people here that remains strong to this day.

Scotland is one of the wildest and most beautiful places in the world. Just the name conjures the sound of haunting bagpipes, treasured family tartans and the strong traditions of Clans. Along our travels we uncover stories of the fallen monarchs and bloody battles as we marvel at the breathtaking scenery, magnificent castles and unique architecture.

Day 2: Edinburgh. We arrive in Scotland and transfer to our hotel in Edinburgh. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Edinburgh. On our city tour of Scotland's capital (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) we see The Royal Mile, Holyrood Palace, Edinburgh Castle and we visit the Royal Yacht Britannia - noted as the UK's no.1 attraction by Trip Advisor. We'll see how they make their single-malt whiskey, and naturally we'll try a wee dram! We end in Cairngorms for a 2-night stay.

Day 5: Loch Ness / Cairngorms. Our first stop is the pretty village of Fort Augustus, which lies on the shore of Loch Ness straddling the Caledonian Canal - the 19th century engineering marvel that connects the east and west coasts of Scotland. At the Clansman Centre we'll enjoy a special Highlander Performance in the heart of this Highland community. We then board our Jacobite Cruise along Loch Ness to the foot of Urquhart Castle, where we'll have time to visit this magnificent 13th century ruin. Later we'll drive into the village of Drumnadrochit where we enjoy a lovely dinner at the local inn.

Day 6: Stirling / Glasgow. We travel through the Trossachs National Park, which boasts some of the world's most stunning scenery, as we make our way to Stirling Castle - an essential part of any visit to central Scotland. We will learn about the castle's historical importance and marvel at its magnificence as it sits on its high volcanic rock, visible for many miles in every direction. Then we proceed to Glasgow, and enjoy a panoramic tour of this exciting city, rich in culture and history.

Day 7: Glasgow. A day at leisure in Glasgow. There is so much to do and see in Scotland's largest city. You may want to visit the magnificent 12th century Cathedral, or the renowned Piping Centre where you can explore 300 years of Highland Bagpipe heritage, and have an opportunity to try the bagpipes yourself!

Day 8: Belfast. We ferry over to Belfast (Northern Ireland), and plunge into Irish culture with a Traditional Music Trail tour. With two professional musicians as your guides, we walk through cobbled alleyways, past famous landmarks and on to private

bars in some of the city's oldest buildings. At each stop we will be treated to a performance of traditional songs and stories.

Day 9: Belfast. On our city tour we'll see St. George's Market, HMS Caroline, Belfast City Hall, International Peace Walls, Crumlin Road Gaol and much more. We end at the Titanic Belfast (named the World's Leading Tourist Attraction at the 2016 World Travel Awards) which tells the story of the doomed ship through interactive galleries, from her construction in Belfast, to her maiden voyage. The afternoon is at leisure to explore Belfast's endless attractions, shopping, pubs and cafes.

Day 10: Dublin / Wicklow. We head south to Ireland's capital -Dublin. Our city tour will take in the statue-lined streets, elegant Georgian Squares and the townhouses boasting the famous coloured doors. Itinerary for The Grand Tour of Italy

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Milan, via Frankfurt.

Day 2: Milan. We arrive in Milan and transfer to our hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Milan / Lake Garda. We have a brief tour of Milan before departing for Lake Garda, where we will take in the magnificent scenery with views of the Alps and picture-book villages along the shore. We will enjoy a lovely boat trip on the lake and visit medieval Sirmione - known as the "Jewel of the Lake". A spa town since Roman times, we will stroll the narrow, cobbled lanes and see the 13th century castle and well-preserved Roman ruins.

Day 4: Verona / Venice. We proceed through the cypress clad hills to Verona, where we see the Roman Arena and Juliet's famous balcony. A short drive brings us to the university town of Padua, home of many great Italians (Dante, Galileo, etc.) and numerous art treasures. Day 5: Venice. We cross the Venetian lagoon by boat and spend a full day in the magical city of Venice. We see St. Mark's Square, the Bridge of Sighs and the Doge's Palace.

We then stay in Preganziol, near the historic centre of Venice, and explore the canal city's many treasures.

In Tuscany (a favourite region of Italy for visitors) we discover Pisa with its leaning tower, and Florence - the "Cradle of the Renaissance". We continue to the elegant spa town of Chianciano Terme - famous for its healing waters that have been curing the ailments of visitors for centuries. Day 1: Depart. We depart for Rome.

Day 2: Rome / Perugia. We arrive in Rome and proceed to Perugia, the Umbrian capital. After some time to rest we enjoy an afternoon city tour that takes us along the bustling Corso Vannucci.

Day 3: Assisi / Perugia. Our excursion to Assisi will include a visit to the Basilica of St. Francis. A short walk away is the 13th century church of Santa Chiara. There will be some free time for shopping (ceramics are a good buy!) before returning to our hotel in Perugia.

Day 4: Gubbio / Rimini. We travel to the atmospheric town of Gubbio, one of Italy's hidden gems. Gubbio clings to the side of Monte Ingino and its buildings just fit on the narrow terraces that step up the mountain side. We will visit the Ducal Palace to see the interesting architecture, then continue to the resort town of Rimini.

Day 5: San Marino / Rimini. We tour the tiny, independent republic of San Marino. This hilltop town is the oldest and smallest republic in Europe. After our visit we return to Rimini for an afternoon at leisure.

Day 6: Ravenna / Venice (Preganziol). Following the Adriatic coast we travel to Ravenna and tour this unique city. Dante (father of the Italian language) is buried here. We will visit the tomb of Galla Placidia with its fine Byzantine mosaics. Later we arrive at Preganziol.

Day 7: Venice (Preganziol). We cross the Venetian Lagoon by private boat for a full day in this magical city. We see St. Mark's Square, the Bridge of Sighs, Doge's Palace and more, followed by time at leisure.

Day 8: Padua / Venice (Preganziol). We visit the university city of Padua where Dante and Galileo attended school. The city centre has tiny walled streets, many piazzas and arcaded walkways. We see many Gothic buildings and the enormous and incredibly elaborate Basilica Del Santo. Afternoon at leisure.

Day 9: Lucca / Montecatini. We enter Tuscany and stop at Lucca, a charming town which looks like a movie set for a medieval epic. Most of Lucca is traffic free and therefore a pleasant place to stroll through the streets and see magnificent churches, squares and statues. Our guide

will point out major sites of interest. We continue to the charming spa town of Montecatini for a 4-night stay.

Day 10: Pisa / Montecatini. We take an excursion to Pisa, and yes ... the famous Tower is still leaning. We will spend our time here at the Campo dei Miracoli, which includes the Tower, the Duomo and the Baptistry. This evening we dine at a lovely local farm where we will tour the gardens and wine cellar before enjoying the local specialties.

Day 11: Florence / Montecatini. Today we visit Florence, the "Cradle of the Renaissance". Our walking tour includes the Duomo, the 13th century Palazzo Vecchio, Church of the Holy Cross and finally Michelangelo's David.

Day 12: Siena / Montecatini. This morning we enjoy a tour of medieval Siena, where we will see the fan-shaped Palazza Pubblico, Gothic Town Hall and the Piazza del Campo - site of the legendary annual *Palio* horse race. Those who wish may climb the Terre del Mangia - a 14thcentury tower with sweeping views from its distinctive white crown.

Day 13: Cortona / Chianciano. We proceed to the scenic spa town of Chianciano, in the region of Tuscany and en route visit medieval Cortona, made popular by the book and movie "Under the Tuscan Sun". Cortona has an unforgettable position sitting on the slopes once enclosed by vast Etruscan walls.

Day 14: Montepulciano / Chianciano. With a blend of renaissance, medieval and baroque architecture, Montepulciano is one of the loveliest hill towns and best preserved historic centres in the area. There are churches, palaces and great views of the valley below. Lunch today is at a farm and we will sample the "nobile wine" first mentioned in the 8th century.

Day 15: Rome. We travel to Rome, and our panoramic touring this afternoon will take in the Roman Forum, Circus Maximus, Trevi Fountain, Spanish Steps and more. After our tour we transfer to our hotel.

Day 16: Rome. This morning we visit the impressive St. Peter's Basilica and Vatican City. Afternoon at leisure to explore Rome on your own. Our Farewell Dinner is tonight.

Day 17: Home. We fly home with Air Canada.

Sorrento and the Amalfi Coast

The Amalfi Coast is a series of small bays, beaches, villages and towns, all with a backdrop of rugged cliffs.

The road that hugs the cliffs affords one of the most spectacular drives in Europe. Everywhere are orange, lemon and olive groves, vineyards, lush greenery and flowering shrubs - all near to the sparkling Tyrrhenian Sea. On this tour we will take in all the wonderful sights in the region and tantalize our taste buds by sampling the local specialties; extra-virgin olive oil, mozzarella cheese and Limoncello (the local liqueur). We will even have the opportunity to make our own "Neapolitan" pizza!

Our tour begins with 5-nights in the resort town of Maiori, which has its own beach and tree-lined promenade. The hills and cliffs form a wonderful backdrop, but the town itself is not hilly and it's easy to stroll through the narrow streets and lanes with their interesting shops, cafes and churches. For the more energetic there are superb walking trails to explore.

We then transfer to Sorrento for a 7-night stay. This is the most picturesque town on the Amalfi coast, perched high on the cliffs with stunning views over the Bay of Naples to the distant Mount Vesuvius. Sorrento offers many restaurants, cafes, shops and a local market. Our hotel in Sorrento will be one of the popular Acampora properties, all of which are located seaside on the cliff, with impressive views of the Bay of Naples and within walking distance of the town centre.

Its steep streets and narrow lanes are lined with wisteria-draped cafes, restaurants and boutiques.

Day 6: Vietri Sul Mare / Maiori. We visit the artisan town of Vietri Sul Mare, where the local people produce and sell beautiful Italian ceramics - a great place to buy that special souvenir.

Day 7: Sorrento. Today we travel over the mountains, taking in the scenic views as we proceed to the resort town of Sorrento.

Day 8: Sorrento / Galatea Farm. We begin our day with an orientation walking tour of the cliff-top town of Sorrento. We see the main square and the Piazza Tasso always a hive of activity, and we also visit the Wood Inlay Museum. We then proceed to Galatea Farm in the Sorrento hills where we are welcomed by the staff and given an explanation of the workings of this small farm. We enjoy a tasting of local wines and participate in a cooking lesson and pizza making demonstration during which we make our own personal "Neapolitan" pizzas.

Day 9: Pompeii / Sorrento. We enjoy a morning tour to Pompeii, the ruins of a once thriving community destroyed by the eruption of Vesuvius in 79AD.

Day 10: Sorrento. A day at leisure. Of course there is so much to do and see in the city and in this region. Your Tour Manager will be on hand to offer suggestions and optional tours.

Day 11: Capri / Sorrento. We catch the ferry from Sorrento to the lovely island of Capri and its famous Blue Grotto. Capri was once a summer resort for Roman Emperors. During our tour we visit the famous Piazzetta and the Garden of Augustus with its view of the Faraglioni Rocks. There will be some free time for shopping before returning to Sorrento.

Days 12 & 13: Sorrento. At leisure to enjoy Sorrento's fine shopping and cafes, as well as the beautiful views and surroundings. Optional excursions will be offered. On one of the evenings we will attend a performance of local tradition, dance and songs at the Tasso Theatre.

The atmosphere is enhanced by the amazing views of the hills covered in olive trees and the sea in the distance. There will be time to shop for local products before we continue along the wine route to visit the famous cellars of Michele Satta, where some of the best wines in Italy are produced. Lunch will be at a farm in Castagneto Carducci, featuring a

selection of typical dishes including homemade pasta with wild boar sauce. We return to Viareggio via the beautiful rocky coastline of Livorno.

Day 9: Cinque Terre / Ligure. We travel by train to the five villages known as Cinque Terre, which cling dramatically to the cliffs along the rocky coastline. Upon arrival at the village of Manarola we explore the village and then take the local train to Vernazza for some free time. Then there will be a boat ride to Monterosso - one of the most attractive of the five villages. At the end of our visit we return to Viareggio by train.

Day 10: Viareggio. At leisure, perhaps to visit the street market or other nearby towns.

Day 11: Siena and Chianti. This full day tour begins in the medieval town of Siena - famous for its annual Palio horse race but also a lovely city in many other respects. We will see the wonderful cathedral and the Piazza del Campo - considered one of the most beautiful squares in the world. After a morning of history and art we unwind in Chianti with a tasting of their well-known wines.

There are many reasons why the Italian Riviera and Tuscany are two of Italy's most popular regions to visit.

We begin this leisurely tour in Milan, where we will see both the modern and historic sites. From Milan we travel to the Riviera di Levante (known as "The Italian Riviera") - a rugged coastline with many small bays and inlets. This area is incredibly picturesque, with hills sloping dramatically down to the sea. We will stay 4 nights in this region touring the major highlights. Nearby are the Cinque Terre villages that date from the 12th century - each village is different and all have dramatic coastal scenery.

The Tuscany region is home to some of the world's most famous Renaissance art and architecture, breathtaking scenery of medieval hilltop villages, olive groves, hillside vineyards and dramatic mountain ranges. We will stay 8 nights in Montecatini, located in the heart of Tuscany. This elegant and historic spa town is set amid green

Its many spas provide a range of treatments that take advantage of the healing properties of the therapeutic mineral waters, while the town offers many shops, restaurants and a weekly market to enjoy at your leisure. Local trains and buses operate a regular service to the surrounding towns and villages. Day 7: Portovenere / Montecatini. We depart for the village of Portovenere, situated on a rocky coastline. The village was dear to Lord Byron for its tranquility. We will see 13th century St. Peter's Church built on rocks before we continue to Montecatini.

Day 8: Siena and Chianti / Montecatini. This morning we enjoy a tour of Siena. Distinguished by its medieval brick buildings, the fan-shaped Piazza del Campo is dominated by the Palazzo Pubblico (where the famous annual horse race is held) and the Gothic town hall. We will also visit a castle in the Chianti District followed by a wine tasting. This evening there will be a talk on the history, art, local traditions and present-day rivalries in Tuscany.

Day 9: Local Farm / Montecatini. The morning is at leisure to explore this charming spa town with its many shops and cafes. We will stay 3 nights in Lecce in the south, 3 nights in the beach resort area of Torre Canne, 3 nights in Puglia's capital Bari, 2 nights in the mountain village of Monte Sant'Angelo and 2 nights in the northern coast town of Barletta. Day 2: Lecce. Upon arrival in Brindisi we transfer to our hotel in Lecce for a 3-night stay. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Galatina / Lecce. Today we enjoy a walking tour of historic Lecce. We will see Santa Croce, Church of the Rosary and Palazzo Celestine. Later we visit a farm in Galatina to sample some of the region's finest local wine and enjoy a light lunch.

Day 4: Otranto / Santa Maria Lueca / Lecce. This wonderfully scenic day begins at the port town of Otranto, known for its historic center and beautiful sea views. We visit the Cathedral with its Chapel of 800 Martyrs, the crypt and one of the largest mosaics in the world. We finish at Santa Maria di Leuca at the southern tip of Puglia for views of where the Ionian and Adriatic seas meet.

Day 5: Cisternino / Ostuni. We visit Cisternino to see an old olive mill, then proceed to the "White City" of Ostuni perched on a hill overlooking acres of olive groves that roll out toward the sea. We will see the old center with its Gothic Roman Cathedral before checking in to our hotel in this region for a 3-night stay.

Day 6: Alberobello / Ostuni. We first visit the Castellana Grotto (cave) with its unique stalactites and stalagmites. We then continue to the town of Alberobello to see the famous UNESCO Trulli Village - a symbol of Puglia. There will be a tour of these unique homes followed by some free time to wander in the village.

Day 7: Martina Franca / Regional Lunch / Ostuni. Today we discover Martina Franca - a lovely baroque town with palaces and beautifully decorated churches. Our visit will be followed by a special lunch featuring regional products and local hospitality.

Day 8: Monopoli / Polignano a Mare / Bari. This morning we visit the archeological area of Egnzia - one of the most important harbour towns on the coast, then proceed to medieval Monopoli, stretching along a jagged coastline and steeped in history and tradition. The city has fortifications of walls and castles, churches and a magnificent baroque Cathedral. Next is the seaside city of Polignano a Mare, known for its picturesque balconies and also the birthplace of singer Domenico Modugno, who sang the universally known song "Volare". We continue to Bari for a 3-night stay.

Day 9: Bari. Today we discover the city of Bari. Although modern in many aspects it maintains its historic center with the Basilica of Saint Nicholas, the Cathedral and the Norman-Swabian Castle. After a walking tour there will be a free afternoon to explore the waterfront, historic buildings, many shops and cafes.

Day 10: Matera / Altamura / Bari. Today we visit the magnificent UNESCO city of Matera, starting with the upper part of the Civita dominated by the spectacular Romanesque Cathedral, and then visit the lower section and the Barisan Sasso. Later we stop in Altamura, an amazing city of monuments, to visit a traditional bakery before returning to Bari.

Day 11: Molfetta / Trani / Gargano Peninsula. We travel along the coast to the marine town of Molfetta, then proceed to the sophisticated seaside town of Trani, known as the "Pearl of Puglia".

Day 12: Gargano Peninsula. We explore the Gargano promontory that sticks out into the Adriatic Sea (the "spur" on the Italian "boot"), passing picture-book seaside villages and breathtaking scenery of blue waters and unique cliffs. Later we'll enjoy a boat cruise for even more spectacular views (weather permitting).

Day 13: Mont Sant' Angelo / Barletta. We first visit one of the oldest churches in Christianity in Monte Sant'Angelo, and then proceed to the coastal town of Barletta where we will see the Castle, the Cathedral and Cellar of the Challenge. Barletta will be our home for the final two nights of the tour.

Day 14: Castel Del Monte / Andria / Barletta. Today we visit the UNESCO site of Castel del Monte - a 13th-century citadel and castle of unique octagonal construction. We then learn of cheese production in the Andria region, famous for the soft mozzarella, ricotta and burrata cheeses. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 15: London. We fly from Bari to London, where we will have dinner and an overnight.

Day 16: Home. We fly home from London

On this exciting tour we will discover the rich culinary traditions and famous wines of Italy.

Italian food varies significantly from region to region and derives most of its magic from the abundance, quality and freshness of its locally sourced ingredients. The seas surrounding Italy host a wide variety of fish and seafood; the coastal plains and river valleys are filled with orchards, groves and fields of vegetables; the mountains and hillsides are covered in vines and forests; and large flocks and herds are pastured throughout the country. There is a healthy rivalry between the regions to out-do each other and make claim to the best dishes (and most often "my mother's")!

Italy also produces a fantastic array of wines for every occasion, from delicate whites through robust reds to wonderful dry or sweet sparkling wines, and from simple table wines to some of the best in the world. We will learn about the incredible history and culture of winemaking and of course sample many as we travel through the country.

We begin with 3 nights in the Umbria region, visiting the clifftop town of Orvieto and the Wine Museum in Torgiano, truffle hunting in Pietralunga, strolling in Etruscan Perugia and enjoying spectacular views in idyllic Assisi.

14 DAYS • MAY 16 - 29

From here we head to the spa town of Montecatini Terme for 5 nights, our home base for visiting Cortona (set of "Under the Tuscan Sun"!), an agricultural farm with cooking lessons, the beautiful hamlet of Bolgheri with its "Avenue of Cypresses", Lucca where we enjoy a "walking brunch" sampling local cheeses and breads, an olive oil mill, an estate on the famous Tuscan Wine Route, Castagneto Carducci for homemade pasta with wild boar, and the lively San Lorenzo market in Florence. In Montecatini Terme we will have ample opportunity to visit the town's thermal spa.

We then head north to the Lake Garda region for 4 nights, stopping en route in Bologna for the delicious 'tortellini' pasta and a visit of the Ferrari Museum to get the heart pounding! We also visit romantic Verona, a renowned Valpolicella winery, Vicenza to marvel at the architecture of Palladio, and Bassano del Grappa where they have been making the popular Italian spirit since 1779.

* Those joining any of our tours to Europe must be able to walk fairly long distances and climb stairs easily. Day 1: Departure. We depart for Rome.

Day 2: Rome / Perugia. We land in Rome and transfer to Perugia for a 3-night stay. Perugia is an ideal base to discover the local culinary traditions, famous art and medieval hamlets of the region. Tonight our Welcome Dinner will feature seasonal dishes, local products and traditional Umbrian recipes.

Day 3: Orvieto / Torgiano. We visit Orvieto, a typical Umbrian hilltop town with breathtaking views of the countryside. After a tour and some free time we continue to the Wine Museum in Torgiano - a veritable trip through time, with artwork and historic items all pertaining to grapes and wine. After our visit we enjoy a tasting of Umbrian wines and delicacies.

Day 4: Truffle Hunting / Perugia. We head into the forest surrounding Pietralunga, one of the truffle hunting capitals of Umbria. We will go searching for these precious and expensive tubers (escorted by locals who will show us the way), followed by a special lunch (made with our findings) at a local farm. We then return to Perugia for a guided tour of this important medieval city and capital of Umbria.

Day 5: Assisi / Cortona / Montecatini Terme. We visit Assisi, the idyllic hilltop town of the venerated patron Saint Francis. We then head for Tuscany and the charming commune of Cortona, the set of the best selling novel "Under the Tuscan Sun". We enjoy lunch in a typical restaurant and a tour of this wonderful hamlet, then proceed to the spa town of Montecatini Terme for a 5-night stay at a centrally located hotel.

Day 6: Agricultural Farm / Cooking Class. A morning at leisure to explore the town, or visit the nearby thermal spa. Later we visit a local farm to walk the orchards and pick fresh ingredients to prepare some local dishes. We will learn to make pasta, typical Tuscan soup and the famous Tiramisù dessert. Dinner at the farm will include the dishes we have prepared, with a prize awarded for the best result!

Day 7: Lucca. We visit Lucca, a city of culinary traditions and cultural heritage. We'll visit the Palazzo Mansi - home to one of Europe's biggest tapestry collections. On our walking tour we'll stop at some of the town's delicatessens and specialty shops to sample the best local products (cheese, "schiacciata" bread and wine) followed by lunch in a local restaurant. In the afternoon we visit an olive oil mill before returning to Montecatini Terme.

Day 8: Bolgheri / Wine Route / Castagneto Carducci. We begin with a visit of the beautiful town of Bolgheri, known for its "Viale dei Cipressi" (Avenue of Cypresses). The village has kept its original historic buildings, roads and little shops, complimented by the astonishing views of the hills, sea and islands. We continue along the wine route where famous wines such as Sassicaia and Ornellaia are produced, and we visit a local estate. We will have lunch in Castagneto Carducci with a selection of typical dishes including homemade pasta and the famous wildboar sauce. There will be time to enjoy Castagneto with its historic centre dominated by a castle still inhabited today by the Della Gherardesca.

Day 9: Florence. Today we discover the Renaissance capital of Florence, also rich in gastronomic traditions. On our walking tour we see the multi-coloured marble cathedral, Signoria Square, the Baptistery and Piazzale Michelangelo for the best view over the city. We'll also visit San Lorenzo market for some great shopping, and our local guide will point out the many "trattorias" and "enoteche" (wine shops) where you can browse during your free afternoon, or perhaps visit one of the world famous museums.

Day 10: Bologna \ Ferrari Museum \ Lake Garda. We travel to Bologna for a walking tour of the narrow streets lined with arched porticos and arcaded walkways, surrounded by the remains of medieval walls. Home to Europe's oldest university, Bologna is famous for its red-tiled roofs and for its love of fine food. Lunch is at a restaurant that specializes in the famous homemade "tortellini" pasta and a selection of products from the Emilia Romagna region. Later we visit the Ferrari Museum where we learn about Enzo Ferrari's incredible life story and the history of the famous sports car. We continue to our hotel in the charming town of Desenzano on Lake Garda, for a 4-night stay.

Day 11: Verona / Valpolicella. We visit Verona - a city of Roman ruins, medieval buildings and the legend of Romeo and Juliet. Our walking tour will take us through Verona's historic heart, to Juliet's balcony and the great Roman Arena. After some free time we visit a local winery in Valpolicella for a wine tasting.

Day 12: Vicenza / Bassano del Grappa. We visit the fascinating city of Vicenza, famous for the buildings of Andrea Palladio - considered to be history's most influential architect. We will see Piazza dei Signori, the Duomo and the famous Teatro Olimpico - the world's first indoor masonry theater. We then continue to Bassano del Grappa, where the popular Italian spirit Grappa was invented. Here we visit Nardini Distillery which has been producing the spirit since 1779. We also see the historic city centre and stop on the "Ponte Vecchio" - a covered wooden bridge designed by Palladio with views of the city and mountains.

Day 13: Veneto / Farmhouse Farewell Dinner. A day at leisure. Our Farewell Dinner will be at a local farmhouse where we learn to prepare regional specialties. We will dine on our creations accompanied by a wine paring for each course, as we say "arrivederci" to Italy.

Day 14: Home. We fly home from Milan, via Munich.

Swiss Alps and Italian Lakes

This unique tour begins in Switzerland, whose very name conjures up images of snow-capped mountains, majestic peaks reflected in glassy lakes and a countryside filled with picture-book villages and crystal clear air.

The moment we arrive in Zurich, the breathtaking Alps emerge as we travel through the picturesque countryside to the beautiful lakeside town of Lucerne for a 2-night stay.

After our stay in Lucerne we proceed, via touring in Bern and Interlaken, to the welcoming mountain resort town of Villars-sur-Ollon (also known as Villars) for a 5-night stay. We will experience the utmost in Alpine splendour at this traditional resort which is beautifully situated in the heart of the Vaudoise Alps, in view of the peaks of the Dents du Midi and the chain of Mont Blanc, with a sweeping view of the Rhone Valley. While the town has a busy little downtown area, it still retains a sense of coziness and tradition in the true Swiss sense. Villars will be our base for visiting the surrounding region with visits to Montreux, Gruyeres, Vevey, L'Etivaz and Zermatt - home of the mighty Matterhorn!

Itinerary for Swiss Alps and Italian Lakes

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Zurich, non-stop from Toronto.

Day 2: Zurich / Lake Lucerne. We arrive in Zurich, then proceed to Vitznau where we board a boat and enjoy our first views of the breathtaking Swiss Alps while cruising on Lake Lucerne to our hotel. Tonight we enjoy our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Lucerne. On this morning's walking tour we'll stroll along Lake Lucerne and through the city's Old Town, seeing the Hofkirche Church, the Old Town Hall, Chapel Bridge (the symbol of Lucerne) and the world famous Lion Monument carved in relief into a sandstone cliff. Afternoon at leisure to explore this beautiful city on your own, or to shop for a Swiss watch or chocolate.

Day 4: Interlaken / Bern / Villars. This full-day tour begins in Interlaken, the main tourist centre of the Bernese Oberland. The town lies between two lakes amid the towering Alps, and so views from the town are spectacular. We will see typical Swiss architecture, several 16th century churches and palatial hotels. We then travel to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Bern. We'll stroll in the old town and see the Zeitglockentrum clock tower, Munster Cathedral, the Bear Pits and the historical fountains for which the town is known. We continue on to Villars for a 5-night stay.

Day 5: Montreux / Chateau Chillon / Vevey / Gruyere. We take a tour to Montreaux – naturally beautiful and one of Lake Geneva's most popular resorts. The nearby Chillon Castle is built on a rocky islet and has towers that reflect on the lake - very picturesque! The turrets offer fantastic views of Montreux, the lake and the Alps. The castle and its dungeons have been used as a prison over the years (Lord Byron wrote The Prisoner of Chillon here, and carved his name in one of the cells). After our castle visit we proceed to the fortified hilltop town of Gruyere in time for lunch and some time to stroll. We visit a cheese factory to learn about the traditional method for making cheese. A cellar visit with wine tasting is included.

Day 6: Zermatt. We board a train for the short ride to Zermatt - a village that lies at the foot of the Matterhorn. This is one of the most photographed mountains in the world, and has been visited by mountaineers from all around the world for centuries! We will tour the historic part of the village and enjoy some leisure time to stroll or to enjoy an optional ride on the cog wheel tram for a better view of the famous mountain. **Days 7 & 8: Villars.** At leisure. Your Tour Manager will offer suggestions. There are many walking trails in and around the town, or opt for a train ride through the Alps.

Day 9: Stresa. We traverse the Simplon pass into Italy - a wonderful scenic day. We proceed to Stresa on the shore of Lake Maggiore for a 7-night stay.

Day 10: Stresa. We take a boat trip to Isola Bella to see the magnificent 16th century palace and gardens, built as a wedding gift. The garden features statues, fountains and terraces where peacocks roam among the scented shrubs.

Day 11: Locarno. Today's full day excursion takes us on one of Europe's most scenic railways – the narrow gauge Centovalli Railway – which threads its way across "a hundred valleys", past sleepy villages and over deep ravines. Upon arrival in Locarno we take an orientation tour of the town and then enjoy some free time. Explore the picturesque Old Town, see the beautiful subtropical gardens filled with palm trees and exotic flowers, stroll the lakeside promenades and enjoy the excellent shopping under the arcades of the Piazza Grande. Later we cruise back down the lake to Stresa.

Day 12: Stresa. A day to explore this town and appreciate the beautiful panoramic setting. Relax and enjoy a cappucino at one of the lakeside cafes and observe the local lifestyle and magnificent scenery.

Day 13: Lake Como Area. A very scenic day as we travel to Lake Como and the area around it - adorned with ancient villages, exquisite villas and beautiful gardens. Our first visit will be to the "the Pearl of Lake Como" - the town of Bellagio, and then the town of Como, Our walking tour of these beguiling towns will take us along cobbled lanes lined with elegant buildings exuding Old World elegance, and through the gardens of one of the many local Villas.

Day 14: Milan. We visit this very modern city, which also boasts the third largest Gothic Cathedral in the world. We see the Galleria, which was the first indoor shopping mall in Europe - a beautiful, elegant area built in the 19th century. This is the place to have a coffee, people watch and shop.

Day 15: Stresa. At leisure in Stresa, an ideal town for strolling. The walking trails around the lake are lovely, as is the shopping! Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

We travel through the Gorges of the Loup River for more spectacular views en route to Saint-Paul, a quaint 13th century fortified village full of galleries, boutiques and sidewalk cafes. Our walking tour through the winding streets will show us carved fountains, statues and architectural treasures.

Day 6: Eze / Ville Franche-Sur-Mer. Our tour begins in the medieval town of Eze, which offers a beautiful panorama of the French Rivera. Then we travel along the Mediterranean coast to Cap Ferrat, with its luxurious estates and pine groves. Here we visit the sumptuous Ephrussi-de-Rothschild Villa and Gardens. A path leads from the Piazzetta to Castello Brown - a 16th-century fortress and museum with art exhibitions and panoramic views of the town and the Ligurian Sea. This afternoon we enjoy a boat ride to Santa Margherita, known for its breezy beach promenade adorned with old aristocratic architecture.

Day 10: Cinque Terre / Viareggio. We travel by coach and train to Cinque Terre - five villages that cling dramatically to the cliffs along the rocky coastline. We first stop in Monterosso - one of the most impressive of the villages. Then we take a short cruise to Vernazza - the truest "fishing village" on the Italian Riviera. After some free time we head for Manarola - a charming and romantic village built on a high rock 70 metres above sea level. Later we continue to the beautiful seaside Tuscan town of Viareggio for our final 4 nights.

Day 11: Florence. We take the local train to Florence for a full day in the "Cradle of the Renaissance". Our first stop will be the Piazzale Michelangelo for the best view over the city. We will continue with a half day guided walking tour of the historic centre to see the multi-coloured marble Cathedral, Signoria Square, the Baptistery and a visit to the Basilica of Santa Croce. Enjoy some free time for lunch and time to explore before returning to Viareggio.

Day 12: Siena and Chianti. A full day tour to the wine country. The medieval city of Siena is famous for its annual Palio horse race but it also happens to be a beautiful city brimming with history. We will visit the Cathedral and see the Piazza del Camp, considered one of the most beautiful squares in the world. Itinerary for London, Paris and Amsterdam

Day 1: Departure. We depart with Air Canada for London.

Day 2: London. Upon arrival in London we transfer to our centrally located hotel. The balance of the day is at leisure until this evening's Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: London City Tour. We begin with a visit to Westminster Abbey for a guided tour of this impressive Gothic church, which was the traditional place of coronation and burial site for English monarchs. After our visit we continue to take in some of London's other major highlights – Big Ben, Houses of Parliament, Piccadilly Circus, Trafalgar Square, Buckingham Palace, St. Paul's Cathedral, Canadian War Memorial and more!

Monet mixed the simplest flowers (daisies and poppies) with the rarest varieties. This is where he painted the 'Japanese Bridge', and the delicate 'Water Lilies' which have been forever immortalized in his incredible works!

Day 9: Paris at Leisure / Seine Cruise. At leisure to perhaps visit the Louvre, Versailles Palace by local train, take a full day excursion to Vimy Ridge or just stroll along the Champs-Élysées, sit at a cafe and people watch. Your Tour Manager will be on hand to advise and assist. This evening we take a cruise on the Seine to view the illuminated brilliance of "The City of Light".

Day 10: Amsterdam via Thalys Train. Our high speed train takes us across scenic Belgium to Amsterdam in 3 hours.

Day 11: Amsterdam City Tour. The best way to explore Amsterdam is through the city's canals and by foot, so we will have a walking tour including the "Hop-On-Hop-Off" boat tour to visit famous attractions like the floating Flower Market and Anne Frank's House. Itinerary for The Poppy Trail

Day 1: Departure. We depart for London.

Day 2: Windsor / London. After arrival we will unwind with a relaxing cruise from Runnymede, and enjoy classic views of Windsor Castle as well as a traditional cream tea. Then we proceed to our central London hotel. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: London. As bombs fell during WWII thousands of Londoners volunteered to fight fires and save lives. Our 'London at War' tour (aboard a vintage double decker bus) provides a unique insight into life in London during the two World Wars. Afterwards there will be some time at leisure to explore London on your own.

Day 4: Portsmouth (D-Day Museum). We travel to Portsmouth and visit the D-Day Museum, which tells the story of the D-Day Landings in WWII and features the magnificent Overlord Embroidery - a tribute to the heroism of those who took part in the operation. We will also explore Historic Portsmouth Harbour, home to the *HMS Victory* - the Royal Navy's most famous warship, and *The Mary Rose* - flagship of the English Tudor navy of King Henry VIII.

Day 5: Channel Crossing / Port en Bessin. We take the ferry to the port of Caen, Normandy, to visit the Pegasus Bridge where the 6th British Airborne landed, captured and liberated the first house in Europe, the Café Gondree. After our visit of the museum here we will proceed to our hotel for our first dinner in France.

Day 6: Courseulles-Sur-Mer / Juno Beach / Port en Bessin. We begin at the Canadian Memorial Garden in the Abbaye d'Ardenne, and la Verrieres Ridge to view the area where the "Black Watch" suffered many casualties during "Operation Spring". Then we visit the Juno Beach Center, dedicated to the 3rd Division landings as well as Canada's full involvement during World War II. Afterward, we will visit Queens Own Rifles House on the beach of Bernièressur-Mer and the Canadian Military Cemetery at Beny-sur-Mer.

Day 7: Arromanches / Pointe du Hoc / Omaha Beach / Port en Bessin. We continue our focus on the Normandy Invasion with a visit to Pointe du Hoc, where the cratered landscape caused by the German battery can be observed. Then we see Omaha Beach and the American Military Cemetery to discover the harsh difficulties in landing on the beach. This will be followed by a visit of the German battery at Longues-sur-Mer, which is still relatively intact. Later we visit the Disembarkation Museum and Mulberry Harbour in Arromanches before returning to our hotel.

Day 8: Dieppe / Arras. We travel to the coastal town of Dieppe to visit the Dieppe Canadian Cemetery, before travelling to Green Beach at Pourville to view the Red and White landing beaches on the Dieppe seafront, as well as the Canadian Memorial Museum. Later at the Blue Beach in Puys we view the gun emplacements on the cliff tops which were responsible for the terrible Canadian casualties. Then we travel to Arras for a 3-night stay.

Day 9: Albert / Beaumont Hamel / Arras. Our focus switches to WWI as we explore the Somme, starting in Albert and the Musee des

Arbris. Then we visit the Somme Battlefields, the Memorial to the Missing at Thiepval, and one of the only intact First World War monuments - the memorial park at Beaumont Hamel. The park (maintained by Canada) remains as it was during the Battle of the Somme, and is dedicated to the Royal Newfoundland and Labrador Regiment which lost many men on that first day of battle.

Day 10: Vimy Ridge / Arras. We travel the short distance to Vimy Ridge. It was on Hill 145, in April 1917, that Canada truly became a nation in the eyes of the world. Canadian troops stormed the ridge after all other allied forces failed to do so. We will tour the tunnels, trenches and memorial, as well as the new interpretation center which opened in spring 2017 for the 100th anniversary. This afternoon we tour the Wellington Tunnels, used by the Allies to support the Western Front close to the town. There will be free time to explore Arras, Place des Heroes as well as the Belfroi.

Day 11: Lens / Ypres. We travel to Lens and the new Hill 70 Memorial, dedicated to commemorate one of Canada's major victories on the Western Front after the victory at Vimy. We then proceed to Ypres, where we visit the "In Flanders Fields" Museum.

Day 12. Flanders Fields / Ypres. This morning we'll orient ourselves with the Ypres Salient Battlefields with a visit to Essex Farm, where John McCrae wrote the famous poem "In Flanders Fields". Then we visit the German cemetery of Langemark - resting place of over 44,000 young Germans (many 'student volunteers'). We continue on to Vancouver's Corner to see the haunting memorial of the Brooding Soldier at Saint Juliaan. This afternoon an optional tour to Dunkirk will be offered. This evening you can witness the Last Post Ceremony at the Menin Gate, which records over 54,384 names of missing troops during the leper salient battles.

Day 13: Passchendaele / Ypres. We begin with a visit to the Canadian Memorial at Crest Farm, the objective of the 1st Canadian Corps on Passchendaele Ridge. Next we visit the largest Commonwealth Cemetery at Tyne Cot, where the Canadians first began the Third Battle of Ypres to take Passchendaele. The Passchendaele Museum features an actual battle ground with trenches and German defenses. We continue to Hill 62 to view a well preserved area which was part of the original Canadian Front Line (also known as Sanctuary Wood). We finish with some free time in Ypres to relax or to buy excellent Belgian chocolate.

Day 14: Paris. We travel to Paris, and we'll have some free time in a quaint quarter of the city for lunch and a stroll before proceeding to our centrally located hotel. Tonight's dinner will be at a charming Brasserie followed by an illuminated cruise along the Seine River.

Day 15: Paris. On our city tour of Paris we will see the Eiffel Tower, Place de la Concorde, the Louvre, l'Arc de Triomphe, Les Champs Elysées, Notre-Dame Cathedral, St-Germain des Prés and more! The afternoon is free in Paris, and this evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Home. After a warm farewell to our new friends we fly home.

This evening we enjoy a Champagne Dinner-Show at the venue made famous in Toulouse-Lautrec's paintings - the world renowned Moulin Rouge, birthplace of the Can-Can!

Day 6: Morning at leisure / Marais and Montmartre. Our morning is at leisure to explore Paris on our own. This afternoon we ride the local metro to see a different side of

Paris - with an afternoon walking tour of the historic Marais district - the closest you will get to the feel of medieval Paris. A glance at some of the beautiful buildings and houses indicates the wealthy status of the former residents. This is where Victor Hugo lived and wrote Les Misérables. Today this area houses many art galleries, design shops and is one of Europe's most wellknown Jewish quarters. From here we continue to another historic area: Montmartre and the Sacre Coeur. At the Place du Terte we can watch the artists at work while they try to capture the magic of Paris on canvas!

Day 8: Reims / Champagne Region. We venture to the heart of Champagne country today to discover the history and secrets of "The King of Wines". We visit the historic city of Reims – not only the capital of the Champagne region but also home to the legendary monk, Dom Perignon, who accidently invented this prestigious sparkling wine. Next is Les Baux-de-Provence, magnificently situated amidst incredible rock formations. Here we will enjoy an outstanding audio-visual show which will totally immerse us in the images. Finally we proceed to Arles - a city of art and culture. On our walking tour of Arles we see the charming old town, Van Gogh's famous "café de la nuit" and visit the Roman coliseum and theatre. Day 11: St-Tropez / Cote D'Azur / Nice. Today we travel to the French Riviera with a stop in quaint St-Tropez enroute. This one time fishing village has become a fashionable resort frequented by writers, artists and celebrities. After some time on our own to stroll the charming old town and lively harbour we continue our journey along the Cote d'Azur to the elegant city of Nice.

The city is also a lively art and cultural center, and boasts a fine transport system with regular routes to surrounding towns.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Marseille via Paris.

Day 2: Avignon. We arrive in Marseille and transfer to Avignon. The rest of the day is free until our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Avignon Walking Tour. We begin our tour at Les Galles - Avignon's quaint food market, where a local chef will offer a cooking demonstration and tasting of Provencal specialities. Then our walking tour will show us the highlights of Avignon; the Pont D'Avignon, the lively "Place de L'Horloge" and the pedestrian streets. We conclude with a visit of the Palace of the Popes - an imposing Gothic structure where several popes resided in the middle ages.

Day 4: Arles / Camargue. We begin with a visit of Arles, once Julius Caesar's capital of Gaul. Here we follow in the footsteps of Van Gogh to the sites immortalized in his many paintings. We will see the remarkable Roman and typical Provencal architecture. We then travel to Camargue – a national wildlife reserve of exceptional beauty. See the immense plain of marshes and lagoons - refuge to over 300 species of birds (including pink flamingos). We will enjoy a special lunch at a typical "Manade" specializing in the breeding of bulls, with "cowboys" working with the famous Camargue Horses. We end the day with a visit of Carmargue's capital, Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer, a city of traditions superbly situated at the mouth of the Rhone River and Mediterranean Sea.

Day 5: At Leisure in Avignon. A free day to explore the town, its quaint streets, museums and vibrant markets.

Day 6: Uzes / Pont Du Gard / Nimes. This full-day excursion begins with a walking tour of Uzes - the premier duchy of France. This dazzlingly beautiful commune has shaded boulevards, medieval streets and handsome houses. Then we discover the Pont du Gard, built in the 1st century AD - a technical and artistic masterpiece. We finish the day in Nîmes, which boasts some of the world's best preserved Roman monuments. We will visit the impressive amphitheater and Maison Carrée (square house) followed by some free time in the historic centre.

Day 7: Vaison-La-Romaine / Mont Ventoux / Winery. First we visit Vaison-La-Romaine, a small Provencal town nestled in a valley. Once a prosperous Roman city, it is known today for its fabulous Provencal market - the largest in Provence! Next is the summit of Mont Ventoux for a breathtaking view of the Toulourenc Valley. We finish this amazing day with a visit of a local winery, enjoying a stroll through the grounds and a taste of the wonderful wines produced in this region.

Day 8: At Leisure in Avignon.

Day 9: Luberon Villages. Scattered across the countryside are the wonderful villages of the Luberon - known as "the most beautiful villages of France". We see Rousillon, with its ochre landscape, Gordes - a hill top village with narrow alleys and passageways that wind between medieval buildings, Bonnieux with its amazing view across the valley with its patchwork of orchards and vineyards, and Coustellet for a most interesting visit of the lavender museum.

Day 10: At Leisure in Avignon.

Day 11: Orange / Truffle Hunting / Savoury Lunch. We first visit Orange - the "Gateway to Southern France". Founded in 30 BC, Orange remains marked by the dynastic seal of William III of Orange, who became King of England in 1689. We will see the famous Triumphal Arch and visit the Roman theatre. Then we proceed through the countryside to meet a warm-hearted family and discover the mysteries of one of the world's most coveted culinary treasures - the truffle. These "Black Diamonds" are known for their subtle aroma and earthy flavour. A delicious lunch of finely prepared truffle dishes awaits following our "cavage" demonstration with the family dogs.

Day 12: Aix / Cassis / Marseille. We travel to Aix en Provence (fondly known as "X"). This is one of France's most popular cities, with its majestic public squares, shaded avenues, graceful fountains and elegant Baroque style buildings built with the distinctive Provencal yellow stone. On our walking tour we see the Cours Mirabeau and the market where locals shop for fresh produce and flowers. We then proceed to visit Cassis - a former fishing village and today a resort town picturesquely located in a niche on the Mediterranean Sea at the foot of steep cliffs. We end up in Marseille for a 2-night stay by the quaint old port.

Day 13: Marseille. Highlights of our Marseille city tour include the Esplanade J4, Promenade Laffond, Notre Dame de la Garde and a walking tour through the ancient Le Panier neighbourhood. The afternoon is free to visit one of the famous museums or go shopping in the stylish boutiques of the Republic Quarter. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 14: Home. Air France takes us home via Paris.

A 2-Centre Holiday in Amsterdam and Antwerp, plus a night in Luxembourg

Holland and Belgium are two of the most popular tourist destinations in Europe, and spring is a wonderful time for strolling through the ancient cities and for seeing the tulip fields and flowers that bloom early.

Holland evokes images of windmills, clogs, canals, diamonds and cheese markets. The capital, Amsterdam, is known as the "Venice of the North" with its miles of canals spanned by hundreds of bridges. It is picturesque, easy to get around and most of the inhabitants speak excellent English. Amsterdam is also an excellent base from which to explore the rest of this compact country. In April, the tulips burst into a blaze of colour that carpets the countryside, so we will visit the spectacular flower displays at the famous Kuekenhof Bulb Gardens. Our other included excursions will show you many other facets of this charming country.

Moving from Holland to Belgium we enjoy the vistas of pastoral landscapes that inspired the great artists of these two countries: Reubens, Van Gogh, Jan Van Eyck

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and Rembrandt. We overnight and tour in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg before proceeding to Antwerp, Belgium for a 5-night stay. Antwerp is an ancient city that has stood on the River Schelde for 1,500 years. The old quarter is a wonderful place in which to stroll with its great shopping, a magnificent cathedral and many wonderful cafes and restaurants, once the haunts of famous artists. The city generously displays its heritage in 15 art museums. In addition to our excursions to the historic cities of Brussels and Brugge we will also have time to try the country's famous beer, waffles and chocolate.

We will stay in excellent First Class hotels that are centrally located, so that the exploration of Amsterdam and Antwerp on your free time will be easy and delightful.

Day 2: Amsterdam. Upon arrival we transfer to our centrally located hotel. After some leisure time we enjoy an orientation walk, followed by our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Amsterdam and Dutch Countryside. Our sightseeing begins in Dam Square where the Amstel River was dammed in the 13th century giving the city its name. In the shadow of Westerkerk church stands a statue of Anne Frank, the young Jewish diarist. Then in the old city centre we see 17th century townhouses and the Jewish quarter. We then leave the city for the Dutch countryside, and a visit to "Archaic Holland" - the towns of Volendam, Zaanse and Marken. We will see windmills, a fishing village, a traditional cheese farm and a wooden shoe shop.

Day 4: Delft and The Hague. Our first stop will be Delft – the picturesque home of the famous blue and white Delftware pottery. After visiting the Royal Delft Factory we proceed to The Hague – home of the Royal family and seat of government. The UN's International Court of Justice sits in the neo-gothic Peace Palace. Our tour takes us to the city's historic centre with many homes preserved in their 17th century styles. A highlight here will be our guided visit of the masterpieces of the Mauritshuis collection. This world-famous collection includes paintings by Vermeer, Rembrandt, Jan Steen, Rubens, Van Dyck and many other masters.

Day 5: Aalsmeer and Keukenhof. This morning we drive to Aalsmeer to see the spectacular Bloemenveiling Aalsmeer flower auction, where more than 20 million flower and plants are sold every day! Our visit will include the auction and the historical gardens. We then proceed to the gardens of Keukenhof, the world's largest gardens. They are unique in the way nature combines with artificial cultivation to create a garden where millions of bulbs bloom exactly on time each year. During our visit we will enjoy a "whisper" boat tour through portions of the 32 hectares displaying the beautiful bulb fields that surround the park. After a day of awesome blooms we return to Amsterdam.

Day 6: Amsterdam. A day at leisure. It is delightful strolling through the interesting streets, squares and street markets of this compact city. You may wish to visit the Van Gogh Museum which houses a wonderful collection of his work. Optional excursions will be offered. This evening, as a farewell to Amsterdam, we will enjoy the views of the bridges and historic buildings on our Canal Dinner Cruise.

Day 7: Luxembourg. We travel through pastoral scenery, and stop in Maastricht for a short walking tour. Then we proceed to Luxembourg - the world's last remaining *Grand Duchies* and one of the world's most economically prosperous countries.

Day 8: Luxembourg / Antwerp (Belgium). We enjoy a walking tour of Luxembourg - a picturesque city set on several levels with straddling hills and gorges. We will walk through the historic quarters and see the Bock Pomontory, the red sandstone Castle Bridge, the Grand Ducal Palace and more. After some free time we enter Belgium and proceed to Antwerp.

Day 9: Antwerp. Our tour begins in the old quarter with its gabled Flemish architecture and impressive castle. We visit the house in which Rubens was born. The historic heart of the city is Groenplaats Square, dominated by Our Lady's Cathedral and ringed with cafes and restaurants. The afternoon is free to visit one of the many museums or Middleheim Park with its statuary.

Day 10: Brugge. Brugge is a favourite for European tourists one of the best-preserved medieval cities with a richly ornate medieval town centre that has changed little in the last 5 centuries. On our morning walking tour we see the belfry with its 47-bell carillon, the lace shops in narrow alleys, Belgium's oldest town hall and the Basilica. We will also enjoy a canal cruise so that we may appreciate the city views from a different perspective. With some free time after lunch you can visit the lace parlours, chocolate makers or antique shops.

Day 11: Brussels. We visit Belgium's capital - headquarters to both the European Common Market and NATO. There are graceful avenues, cobbled streets and at the centre is the stunning Grand Place, perhaps the most beautiful square in Europe, with its 15th century Town Hall. The rich guildhouses that line the square are topped with gold figures. The Manikin Pis is a famous statue and the Galleries St. Hubert is Europe's oldest glass-covered shopping arcade. We stroll in Hot Sacre, a picturesque area of narrow streets, and see the Petite Sablon, a square ringed with Gothic columns that support 48 bronze statues commemorating the medieval guilds (trades) of Belgium. We see the Royal Palace, maybe a waffle-making demonstration and perhaps a sample or two.

Day 12: Antwerp. A day at leisure. Getting around is easy so you may want to visit the cultural centre of Ghent, or take an optional tour to visit Waterloo - site of Napoleon's defeat, and Flanders Field where many battles were immortalized. Your Tour Manager will offer advice. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 13: Home. We return to Amsterdam for our flight home.

Scandinavia is one of the most spectacular regions of the world, with a wonderful variety of sights and experiences to discover.

There are beautiful, vibrant cities with cultural and historic interest, majestic fjords, stunning coastlines and scenic countryside. These features, which happen to be in countries with the highest standards of living in the world, make Scandinavia a truly wonderful travel destination.

Our tour begins in Sweden and the welcoming capital city of Stockholm, spread out on 14 islands with Lake Malar on one side and the Baltic Sea on the other. Of course we will tour the city, and also enjoy an excursion to Sigtuna, the old capital of Sweden and now a picturesque town on the shores of Lake Malar.

From Sweden we travel to Norway where our sightseeing will include charming Bergen, a rail journey on the historic Flam Line, a spectacular fjord cruise, and inland to experience Norway's breath-taking mountains, deep valleys, spring waterfalls and clear lakes. In Norway's

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capital, Oslo, we will see the important sights and also learn the history of the Vikings and brave Norwegian explorers during our visit of the local museums.

From Oslo we take an overnight ferry to Denmark, the smallest and most continental of the Scandinavian countries, with its cosmopolitan capital city of Copenhagen. Our journey here will take us along the scenic coastline to the North Sealand region - a place of natural beauty as well as the home of Frederiksborg Castle, built by King Christian IV in the 17th century and now housing the National History Museum with its treasure of paintings, tapestries and porcelain. Our city tour of Copenhagen will include the famous Little Mermaid and the picturesque Nyhavn Canal.

Itinerary for Scandinavia

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Stockholm with a change of planes in Vienna.

Day 2: Stockholm. We arrive in Stockholm and transfer to our hotel. The rest of the day is free until this evening's Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Stockholm. Stockholm is built on 14 islands connected by 53 bridges, and so this beautiful city is known as the "Venice of the North". On our tour we see the Old Town with its fascinating narrow cobble-stoned alleys, the Royal Palace and the Cathedral. We also visit the impressive City Hall where the annual Nobel Prize festivities take place.

Day 4: Sigtuna / Karlstad. We depart for Sigtuna, once the capital of Sweden and today a picturesque small town situated on the shores of Lake Mälaren. We will have some free time to enjoy the town before continuing to Karlstad for our overnight.

Day 5: Lillehammer / Fagernes. We cross into Norway and visit Lillehammer, home of the 1994 Olympics, to see the impressive ski jump and enjoy a stroll in this charming town. Then we continue to the small town of Fagernes for our overnight.

Day 6: Sognefjord / Flam / Bergen. Today will be a highlight of the tour as we take an incredibly scenic fjord cruise to fairy-tale Flam, situated in the innermost section of Aurlandsfjord - a tributary of the long and deep Sognefjord. After some time to explore the village we will board the historic Flam Railway - one of the steepest standard-gauge railway lines in the world, which will take us up to the high mountain station of Myrdal. Then we continue to Bergen for a 2-night stay.

Day 7: Bergen. Norway's second largest city and capital of fjord country, Bergen sits ideally between the mountains and the sea. Our city tour shows us the Hanseatic timbered houses with pointed gables facing the harbour (a UNESCO World Heritage Site), and Troldhaugen - home of the Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg. The afternoon is free to explore the bustling Fish and Flower Market or the famous Bryggen area. You may want to take the funicular to the top of Floyen Mountain for amazing views of Bergen Harbour, North Peninsula and Askoy Island.

Day 8: Hardangervidda / Geilo. We cross the Hardanger Bridge - one of the largest suspension bridges in the world.

Then we drive along the spectacular Hardangervidda home to one of Norway's largest glaciers, which offers spectacular views of stunning glacial lakes that mirror the blue skies and soaring mountains. Later we arrive at the beautiful mountain region of Geilo.

Day 9: Stave Church / Oslo. We head for Oslo, enjoying en route the alpine region with its spring waterfalls and crystal clear lakes. We will visit the amazing Heddal Stave Church, built in the 13th century and the largest in Norway, before arriving in Oslo.

Day 10: Oslo. Our city tour of the Norwegian capital shows us the Royal Palace, the National Theater, the new Opera House, the Parliament and medieval Akershus Fortress. We will enjoy a pleasant stroll through Frogner Park with its controversial sculptures by Gustav Vigeland and visit the City Hall with its unique murals. The afternoon is free to explore this charming city at your own pace.

Day 11: Oslo / Cruise to Copenhagen. Morning at leisure in Oslo. This afternoon we drive to Bygdoy Peninsula to visit the Viking Ship Museum, and the Fram Museum which tells the incredible stories of Norwegian polar exploration. Our tour ends at the port where we board our overnight ferry to Copenhagen (dinner and breakfast on board, outside cabins). Be up on deck when we depart as we sail past hundreds of small islands.

Day 12: North Sealand / Copenhagen. We arrive in Copenhagen and embark on an excursion through the Danish countryside to visit Frederiksborg Castle. This 17th century castle now houses the National History Museum with its many treasures of art. We continue with a drive around Fredensborg Castle - the Queen's summer residence with its lovely gardens, and then to the coast for a view of the magnificent Kronborg Castle, known as the castle of Shakespeare's Hamlet. Then we return to Copenhagen for our 2-night stay.

Day 13: Copenhagen. On our city tour of lively Copenhagen we see the ancient streets with their countless historic buildings, including Amalienborg Palace, Christiansborg Castle, the Danish Parliament, the Royal Opera House, the Little Mermaid, Gefion Fountainand the Nyhavn Canal with its charming outdoor restaurants. Afternoon at leisure. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Itinerary for Swiss Rail Tour

Day 1: Departure. We board our direct flight for Zurich.

Day 2: Zurich / Lucerne. We arrive in Zurich and transfer to the town of Vitznau, situated on Lake Lucerne. From here we enjoy breathtaking views of the lake and surrounding mountains as we cruise to our hotel in Lucerne - our home for the next 3 nights. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Lucerne. A guided walking tour takes us through the city's Old Town. We'll see the Hofkirche Church, wooden covered Chapel Bridge (the symbol of Lucerne) and the famous Lion Monument (carved into a sandstone cliff), followed by a visit of the interactive Swiss Museum of Transport. After some time at leisure to explore this beautiful city on our own, we'll enjoy a wonderful Swiss dinner.

Day 4: Mount Pilatus / Lucerne. We board an aerial cableway and panoramic gondola, to reach the summit of Mount Pilatus. Known as the "Dragon Ride", the cockpit-like cabin of the gondola has windows extending to the floor and provides breathtaking views in every direction.

Day 5: Golden Pass Train / Brienz / Panoramic Express /

Interlaken. Our scenic train ride on the *Golden Pass Line* and the *Panoramic Express* train takes us via the Bruenig Pass to Interlaken through the heart of the Swiss Alps. Our first stop is Brienz, set in the midst of towering mountains, for some free time. Then we cruise along the turquoise-coloured Lake Brienz to Interlaken, where we'll board a steam mountain railway that whisks us up 5000 feet for fabulous views of the deep blue lakes below and snow-capped mountains in the distance, including one of Europe's highest mountains – the Jungfrau!

Day 6: Jungfrau Railway / Interlaken. We board the Jungfrau Railway and cable car to Kleine Scheidegg - home to Europe's highest mountain, Jungfraujoch. We first take the Bernese Oberland Railway to Grindelwald, where we'll board the brand new Eiger Express, (a tri-cable aerial cableway) and ascend in just 15 minutes. This state-of-the-art cabin takes us very close to the north face of the Eiger at 1800 metres, so the views are breathtaking. To descend, we take a combination of the Wengeralp and Bernese Oberland Railway to return to Interlaken.

Day 7: *Golden Pass /* **Montreux.** The elegant *Golden Train* takes us from Interlaken to the shores of Lake Geneva. We'll travel along Lake Thun and through the scenic Simme Valley to Zweisimmen, where we board the *Golden Pass Panoramic* to Montreux. We arrive in Montreux for a 2-night stay on the chic, palm-studded Swiss Riviera.

Day 8: Chillon Castle / Montreux. Our walking tour will include a visit of Chateaux Chillon. Located on a rock on the banks of Lake Geneva, this water-castle is Switzerland's most visited historic building. For 400 years it was the residence of the Counts of Savoy, as well as where Lord Byron was imprisoned when he wrote "The Prisoner of Chillon". Be sure to look for his name carved into his cell wall! Afternoon at leisure. You may want to visit the museum dedicated to the rock group Queen (where many recordings were done) and see the Freddy Mercury statue on the promenade!

Day 9: *Chocolate Train /* La Gruyere / Broc / Visp (Zermatt). We board the stunning *Belle Époque* Coaches to experience the *Chocolate Train* en route to La Gruyere, where we will have some free time and enjoy a typical fondue lunch at a local chalet! Then we continue to Broc, home to the famous chocolate factory - Cailler, where we'll learn about chocolate production and taste some of the finest offerings. Later we'll proceed by train to the pretty town of Visp, in the Zermatt area (known as the 'Sun Terrace of Switzerland'), for a 2-night stay.

Day 10: Zermatt / Visp. A short train ride takes us to Zermatt for a casual walking tour of this quaint village, with the rest of the day at leisure. The air here is clear and clean because only electric cars are allowed to operate in the village. You may wish to climb to Gornergrat on Europe's highest open air cogwheel train. The train crosses impressive bridges and goes through tunnels with views of the majestic Matterhorn the most photographed mountain in the world.

Day 11: *Glacier Express Train / Chur.* We travel aboard *The Glacier Express* (perhaps the most famous railway in the world) to Chur. The train meanders through untouched pristine mountain landscapes, deep gorges, breathtaking valleys, through 91 tunnels and across 291 impressive bridges!

Day 12: *Bernina Express /* **St. Moritz / Chur.** We board the *Bernina Express* for a truly spectacular rail journey. This 100-year-old heritage line has earned UNESCO World Heritage status for its ingenious engineering and the striking beauty of the scenery it winds through. Travelling past craggy mountain peaks and cascading waterfalls we make our way to Poschiavo, then before returning to Chur we stop in St. Moritz.

Day 13: Zurich. Our scenic train ride to Zurich passes by snowcapped mountains and sparkling lakes. Upon arrival we enjoy a guided walking tour of this beautiful lakeside city, followed by our Farewell Dinner.

Day 14: Home. We board our direct flight back to Canada.

Iceland was the last European country to be settled when it was discovered by the British and Scandinavians more than 1,000 years ago.

Today it is a very modern society with a high standard of living and education. The Icelanders have preserved much of their Norse and Celtic heritage and most of them speak English. They are very friendly and helpful to visitors.

The very name "Iceland" evokes an image of vast ice and snow fields but in fact it has a remarkably moderate climate with fjords, glaciers, active volcanoes, black lava fields, red sulphur, hot blue geysers, white rivers, waterfalls and deep green valleys, all with a backdrop of mountains, ice-capped ranges and towering cliffs. The inland features areas of volcanic formations, geysers, hot springs and lakes while the coastline is richly indented with bays.

11 DAYS • MAY 19 - 29

On this unique tour we explore the wild beauty of the island. Our sightseeing will include a boat cruise on Jokulsarlon Glacial Lagoon, the spectacular Eastern Fjords, the charming "capital of the north" - Akureyri, Lake Myvatn National Park - surrounded by lava fields and renowned for its bird life, and the world famous Blue Lagoon where you will have an opportunity to soak in the thermal waters.

There are few countries in the world that can compare to lceland's dramatic landscapes, flora and fauna. This photographer and naturalist paradise must be experienced first hand.

Day 1: Departure. We depart on our overnight flight to Reykjavik.

Day 2: Borgarnes. We arrive in Reykjavik, which means "Smoky Bay" due to the wisps of steam rising from its geothermal springs. After arrival we transfer to the Viking World Museum for a buffet breakfast and time to visit the exhibition. We then head north to our hotel in Borgarnes, en route stopping to visit incredible Hraunfossar Waterfall - hundreds of meters wide, this is one of Iceland's most beautiful attractions. Tonight is our Welcome Dinner at the hotel.

Day 3: Akureyri. We begin our ring tour and our first stop will be the 3000-year-old Grábrók Volcano. Grábrók is the biggest crater of three along this volcanic crack. Next we visit an Icelandic Horse farm to learn about this breed of horse that has remained unchanged since its introduction by the Viking's over 1100 years ago. Tonight we stay in Akureyri, the "capital of the north'.

Day 4: Godafoss / Lake Myvatn. This morning we will have time to explore the town of Akureyri before we head to Godafoss – "Waterfalls of the Gods" – one of the most spectacular in Iceland. We then visit Grenjadastadur Turf House to see the best preserved turf houses and discover the way of life of Icelanders before the 1900s. Then we continue to Laxardals Hydro Power Station for a brief talk and view stop where we will learn the importance of renewable energy, before proceeding to our hotel in Lake Myvatn for a 2-night stay.

Day 5: Lake Myvatin / Nature Baths. Today we explore the amazing natural attractions of this unique area including Dimmugorgir (Dark Castles - towering lava formations), and the bubbling sulfur mudpots of Viti Crater and Krafla which mark the continental divide between the North American and Eurasian Teutonic Plates. After our touring this afternoon we have time to soak in the soothing mineral waters at the Myvatn Nature Baths.

Day 6: Egilsstadir. We continue east on the ring road to Dettifoss - the largest waterfall in Europe. Next is Modrudalur – the most isolated farm in Iceland, from where we will enjoy a spectacular view of Herdubreid, fondly referred to as the "Queen of all Mountains in Iceland". We then visit the Wilderness Centre in Egilsstadir for a true feel of how harsh the lifestyle was in Iceland in previous centuries, before arriving at our hotel.

Day 7: Glacial Lagoon / Skaftafell. We travel along the east coast, with its towering mountains and sheer rock faces plunging into the sea to form Iceland's spectacular East Fjords. We will stop at Petra's Stone Collection, perhaps the world's greatest stone collection. This unusual assortment of thousands of stones is located in Petra's home and spread out over her large garden. After our visit we drive to the heights of Almannaskard Pass past Lonsoraefi, a mountainous wilderness ringed by extinct volcanoes. At Jokulsarlon Glacial Lagoon we embark on a boat cruise to see up close where huge icebergs have broken off the ever-shifting mass of Breidamerkurjokull Glacier and float in the lagoon. We overnight in Skaftafell.

Day 8: Vik. At Skaftafell National Park we take a walk to get up close to the glacier itself. After travelling through Eldhraun - the largest mass of lava ever to flow on earth - we cross the volcanic sand desert of Myrdalssand until we reach Vik for our overnight.

Day 9: Reykjavik. This morning we visit the Lava Centre lceland's newest attraction and one of the world's best exhibitions of seismic and volcanic activity. We will make a stop at Gullfoss ("Golden Waterfall") before continuing to the geothermal region of Haukadalur to see the Strokkur Geyser which erupts every 7 minutes. Our last visit is Pingvellier National Park, where the ancient parliament of the country was established in 930AD, before we arrive in Reykjavik for our last 2 nights.

Day 10: Reykjavik. During our city tour of the capital we will see the old town centre, the Parliament, the Cathedral, the harbour and the National Museum. The afternoon is at leisure. Tonight we enjoy our Farewell Dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 11: Blue Lagoon / Home. We visit the famous Blue Lagoon for an opportunity to bathe in the mineral-rich geothermal pools, before proceeding to the airport for our flight home.

On this outstanding tour we will visit historic cities, fairytale medieval villages, Gothic castles and famous monuments in three of Europe's oldest countries.

We begin in the Golden City of Prague - the ancient capital of Bohemia and the best-preserved Baroque city in Central Europe. Built on seven hills and spanning the Vltava River, the city is small enough for a good walker to see most of the major sights, including its beautifully preserved Old Town, massive castle, statue-lined bridge, famous city squares and evocative Jewish Quarter, while enjoying the city's love of music and perhaps the best beer in Europe. In the Czech Republic we'll also visit the UNESCO World Heritage City of Cesky Krumlov - a fairytale town with Renaissance and Baroque architecture.

Next is Vienna - one of Europe's most elegant and historic cities. Vienna boasts opulent buildings, impressive museums and the musical traditions of its famous Opera, Choirs and Orchestras. Vienna's cultural legacy was shaped by its residents like Mozart, Beethoven, Gustave Klimt and Sigmund Freud. Of course the elegant shops that line the great avenues add to its captivating charm.

Majestic bridges span across the Danube River joining "Buda's" medieval grandeur with "Pest's" magnificent 19th century buildings, grandly designed boulevards, beautiful Opera house as well as the oldest and 2nd largest Parliament building in Europe. The city is abundant with lively pedestrian streets, squares and cafes and boasts numerous museums, art galleries and Spas – earning its moniker of "Spa City". While in Budapest, we will stay in a lovely Spa hotel!

Itinerary for Magic of Eastern Europe

Day 1: Depart. We depart for Prague, via Frankfurt.

Day 2: Prague. We arrive in Prague and transfer to our centrally located hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Our walking tour will take us through the historic centre of narrow cobblestone streets winding along romantic nooks abundant with lively shops, cafes, and museums. Lunch is included. After our tour we will proceed to Vienna for a 4-night stay.

Day 7: Vienna. Our city tour of Vienna captures the true elegance and magnificence of the "Ringstrasse" lined with palatial and extravagant buildings like the Opera House, Hofburg and more, built when Vienna was the capital of the Austro-Hungarian empire. We visit the Schonbrunn Palace with its 440 rooms and lavish interiors. It is here in the Grand Gallery that Mozart gave his first royal concert. This evening we will dine at the Palace followed by a concert performance of the works of Mozart and Strauss in the Palace Orangery.

Day 8: Vienna. Our tour of the lovely Vienna Woods includes visits of the 12th century Cistercian Abbey and the former Imperial hunting lodge at Mayerling. Before returning to Vienna we enjoy a special dinner with musical entertainment and wine at one of Vienna's famous wine villages.

Day 9: Vienna. A day of leisure. The city planning of "The Ringstrasse" makes it easy for exploring. You may want to visit the Spanish Riding School to catch a Lipizzaner horses training session, or maybe venture to the countryside blanketed with vineyards and quaint villages including the opulent Melk Abbey. Vienna is known for its coffee culture, so stop to enjoy coffee and a taste of Sacher Torte!

Day 10: Bratislava / Gyor / Budapest. En route to Budapest we stop in two charming cities: Bratislava (capital of Slovakia), and the old Hungarian city of Gyor - the "City of Waters". We will have walking tours of both cities, through their quaint pedestrian Old Town centres abundant with statues, old city squares and 18th century pastel-coloured buildings. Later we arrive at our spa hotel in Budapest.

Day 11: Budapest. Our city tour begins on the Pest side at the magnificent Heroes' Square - an epic display of the history of the Magyars! Lunch is included in Visegrad, a town with a 13th century fortified fortress that has housed many notorious visitors (and according to one legend, even "Dracula" was imprisoned in its tower!)

Day 13: Budapest. At leisure. At our thermal spa hotel you have free access to most of its facilities including the thermal baths, steam rooms and reasonably priced treatments. You may also want to attend one of the many musical events the city is famous for. Itinerary for Croatia and Slovenia

Day 1: Departure. We depart with Air Canada for Dubrovnik, via Vienna.

Day 2: Dubrovnik (Croatia). We arrive in Dubrovnik and transfer to our hotel. The remainder of the day is at leisure until our Welcome Dinner this evening.

Day 3: Dubrovnik. Our city tour of Dubrovnik shows us the city walls and fortifications, the Rector's Palace, set-piece churches and public buildings that blend seamlessly with green-shuttered stone houses, and Europe's oldest apothecary in the Franciscan Monastery. us the harbour, the historical center, the Romanic marks and the pre-Romanic church of Saint Donat.

Day 9: Plitvice Lakes / Zagreb. We depart for Plitvice Lakes National Park, a lush valley with 16 terraced lakes strung together by countless cascading waterfalls and miles of pleasant paths and wooden bridges. Our visit here will include a boat ride on the still waters of Kozjak Lake and an electric train around the park. We then continue to Zagreb, Croatia's capital.

Day 10: Zagreb. Our city tour will include a funicular ride to the Upper Town where a complex of churches, palaces, museums, government buildings and galleries has retained much of its old-world charm.

Day 11: Ljubljana (Slovenia). We continue to Slovenia's medieval capital, Ljubljana. Our city tour will include a funicular ride to Ljubljana castle for a panoramic view of the old town and red-roofed houses. The afternoon is at leisure to stroll the old town with its small shops, outdoor cafes and charming restaurants.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Bucharest via Munich.

Day 2: Bucharest. We arrive in Bucharest, Romania's capital, and transfer to our hotel. The remainder of the day is at leisure until this evening's Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Bucharest. Our city tour of Bucharest will include the open-air Village Museum of traditional Romanian life, and then a walking tour in the charming historical centre. We will also visit the Parliament Palace - the world's largest and most expensive administrative building.

Day 4: Veliko Tarnovo (Bulgaria). We visit Veliko Tarnovo, where we will have a tour of the magnificent Tsaravets Fortress - the most important Bulgarian fortification from the Middle Ages. We overnight here in Veliko Tarnovo.

Day 5: Gabrovo / Sofia. We travel to Gabrovo to visit the Architectural and Ethnographic Complex, showcasing the architecture, way of life and economy of this region during the Bulgarian National Revival. We will see traditional Bulgarian culture and craftsmanship here before continuing to Sofia, Bulgaria's capital, for a 2-night stay.

Day 6: Sofia. On our tour of Sofia we will visit Boyana Church - a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the National Historical Museum with its collection of historic artifacts. We will then enjoy a walking tour of the city centre to explore the main sights such as the National Theatre, Royal Palace, the Presidency, St. George Rotunda, the Synagogue and Banya Mosque. The afternoon is at leisure to further explore Sofia on your own.

Day 7: Nis / Kladovo (Serbia). We depart for Nis, and on our tour here we'll learn about the tumultuous history of the city and see iconic landmarks such as King Milan Square, the Skull Tower and the Nis Fortress. After our tour we continue to Kladovo for a 2-night stay.

Day 8: Danube Cruise / Kladovo. We sail one of the most beautiful sections of the Danube River - the Danube Cauldrons, where the river cuts through the rocky Carpathian Mountains forming one of the most scenic wonders in this region. Enjoy viewing the natural beauty as well as unique landmarks such as the Trains Plaque, Monastery of Mraconia and the Sculpture of Decebalus.

Day 9: Timisoara. We head for Timisoara - a charming town on the bank of the Bega River. The town has unique

architecture and a vibrant culture. Often referred to as "Little Vienna," Timisoara is home to year-round musical and theatrical performances, art galleries and museums.

Day 10: Hunedoara / Alba-Iulia. We proceed to Hunedoara to visit Hunyad Castle - a Gothic-Renaissance castle and one of the largest in Europe. It is one of Romania's premium wonders. Then we continue to Alba-Iulia to see Alba Carolina Fortress - the best-preserved in Romania, featuring European military architecture.

Day 11: Biertan / Sighisoara. We travel to Biertan with a stop at the Fortified Church. This historic architectural masterpiece is idyllically situated high on a hillock in the centre of the village, surrounded by vineyards and forests. We then arrive in Sighisoara - one of Europe's most beautiful medieval citadels (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) still inhabited today. Our walking tour will reveal the Clock Tower, the Church on the Hill and Dracula's House!

Day 12: Viscri / Brasov. We continue deep into the heart of Transylvania and the charming town of Viscri for a walking tour to admire the style of the houses and idyllic way of life unaltered by time. Next we visit Brasov, a city that blends dramatic mountain scenery and medieval history, as can be seen at the Main Square, the Council Hall, the Black Church and the walls and defence towers.

Day 13: Bran / Poiana Brasov / Brasov. Today is one of the tour's highlights as we visit Dracula's castle in Bran. Surrounded by an aura of mystery and legend, perched high atop a 200-foot-high rock, Bran Castle owes its fame to its imposing towers and turrets as well as to the myth created around Bram Stocker's Dracula. After exploring the castle we will visit Poiana Brasov with a cable car ride to enjoy magnificent views of the mountains, before returning to Brasov.

Day 14: Brasov / Sinaia/ Bucharest. Today we visit Peles Castle in Sinaia - a Neo-Renaissance castle in the Carpathian Mountains on an existing medieval route linking Transylvania and Wallachia. It is an architectural masterpiece and considered one of the most stunning castles in all of Europe. After our visit we make our way back to Bucharest for our Farewell Dinner and overnight.

Day 15: Home. We fly home via Frankfurt.

We begin our journey in Moscow, with the Kremlin and Red Square at its heart. Day 1: Departure. We depart for Moscow via Amsterdam.

Day 2: Moscow. Upon arrival in Moscow we transfer to our centrally located hotel for a 3-night stay.

Day 3: Moscow. Our sightseeing today begins with a tour of the Kremlin. Located in the heart of the city, the Kremlin hosts many ancient buildings such as the Bell Tower, Patriarch's Palace, Grand Kremlin Palace and the Armoury - full of royal treasures. In the afternoon we visit Red Square and the famous department store "GUM" that stretches along an entire side of the square. We finish at Sparrow Hill for a magnificent view of the city. Day 4: Moscow. This morning we visit Tretyakov Gallery to discover some of the finest Russian art. We then continue to see the oldest and most exceptional metro stations in the world, many of which look like palaces, richly decorated with marble, mosaic, and semi-precious stones. Next we explore Arbat Street - the historic pedestrian street of Moscow bustling with mime artists, soapbox poets, souvenir shops and art stalls.

Day 5: Moscow / Kazan. A day at leisure to explore Moscow at your own pace. This evening we board the overnight Tatarstan Premium Train to Kazan (individual cabins with 2 lower beds).

Day 6: Kazan. We arrive in Kazan in the morning and begin our city tour, taking in the Palace of the Farmers, Kazan State University, the Theatre of Opera and Ballet, the National Cultural Centre, Bauman Street, Tatar Theatre and the Old Tatar Sloboda neighbourhood.

Day 7: Kazan. Today we visit the city island, Sviyazhsk, constructed for the siege of Kazan in 1551 at the orders of Ivan the Terrible. The island city is a unique place due to its history and geographical position, and we'll discover its fascinating history and architectural monasteries.

Day 8: Kazan / St. Petersburg. A morning at leisure before we transfer to the airport for our flight to St. Petersburg. Upon arrival in St. Petersburg we transfer to our centrally located hotel for our 4-night stay.

Day 9: St. Petersburg. This romantic city is often referred to as the "Venice of the North" due to its picturesque bridges over canals, spacious city squares and streets lined with buildings of baroque and classical styles. On our city tour we'll stop at iconic landmarks such as Peter and Paul's Fortress which housed famous political prisoners until 1917, popular St. Isaac's Cathedral and the Hermitage - the world's largest museum, housing over 2 million exhibits.

Day 10: St. Petersburg. Today we step back in time at Peterhof - the former summer residence of Russian czars. Most renowned for its stunning gold fountains and extensive palace grounds, it is also known as the "Russian Versailles". The Grand Palace is now a vast museum full of lavish rooms and galleries and we will spend some time here before heading outside to stroll through the Lower Park to see the impressive fountains and picturesque pavilions. We then enjoy a private canal cruise to experience St. Petersburg from a different perspective as we glide through the multiple canals that join the 42 islands that make up the city, floating by beautiful palaces on the slopes and piers of the granite embankments.

Day 11: St. Petersburg. We head to Pushkin, in the suburbs of St. Petersburg, to visit Catherine's Palace in the "Tsars Village" - the former summer residence of many Russian tsars. The village is a unique ensemble comprised of pavilions, beautiful lakes and gardens that all showcase Catherine's Palace. This enormous palace was gifted by Peter the Great to his wife who loved living in this elegant home decorated in the baroque style. We will see the Great Hall, the State Dining Room, the Blue Drawing Room and the Palace Church. There will be time to wander leisurely through the breath-taking gardens before we return to St. Petersburg. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 12: Home. We transfer to the airport for our flight home via Amsterdam.

Figueres to see Dali's museum, and an excursion to the resort town of Cadaques shows us the best the area has to offer.

From Girona we travel to the charming seaside town and old fishing village of Tossa De Mar in popular Costa Brava for 2 nights, en route visiting a number of impressive medieval villages and enjoying the magnificent scenery which includes spectacular cliff views, azure-blue water, whitewashed houses and rich green coast.

Our tour finishes with 2 nights in Tarragona, an important seaside city of the Roman Empire located on the enchanting Costa Dorada, with its well-preserved monuments: the aqueducts, an amphitheater and the Tomb of the Scipios.

Day 2: Barcelona. We arrive in Barcelona and transfer to our hotel. The rest of the day is free until our Welcome Dinner this evening.

Day 3: Barcelona. Barcelona is known as the capital of Catalan Art Nouveau, and is where the famous architect Antonio Gaudi lived and worked. Our city tour will show us Gaudi's most famous works, such as Casa Mila and Casa Batllo along the Paseo de Gracia. We will then visit the Parque Guell, which was declared an artistic monument and UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Basilica has been one of the most important pilgrimage sites in Spain for centuries. Our dinner this evening will include a special Flamenco show at Cordobés, considered one of the best Flamenco shows in Spain.

Day 5: Barcelona at Leisure. At leisure in this exciting city. You will enjoy strolling on Les Ramblas - a lively and colourful tree-lined pedestrian street of unique boutiques, cafes and street entertainers.

Day 6: Girona. We proceed to Girona and enjoy an afternoon tour of this medieval city. We will see the Cathedral - an excellent example of Spanish Gothic architecture, and the Old Fortifications (the city wall of the old town) erected in the 1st century BC. Our tour will also highlight Girona's Jewish history including the Bonastruc ca Porta Centre - several restored 13th century buildings that house the Catalan Museum of Jewish Culture. We finish our tour with a visit to the 12th century Arab Baths.

Day 7: Besalu / Cadaques / Girona. We first visit Besalu a medieval town with cobbled streets and unique facades. Most of the buildings date from the Middle Ages, so the town is designated a National Historical Site. We then continue to Cadaques, a symbolic place on the Gironese coast. Its rocky coast, fringed by beautiful beaches and quiet coves is the main attraction, as well as the incredible landscape of the Cap de Creus Natural Park. We tour the old town and other attractions.

Day 8: Figueres / Winery / Girona. Our first stop is Figueres, birthplace of artist Salvador Dali, where we visit the Theatre Museum - a large museum designed by Dali himself which attracts thousands of visitors monthly. Later we visit a winery for a tour and to see the historic Gran Claustro Cellar where wine has been produced since the Middle Ages.

Day 9: Girona. A day at leisure to explore the city.

Day 10: Costa Brava. We depart Girona for the beach resort of Tossa de Mar in the popular coastal region of Costa Brava. En route we will visit the medieval villages of Pals, Pubol and Begur with their spectacular cliff views.

Day 11: Costa Brava. A day at leisure to explore, shop, swim and enjoy the beach.

Day 12: Sitges / Tarragona. We depart for Tarragona with a stop en route in Sitges, renowned for its film festival and Carnival. We will arrive in Tarragona in time for an afternoon at leisure.

The charm of the Greek Islands has fascinated visitors for many years. On this tour we start in Athens, with its historical treasures, vibrant culture and celebrated monuments (out of Athens we also enjoy a day cruise and an excursion to classical Delphi). Then we visit three of the most popular islands in Greece.

Mykonos is a delightful port with winding cobblestoned streets, white washed houses and picturesque churches. Its famous windmills look glorious against the backdrop of the blue Aegean Sea and sandy beaches. The shops and cafes are on the waterfront. Sit a while in a taverna, sip the local Ouzo and watch the sunset ... heaven!

Santorini is known for its high cliffs, black volcanic sand beaches and spectacular landscapes formed by centuries of volcanic activity. The main town of Fira sits atop a cliff edge which plunges almost 900 ft. to the sea. The island's cafes and shops line the streets of the town, and the white houses with distinctive blue doors spread down to the long, black beaches. From the west end of town there are stunning views of the harbour, coastline and the

neighboring islands. One of the great pleasures is to wander the cobblestone streets, browse through the craft shops and arrive at the western edge of town to watch the sun bathe the harbour and sea in a magenta glow. Mules are used as transport to and from the harbour.

Crete is the largest Greek island, and its attractions are many - mosques, monasteries, gorges, grottoes, beaches and wonderful mountain scenery. The walled capital city of Heraklion is just 3 miles from the restored ruins of the 5,000 year old Minoan Palace of Knossos, believed to be the site of the mythical labyrinth of King Minos. Heraklion also has one of the finest archaelogical museums in Greece. There are coastal fishing communities and rustic farming settlements in the hills. This diversity makes for an interesting and lively stay.

Day 2: Athens. We arrive in Athens and transfer to our hotel, located in the heart of Athens within walking distance of The Plaka - the oldest section of Athens with churches, shops, cafes and ruins of ancient temples. It is a safe and delightful area to explore.

We continue on to Paros where we will enjoy a stroll by its enchanting little harbour, and then the quaint, colourful harbour of Hydra. Lunch is included. We return to Athens for our overnight.

Day 6: Crete. We fly to Crete and transfer to our hotel. The remainder of the day is at your leisure.

Day 7: Crete. Today's excursion will include a visit to the Palace of Knossos - the largest Bronze Age archaeological site on Crete that has been named Europe's oldest city at various points in history. 

Our holiday begins and ends in the vibrant capital city of Athens, known for its fantastic museums and archaeological sites. Our touring will show us the Acropolis and Parthenon, as well as beautiful Cape Sounion. There will also be ample time at leisure to enjoy the many museums, cafes and shopping in "The Plaka".

After our initial stay in Athens we will embark on a 4-day "Classical Coach Tour" taking in the major historic sites of Delphi, Kalambaka, Nafplion, Mycenae and Meteora. Next, we enjoy three nights on the island of Mykonos, considered one of the most beautiful and popular islands in Greece, with its trademark windmills, glittering white houses, cobblestoned streets and lively atmosphere.

16 DAYS • APRIL 29 - MAY 14

A highlight of our tour will be our 4-night Greek Island cruise aboard one of the ships in the Celestyal Cruises fleet. These are smaller and less formal ships, ideal for cruising around the islands yet more than well equipped for your comfort. *Celestval* ships have welcoming public rooms, bars and lounges, casino, movie theatre, library, boutiques and plenty of deck space. The entertainment program includes shows, special events and music and dancing nightly. Dining on board is a treat, as the team of expert chefs are eager to please with their wide array of international specialties. Unlimited alcoholic and nonalcoholic beverages are included and available all day. For this cruise we have all outside cabins that are bright and comfortable, with climate control, music channel, phone and bathroom (shower only). A special feature of our program is that we have included shore excursions on 3 of the most interesting and beautiful islands.

Day 2: Athens. We arrive in Athens and transfer to our hotel. The rest of the day is free until our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Athens. On our city tour we will see Hadrian's Arch, the Stadium, Temple of Zeus and the former Royal Palace. The highlight will be the Acropolis and the incredible Parthenon. The rest of the afternoon is at leisure to explore the Plaka or revisit one of the many attractions.

Day 4: Meteora / Kalambaka. Our Classical Coach Tour begins with the striking scenery of Meteora - its ageless monasteries perched atop massive rocks that appear to be suspended in mid-air. We will see exquisite Byzantine art before continuing to Kalambaka, located at the foot of an amazing rock complex.

Day 5: Delphi. We proceed through the mountains to Delphi, once known as the "centre of the world" and home to The Oracle - an area rich in archaeological treasures and mythology. We will see the Treasure of Athenians, site of The Oracle, the Theatre and the Stadium.

Day 6: Olympia. Today we will enjoy the scenic drive along the picturesque coastline of Corinth Bay, with views of the Peloponnese Mountains in the distance. After a photo stop at Rio-Antirrio Bridge we continue to Olympia where we visit the Temple of Zeus and Hera, the Stadium, the museum featuring Hermes of Praxiteles and the site of the first Olympic Games held in 776 BC.

Day 7: Mycenae / Nafplion / Epidaurus / Athens. We proceed to Mycenae, where we visit the Lion's Gate, the Cyclopean Walls and the Royal Tombs. Then we continue to the seaside town of Nafplion for a brief visit before proceeding to Epidaurus to see the ancient theatre - famous for its astonishing acoustics. Later we return to Athens for our overnight.

Day 8: Mykonos. We take the ferry to Mykonos for our 3-night stay. Afternoon at leisure.

Days 9 and 10: Mykonos. Two free days to enjoy our resort hotel, stroll along the beach or explore the village's small churches and shops along the cobblestone streets. The island's landmark windmills are everywhere and the esplanade along the small harbour is lined with quaint cafes and outdoor patios.

Day 11: Mykonos / Cruising. This afternoon we will enjoy a tour of Mykonos, before embarking on our 4-day cruise.

Day 12: Cruising / Kusadasi / Patmos. We cruise to Kusadasi (Turkey), a resort town on the Turkish Riviera. Our included excursion will be to the incredible white-marble ruins at Ephesus, once the capital of the Roman province of Asia. Here the Temple of Diana was counted among the Seven Wonders of the World, and St. Paul wrote his most profound epistles here. A white marble avenue (the Arcadian Way) stretches through the city, with ruins of once great buildings such as the Library of Celsius and the Temple of Hadrian. The ancient public latrines provide some humour! We then sail to the "Holy Island" of Patmos - once an important Christian pilgrimage site. You may join an optional excursion or explore on your own.

Day 13: Cruising / Rhodes. Our included excursion begins with a walking tour of the old walled city of Rhodes with its medieval buildings, winding alleys, towers, turrets and the impressive Grand Master's Palace. A highlight is the Street of the Knights - residences of the Knights of Rhodes.

Day 14: Cruising / Crete / Santorini. This morning we visit Crete, the largest Greek island and home of the 4,000 year-old Minoan Empire. On our included excursion we discover the proud Venetian heritage of Heraklion - the Koules Fortress (the stronghold overlooking the Heraklion harbour), the Venetian Loggia (the 17th century social center), the harmonious Morozini Fountain and the 10th century Church of St. Titus. We then visit the wonderful open-air museum of the Palace of Knossos, considered Europe's oldest city, and experience the incredible world of the legendary Minoan civilization.

We then cruise to Santorini, noted for its dramatic volcanic landscapes with sheer black cliffs surrounding a fantastic cauldron-shape bay. The island is small and therefore easy to explore on foot, or you may take an optional excursion to picturesque Oia Village, en route taking in the breathtaking views of the Aegean Sea. There will be time to explore the village with its cobblestone streets and blue shuttered white washed houses.

Day 15: Cape Sounion / Athens. We disembark our ship and embark on our excursion to scenic Cape Sounion, site of the ruins of the ancient temple of Poseidon (mythological god of the sea). The temple remains are surrounded on three sides by the azure sea. According to legend, Cape Sounion is where King Aegeus leapt to his death off the cliff, giving his name to the Aegean Sea. After our tour we proceed to our hotel in central Athens. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Athens / Home. We fly home, direct to Toronto.

Itinerary for Highlights of Turkey

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Istanbul - a direct, non-stop flight from Toronto.

Day 2: Istanbul. We arrive in Istanbul and transfer to our hotel. This evening is our Welcome Dinner.

Day 3: Istanbul. Our full day tour starts at the magnificent Byzantine church of St. Sophia, one of the first and largest architectural works of art in the world; then on to the famous Suleyman's Mosque and the beautiful Blue Mosque. We also see Topkapi Palace - a former imperial residence from where the great Ottoman sultans once ruled. We finish with a visit to the Grand Bazaar.

Day 4: Istanbul / Bosphorous Cruise / Whirling Dervish.

This morning we cruise the unforgettable Bosphorus. We pass by palaces, churches, villages, old wooden houses, mansions and modern villas. In the afternoon we visit the Asian side of Istanbul via the two bridges that link the east to the west. This evening we enjoy a "Whirling Dervish" performance, which is both a form of entertainment and a spiritual journey.

Day 5: Ankara. Our morning drive will take us through the Bolu Mountains to Ankara - capital city of Turkey. Our tour of Ankara will include the Mausoleum of Ataturk (the founder of modern Turkey) and the Museum of Anatolian Civilization, considered the best in Turkey.

Day 6: Cappadocea. We depart this morning for the unique Cappadocea region. In the afternoon we visit the Goreme Valley, also known as the Petrified Valley, where the wind and rain have eroded the volcanic soil into a spectacular, bizarre landscape of rock cones, capped pinnacles and deep ravines. This area is also famous for its rock churches.

Day 7: Cappadocea. Our tour of this fascinating area features ancient excavated towns, troglodyte villages and breathtaking scenery. This area, a UNESCO world heritage site, has changed little over time - with locals travelling between villages in horse-drawn carts.

Day 8: Konya. Konya, scenically situated high on a plateau, has long been a centre of the Muslim faith. The Whirling Dervishes were actually founded here in the 11th century. We visit the mausoleum of Mevlana, founder of the sect.

Day 9: Pamukkale. Appearing at first as as an enormous, chalky white cliff, as we approach Pamukkale it takes on

the appearance of a cotton castle. This thermal spring has attracted the weary and the curious for over 2000 years. We spend time at the mineral pools for those who wish to try the healthy warm waters. We also visit the holy city of Hierapolis - a spa and religious centre since Roman times.

Day 10: Kusadasi. We travel across a highland plateau rich in farms to Aphrodisas, one of the most important artistic sites. See the beautiful Temple of Aphrodite - goddess of love. Later we arrive at the picturesque seaside resort of Kusadasi, where we spend the next 4 nights.

Day 11: Kusadasi. A day of leisure to explore. The town centre has an interesting waterfront, modern shopping, colourful bazaars and several interesting teahouses.

Day 12: Ephesus. This morning we visit Ephesus, once the capital of the Roman's province of Asia. Here the Temple of Diana was counted among the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. St. Paul wrote his most profound epistles here. A white marble avenue known as the Arcadian Way stretches through the city with ruins of great buildings such as the Library of Celsius, the Temple of Hadrian and the public latrines! Finally we see the house of the Virgin Mary where it is believed she spent her last years.

Day 13: Kusadasi. We take an excursion to Miletus and Didyma, where we see the beautiful Great Theatre - a remarkably intact 25,000 seat amphitheatre, the Roman baths and gymnasium. We continue to the Temple of Apollo - one of antiquity's most sacred places.

Day 14: Bursa. Today we drive to this famous town known for its spa and silk markets. It was here that Ottoman architecture bloomed. The minarets above the 125 mosques make for a grand skyline. One of Turkey's more prosperous cities, it is a pleasing mix of old stone buildings and wealthy suburbs with vintage wood-frame Ottoman villas. Bursa is called the Green City, both for the green tiles that decorate some of its most famous monuments and for its parks and gardens.

Day 15: Istanbul. We return to Istanbul. The afternoon is free to explore or revisit the Grand Bazaar for last minute purchases. This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 16: Home. We return to Canada, direct to Toronto.

They will tell us the story of the group of leaders from the maritime areas of what is now Canada and Northeastern US who met in 1864 to discuss the formation of a new country. Our Welcome Dinner will be at Mavor's Restaurant in the Confederation Centre of the Arts, which features local artisans as part of their chic decor. In the evening we will attend the iconic musical performance of Anne of Green Gables.

Day 2: Victoria-by-the-Sea / Gateway Village /

Summerside (Walk 13km). A short transfer from Charlottetown takes us to Victoria-by-the-Sea, where we can visit the lighthouse and stock up on lobster rolls and PEI chocolates for a picnic lunch, before going on to see the Confederation Bridge and Gateway Village. From here we will walk along the Confederation Trail into Kinkora and transfer to our hotel in Summerside.

Day 3: Malpeque Bay / Cape Tryon / Summerside

(Walk 10km). We transfer to the north coast, where we will walk along one of the lesser known and nicest beaches on the island. We will pass through the mouth of Malpeque Bay - famous for its oysters, and make our way toward the Cape Tryon lighthouse. This beach walk is spectacular, especially at low tide when you can skirt the headlands in bare feet.

Day 4: Confederation Trail / Greenwich Dunes /

Charlottetown (Walk 14km). Our walking route follows the Confederation Trail along the shore of St. Peter's Bay, through Morrell to St. Peter's. This is considered the most scenic stretch of the Confederation Trail. Later we will walk the boardwalks at Greenwich Dunes before finishing in Charlottetown. Day 5: Basin Head / South Lake / Charlottetown (Walk 12km). We drive to Basin Head and first visit the Fisheries Museum. Then we will enjoy a long walk and beachcombing on the fine sand of the southern shore, known as "Singing Sands" because it squeaks as you walk. There is an adventurous crossing to the completely deserted beach at South Lake if you are so inclined.

Day 6: Cavendish / Green Gables / Cavendish / Robinson's Island / Charlottetown. (Walk 12-15km). Optional alternatives - sea kayaking, deep sea fishing, golf and cycling. This morning a short transfer takes us to the north shore. Here we visit Green Gables Heritage Place and walk the Homestead Trail and Cavendish Beach. In the afternoon we'll enjoy hiking the trails of Robinson's Island from Brackley Beach. Tonight is our Farewell Dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 7: Home. Time to bid a warm farewell to P.E.I. and our new fellow walkers!

Each day there will be a choice of 3 different levels of walks, each designed for the avid walker. The gentle walks will range from 5 - 6 kms with ascents of up to 150m. More challenging walks will also be offered daily for those interested.

The first 7 nights will be in the Cotswolds town of Bourtonon-the-Water (voted one of England's prettiest towns), where gentle hills, picture-postcard villages and tempting tea shops combine to make this quintessentially English countryside perfect for walking. Here we will stay at the *Harrington House*, which retains many of its stunning original Georgian features - the most breathtaking is the sunny walled garden with a landscape of green rolling hills and timeless golden stone villages in the background.

Day 4: Fish Hill to Broadway (Walk 5km with 40m

ascent). Starting at Fish Hill we follow the Cotswold Way with time to visit Broadway Tower. Then we descend to spend time exploring Broadway. Broadway Tower was the brainchild of the great 18th Century landscape designer, Capability Brown. His vision was carried out for the Earl of Coventry and was completed in 1798.

Day 5: Stratford-upon-Avon. We spend the day in Shakespeare country! We start at Shakespeare's Schoolroom and Guildhall, where Shakespeare spent his schooldays, discovered theatre and was educated and inspired to become the world's greatest playwright! There will be free time before we head out to Shakespeare Distillery, where we'll learn about the history of gin, how it is made and the many different ingredients used. There will of course be a tutored tasting to finish off our day.

Day 6: Chedworth Roman Villa (Walk 6.5km with 140m ascent). We start this walk by exploring the beautiful 12th century church of Hampnett, with its astonishingly ornate patterns of mock-medieval stencilling. We then follow the Macmillan Way to the small rural parish of Yanworth.

Day 7: Hailes Abbey to Sudeley Castle (Walk 4.5km with 60m ascent). We explore Hailes Abbey before walking to

Finally we arrive at the Roman Villa at Chedworth.

Winchcombe. We enjoy the views of the heritage steam railway before arriving at Sudeley Castle. Steeped in history, the castle was home (and now the burial place) of Queen Catherine Parr - one of Henry VIII's many wives.

Day 8: Chipping Campden and the Cotswolds (Walk 5.5km with 40m ascent). We walk along part of the North Cotswolds Diamond Way, crossing undulating farmland and woods, dipping into valleys, before reaching the picture-postcard honey-coloured houses of Chipping Campden - a fine market town whose wealth derived from affluent wool merchants in the 14th and 15th centuries.

Day 9: Brecon, Wales. We depart the Cotswolds and make our way to Brecon, arriving at our country house hotel, Nythfa House, for a 3-night stay. The hotel is surrounded by hidden coves, breathtaking scenery and some of the best walks in Wales.

Day 10: Black Mountains and Crickhowell. (Walk 6km with 60m ascent). We take a circular walk around the lovely town of Crickhowell. After crossing the picturesque Usk bridge, we follow the canal passing the village of Llangattock, then return to explore Crickhowell with its shops, cafes and art galleries featuring local artists.

Day 11: Brecon Mountain Railway and Central Beacons (Walk 6km with 140m ascent). Our walk starts with a journey on a beautifully restored steam railway line to the top station at Torpantau. Then we walk on a forested track high above Pentwyn Reservoir before descending to a treelined path along the Pontsticill Reservoir to Pontsticill station where there is a café and small museum.

Day 12: Bath / London. Enroute to London we stop in Bath for some free time to explore this UNESCO World Heritage City, famous for its beautiful architecture, Roman Baths and fascinating history which has attracted visitors for centuries. Later we arrive at our central London hotel.

Day 13: London. A free day in London to visit or revisit some of the countless attractions. At our Farewell Dinner we will raise a glass to say 'Cheers' for this memorable walking tour.

Day 14: Home. Air Canada takes us home.

Day 4: Holnicote and Selworthy Beacon. (Walk 6.5km with 180m ascent). We enjoy a circular walk taking in the pretty picture-postcard villages of Allerford and Bossington. The highlight will be our far-reaching view from Selworthy Beacon over the top of the pretty villages and along the coast of Porlock Bay. Simply breathtaking!

Day 5: Valley and Hills to Dunster Castle. (Walk 6.5km with 40m ascent). This leisurely stroll takes us out to the coast, along Dunster Beaches Nature Reserve and back in to Dunster via the station of the local steam heritage line. A highlight of the day will be our walk along the sands and shingles of Blue Anchor Bay.

Day 6: Exeter. We spend this 'non walk' day in the cathedral city of Exeter, one of the most vibrant, beautiful and historically interesting cities in England.

Day 7: Lynton and Lynmouth. (Walk 6km with 120m ascent). We begin in the wooded valley at Watersmeet, then we walk along the East Lyn River to Lynmouth. There will also be an option to take the cliff railway to expore Lynton and the Valley of Rocks. We will enjoy exploring the

Day 8: Along the Rivers to Exford. (Walk 4.5km with 20m ascent). We walk out to the coast from Bilbrook to Blue Anchor, followed by a short train ride on the heritage line to Minehead. Day 9: Porlock Hill to Holnicote House. (Walk 6.5km with 180m ascent). We enjoy this brilliant circular walk taking in the pretty villages of Luccombe amd Horner. The wooded area surrounding the village of Horner is full of majestic ancient oaks and is home to Wood Warblers and Pied Flycatchers.

Day 10: At Leisure. A short walk from our hotel is Selworthy, one of the Westcountry's prettiest villages. There has been a village here since medieval times, but the current cottages were are from the early 19th century. Beyond the 14th century church you will find the village green, surrounded by warm yellow thatched cottages.

Days 11 and 12: Wellness at *Holnicote House*. Now is the time to unwind and relax your body and soul. In the mornings, the house team will guide us through a variety of activities to rejuvenate our minds and bodies, based indoors and outdoors in this stunning location. In the afternoons there will be free time to join a guided walk, explore the area independently or perhaps relax at our country house enjoying the surroundings. The choice is yours! In the late afternoon there will be another Mind and Body session for you to join. In the evenings, you may wish to partake in an optional relaxation session or join in on one of the other in-house activities.

Day 13: Salisbury / Surrey. We bid adieu to Exmoor and the family of staff at *Holnicote House*, and stop in the cathedral city of Salisbury. There will be free time to enjoy the medieval streets, soak up the city's history and heritage, and marvel at the impressive architecture! Our last 2 nights are spent in a Country House hotel located in Dorking, in the Surrey Hills.

Day 14: Surrey. A day at leisure in Dorking. Itinerary for Provence and the French Riviera

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Marseille via Amsterdam.

Day 2: Greoux-Les-Bains. We arrive in Marseille and transfer to Gréoux-les-Bains for a 5-night stay. This evening we enjoy our first delicious dinner in France.

Day 3: Rustrel / Simiane-la-Rotonde / Banon (Walk 5km with 150m ascent). We travel to Rustrel, known for its amazing ochre cliffs and small canyons which gave the village the nickname the "Provencal Colorado". On our walk we will see an incredible succession of rust-coloured rocks, golden cliffs and red earthen chimneys which rise majestically out of the vegetation. Then we visit Simiane-la-Rotonde, listed as one of the most beautiful villages of Provence. Simiane is a place where Mediterranean and Alpine influences meet. We will enjoy a visit of the medieval castle and free time to wander the charming streets of the village. Our last stop will be in the quaint village of Banon, renowned for its goat cheeses. We will sample some specialties at a goat cheese factory.

Day 4: Moustiers Sainte Marie (Walk 10km with 350m

ascent). We walk along the ridge above the Moustiers-Ste-Marie, listed as one of the Most Beautiful Villages of France. The town has ancient gates, medieval architecture, pottery shops and a gorgeous location at the base of rocky cliffs. Enjoy the breathtaking views of the Provencal Alps and Lake Sainte Croix as we walk on the old Roman path down towards the village.

Day 5: Forcalquier / Mourres Plateau / Abbey of Salagon (Walk 7km with 200m ascent OR 11km with 400m ascent).

We begin at the picturesque hilltop town of Forcalquier home to one of the largest and liveliest Provencal markets. We will explore the market, then visit a typical olive mill and take in the gorgeous views over the Luberon landscape. Then we proceed with our walk on the Mourres plateau. where mushroom shaped formations resemble human faces - a true geological wonder! We finish the day with a visit of the Abbey of Salagon - a peaceful 13th century priory with lovely theme gardens.

Day 6: Verdon Gorges (Walk 8km with 150m ascent OR

12km with 250m ascent). We head to the village of Quinson for a scenic walk along the lower Verdon Gorges. The walkway follows an old canal previously used to carry drinking water to Aix-en-Provence. The views of the turquoise waters of the Canal are wonderful. We return to Gréoux where the rest of the day will be at leisure. **Day 7: Menton.** We proceed to sunny Menton for a 5-night stay. On our walking tour of this delightful seaside resort we see the lovely pastel-coloured architecture, the old town, the cemetery where many prominent 19th century English and Russian figures are buried and the wonderful views of the surrounding countryside.

Day 8: Menton. At leisure in Menton to explore this exquisite town, enjoy a swim in the Mediterranean Sea, visit the museum dedicated to the artist Jean Cocteau, or nearby towns like Monaco or Nice.

Day 9: La Turbie / Eze (Walk 5km with 100m ascent 0R 10km with 300m ascent). Our walk begins in La Turbie. Overlooking the Principality of Monaco, this small town resembles a balcony hanging over the Mediterranean and seems to float in the sky. The tall Trophee d'Auguste built 2,000 years ago for the glory of Emperor Augustus is impressive while the rest of the town, with its medieval vaulted passageways, bell tower and baroque fountains is enchanting. Then walk on the trail towards Eze - a fine 14th century village built on a hill. We'll enjoy a visit of the exotic garden and magnificent views over the coast.

Day 10: Italy / Dolceacqua / Aprical. We cross into Italy for a beautiful day of sightseeing. We first discover the beautifully preserved medieval town of Dolceacqua located in the Lugarian Hills. The town enchant visitors with its scenic bridges and small houses that circle the Castello dei Doria. French painter Claude Monet immortalized the town in one of his famous paintings. We will enjoy a typical Italian lunch at a local restaurant featuring fresh locally grown food. Later we visit the perched village of Aprical - surrounded by forested hills it is on the list of the 'Most Beautiful Villages in Italy'. Dinner is on our own this evening.

Day 11: Cap Ferrat / Villa Ephrussi (Walk 11km with 150m ascent). Our last walk is on the picturesque hiking path along the rocky seaside from Beaulieu and around the main peninsula of Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat. We pass magnificent villas and see how unspoiled Cap Ferrat has remained. We conclude our walk with a visit of the Villa Ephrussi - home of the Rothschild family. The villa's opulent furnishings, garden with musical dancing fountains and views of the Mediterranean are breathtaking – a wonderful way to end our walking journey! Tonight enjoy a farewell cocktail followed by dinner.

Day 12: Home. We fly back to Canada via Paris.

Spectacular views, charming seaside towns, worldfamous cuisine and a relaxing life style are just some of the features that make Italy's Cinque Terre and Amalfi Coast two of the world's most visited destinations.

The Cinque Terre is known for its spectacular hiking paths that link the 5 towns. The Amalfi Coast equally offers stunning views, and it also has one of Italy's largest concentration of gardens, villas and museums. This tour is designed for avid walkers and moderate hikers. Each day there will be a choice of two walks, ranging from 5 - 10 kms with ascents averaging 300m, led by experienced hiking guides.

Our home base for the first 5-nights is the family-run *Hotel Carla* situated near the Ligurian coast in the town of Levanto - known as the hidden gem of the Italian Riviera, and considered the gateway of the Cinque Terre.

On the Amalfi Coast we'll stay at the *Reginna Palace Hotel,* set in a truly spectacular location overlooking the bay, right by the Maiori waterfront and city centre - a perfect base from which to explore the region.

Hiking Cinque Terre and Amalfi Coast

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Florence, via Paris.

Day 2: Levanto. We arrive in Florence we transfer to Levanto our home base for the next 5 nights. This evening our experienced guides will present an orientation briefing on the walks offered during the tour.

Day 3: San Giorgio to Bonassola (Walk 5km with 310m descent OR 9km with extension), For our first walk we take the local bus to San Giorgio, then walk to the charming village of Bonassola with wonderful vistas of the Mediterranean Sea and countryside. We return by train to Levanto or extend by return walk to Levanto along the coastal track.

Day 4: Cinque Terre Coastal Path (Walk 6.5km with 215m ascent OR 9.5km with 300m ascent). We travel by train to some of the most picturesque towns of the Cinque Terre. We start with Corniglia, nestled in the middle of the five towns. Corniglia is perched on a promontory set away from the sea and is surrounded on three sides by vineyards and terraces. After exploring this charming town we follow the coastal path which offers spectacular views of Manarola and its harbour embedded under the cliffs. Then we continue on the Via dell'Amore (Lovers' Path) to Riomaggiore - so named due to its characteristic tower homes built along the river. Here we enjoy some free time to stroll the narrow streets lined with beautiful pastel coloured buildings and tempting cafés. We return by train to Levanto.

Day 5: Camogli / Portofino / Santa Margherita (Walk 7km with 217m ascent). Today's excursion takes us along the Italian Riviera and Paradise Gulf - one of the Italian coastline's most beautiful stretches. We travel by train to Camogli - a romantic seaside village which was once a seaport known as 'the city of a thousand sailing ships'. Then we take a boat trip to San Fruttuoso Bay with its secluded Abbey, and to the ancient and sophisticated town of Portofino. Enjoy some time here to visit the gardens of Castle Brown for the best views. We continue by foot to Santa Margherita and walk through the town with its basilica and palazzo gardens, before returning by train to Levanto.

Day 6: Cinque Terre - Vernazza to Monterosso (Walk 7km with 220m ascent OR 10km with 300m ascent). Vernazza is perhaps the prettiest of the five Cinque Terre villages, with colourful houses winding down to its harbour protected by a rocky headland. Choose between two walks to get to Monterosso; either along the famous lower coastal path or on quieter paths in the hills. Both walks complete the final section of the coastal path which links the five villages. In Monterosso there will be plenty of time to explore the town and shop for local specialties.

Day 7: Montepulciano / Castle Madama. We travel inland, stopping enroute in one of Tuscany's loveliest hilltop towns,

medieval Montepulciano. After our included lunch we will have some free time to discover the town's elegant Renaissance palaces, ancient churches and squares with stunning views over the countryside covered by vineyards producing the famous "Vino Nobile". We then continue to Castle Madama in the region of Lazio for an overnight.

Day 8: Mount Vesuvius / Maiori (Walk 4km with 180m ascent). On this scenic day we head to the Amalfi Coast. Enroute we will explore the slopes of famous Mount Vesuvius where, on a clear day, the views over the Bay of Naples are stunning. After our visit we will continue to our hotel in Maiori, for a 4-night stay.

Day 9: Amalfi. This morning we visit the famous town of Amalfi, set below the steep cliffs of Italy's southwest coast on the Tyrrhenian Sea. We will see the stunning Arab-Norman cathedral, the medieval shipyards (now an exhibition space) and enjoy some free time before returning to Maori for an afternoon at leisure.

Day 10: Valley delle Ferriere National Park / Ravello (Walk 7km with 300m ascent OR 8km with 510m ascent). A short transfer takes us to Amalfi where we begin our walk along the Valle delle Ferriere with its delightful views, lush vegetation and waterfalls. Then we continue by bus to the lovely town of Ravello, where we will enjoy a guided walking tour. The longer walk will start from Pogerola's countryside offering fantastic views and will finish as well with the visit of Ravello and the splendid Villa Rufolo famous for it's "hanging gardens" overlooking the Mediterranean Sea.

Day 11: Pathway of the Gods / Positano (Walk 5km with 100m ascent OR 8km with 100m ascent). We travel by bus to Agerola where we'll begin the spectacular walk to Positano along the route known as the "Pathway of the Gods". The route offers breathtaking views over the Amalfi peninsula. Picturesque Positano is a nearly vertical town with houses built on terraces in Moorish style with balconies beneath arcades. The town was made popular by many artists and writers such as John Steinbeck.

Day 12: The Sentieri dei Limoni (Walk 4km with 180m ascent OR 7.5km with 300m ascent). Today's hike takes us along the "Sentiero dei Limoni" (Path of the Lemons) - one of the most popular walks on the Amalfi Coast since Roman times. This ancient route follows the coast, through terraced lemon groves and connects the two charming seaside towns of Maiori and Minori. There is spectacular scenery throughout the walk - truly a feast for the senses! This evening is our Farewell Dinner.

Day 13: Home. We fly home from Naples, via Paris.

The museum shows the human side of the paper industry, as it pays tribute to the lumberjacks, log drivers, and workers, who dedicated their lives to their job. Tonight we enjoy big band sounds, songs, and dancing on our last night onboard our ship.

Day 7: Disembarkation / Quebec City. We sail past magnificent Montmorency Falls (weather permitting) upon our approach to romantic Quebec City. You can visit the Viking Museum in Borg - a property believed to have belonged to an important Viking chieftain 1,500 years ago. Today the museum displays a reconstruction of his house.

Day 13: Alesund. This beautiful port town was destroyed by a massive fire in 1904 and then rebuilt in Art Nouveau style. Enjoy a walk in the city center, where buildings with elegant turrets and spires line the streets.

Day 14: Bergen. Beyond Bergen's red-tiled roofs and picturesque waterfront are some of Norway's most stunning fjords. Top attractions include the Bryggen, the Mt. Floyen Funicular, the Fish Market, the Edvard Grieg Museum at Troldhaugen and Fantoft Stave Church.

Our tour includes a visit to the Romanesque Imperial Cathedral, with its striking twin tower portal, and visits to the Church of the Holy Spirit, the Old Gate and medieval Judenhof.

Day 8: Strasbourg. We arrive in the dynamic capital of Alsace for a walking tour through the lovely, historic old part of the town with its Gothic Cathedral and famous astronomical clock. Later we travel by coach to Weltenburg, with a brief stop at the "Hall of Liberation" - a classical marble monument, fashioned after the Parthenon in Athens, perched on a mountain high above the Danube. Then we'll board an excursion boat which will take us to the Benedictine Abbev of Weltenburg. Founded around 620 AD, it is the oldest monastery in Bavaria. After a tour of the abbey church we'll taste the famous dark beer of Weltenburg, which is brewed here in the oldest monastery brewery in the world.

Day 7: Passau / Salzburg. A coach ride will take us to Salzburg - the "City of Music". The old town has worldfamous Baroque architecture and is one of the best-preserved city centers north of the Alps (thus it is a designated UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site). During our guided tour through the old town we will see the birthplace of Mozart, the 'Getreidegasse' (main shopping street), the gorgeous cathedral and the place where the Salzburg festival is held. Later we'll visit the picturesque village of Mondsee, best known as the film location of the movie "The Sound of Music".

Day 8: Emmersdorf / Durnstein / Vienna. Today we will visit Melk Abby - one of the world's most famous monastic sites. This Baroque jewel is filled with beautiful frescoes and priceless manuscripts. In the afternoon we will be offered tours of various towns in the Wachau River Valley.

Day 9: Vienna. On our guided city tour we'll drive along the famous Ringstrasse, passing several magnificent buildings like the stunning opera house, the Parliament, the Court Theatre, and Vienna's imposing city hall. Then we'll enjoy a guided walk through the city center and see the famous Hofburg Imperial Palace, the Kohl market and iconic St. Stephen's Cathedral.

A dam built in the 1970's enables safe passage for passenger and cargo ships all the way to the Black Sea. Tonight is the Captain's Farewell Dinner.

Day 11: Vidin, Bulgaria. We embark on a tour of this delightful Bulgarian river port, highlighted by a visit to the 13th century fortress named "Baba Vida" ("Grandma Vida") - Bulgaria's best preserved medieval fortress. There will be free time in the afternoon.

Day 1: Departure. We depart for Budapest.

Day 2: Budapest. We arrive in Budapest and transfer to our centrally located Spa hotel. Enjoy the thermal spring's relaxation effects prior to our Welcome Dinner!

Day 3: Budapest. On our tour of this stunning city we'll see the impressive Hero's Square, the architectural splendour of the Opera House, the Houses of Parliament, the 2nd largest synagogue in the world and much more. • **Single travellers** must pay a supplement due to hotel charges. However this does not imply that they will necessarily be assigned a room as large as those assigned to two people sharing. We can often team up **those without a partner!**

• Please be advised that there may be **different standards** in utilities, services and accommodations outside Canada. Our classifications for accommodation are made in terms of local standards. Please note that outside North America coffee, tea and drinking water are generally not included with lunch or dinner. All rooms are non-smoking.

• Flight schedule changes are beyond our control. We are therefore occasionally forced to change airlines, and/or routings, and/or date of travel for your benefit. In such cases we provide as much notice as possible, and do everything possible to ensure your convenience and comfort. Should a schedule change result in an unplanned overnight enroute to or from your destination, the cost will be borne by the traveller.

• SDT will attempt to accommodate **special requests** by notifying the suppliers in writing, however we cannot guarantee that requests such as room locations or meal requirements for flights or hotels will be adhered to by our suppliers, and therefore we cannot be held responsible. Please note that advance seat selection for flights on our group tours is not permitted, as per the conditions of our contract with the airlines. Sea view or pool view rooms are not guaranteed unless specifically noted in our brochure.

• On cruises - all shore excursions are optional, and are paid for on board the ship,unless stated otherwise in our brochure. Our local tour operators may also offer optional excursions. While we do our best to monitor their quality, SDT is not responsible for the operation or costing of these excursions.

• Please note that our cancellation insurance policy does not include **"upgrade to single accommodation"** in case your partner cancels. In this case you may either pay the single supplement and travel as a single (space permitting), or cancel the tour and receive a full refund (assuming the cancellation is for a reason covered by our cancellation insurance policy). Also, while our cancellation insurance policy covers the partner of a person cancelling, it does not cover their friends who are not sharing accommodation with the cancelling party. **If you must cancel your tour you must notify us within 48 hours** of learning that you are unable to travel, otherwise the cancellation insurance policy is null and void.

• Generally you will receive your **tour documents** 10 to 14 days prior to departure, unless we are held up by a supplier providing documentation, in which case you may not receive them until closer to departure.

• **Luggage handling** is included wherever possible, however in some situations it does not exist - especially when removing your luggage from the carousels at airports. You should be capable of handling your luggage in such situations. Luggage carts are generally available at all airports worldwide.

• You may purchase ticket **upgrades to Business or First Class.** You may also purchase our tours on a "land only" basis and **arrange your own flights** independently. Our consultants will be pleased to quote all cost adjustments. If you book your own flights, home pick-up and drop-off, and arrival / departure airport transfers at the destination, are not included. If you book your own flights, please protect yourself with cancellation insurance as we cannot be held responsible for schedule changes, or if a tour is cancelled for any reason.

• You may not make any **changes to your flight arrangements** after the final payment due date.

• There may be occasions in which the **flight portion** of your SDT holiday is **unescorted.**

• If a **tour is cancelled** for any reason our liability is limited to your full refund. No tours will be cancelled due to **international events**, unless the government specifically advises not to travel to your destination.

• We are unable to refund those who do not participate in any **included meals or excursions,** as they are prepaid.
